Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

I thought I'd take a break from catching Pokemon to catch you (haha) up on a few things going on in our area.

Summerfest: We need you to make Summerfest a success. Summerfest is a great opportunity for Catholics in our area to come together and have some fun. It's also a great opportunity for you to bring friends and family to spend some time with us. Summerfest is happening August 6th from 12-9pm. Please come and purchase your meal tickets in advance, which cost \$12. Last year's event was even bigger than we expected. Please come and join us! (There will NOT be Mass offered at Summerfest this year)

Catholic Social Teaching: Later this month we will be having a night to introduce you to the richness of Catholic Social Teaching, which is basically how God calls us to live together as human beings as families, cities, and nations. On July 28th at 6pm we will give a basic explanation of some important principles our Church identifies to help guide our societies, specifically the Dignity of the Human person, the principle of solidarity, and the principle of subsidiarity.

While we are fine tuning the details, I can assure you that it will be a great night. We will show a brief video about a wonderful organization begun by a Catholic called, Mary's Meals. Mary's Meals feeds over a million children around the world and that only scratches the surface of what they are able to do as an organization because of the way their organization is structured. We might have a little snack from Malawi prepared by Fr. Titus and we will spend some time in quiet, beautiful prayer. I'm excited about this and I know it will be good.

Being that this is an election year, it's important for us to know and understand the principles of Catholic thought so we can vote with a clear conscience. That being said, this is not going to overtly deal with American politics. I hope this presentation is above current political discourse. We are going to explain the principles so that you can evaluate your own political positions freely in prayer. My hope is that everyone will feel "safe" to examine their convictions and also be challenged in some way.

Something to Read: Last week I spoke about Pope Francis' plea to apologize to anyone you have failed to accompany through the challenges of life. The Pope's apology emphasized the need to apologize to "gay" men and women who have been abandoned. Many Catholics, myself included, are struggling to figure out what this apology might look like.

The best thing I have read on the subject was a piece on *Vox* by Eve Tushnet called, "*Pope Francis wants the church to apologize to gay people. Here's what that could look like.*" Tushnet describes herself as "a lesbian convert to Catholicism who accepts the church's teaching on sexuality." Thus, she is not seeking a sexual relationship with another woman, nor is she seeking a change in our Church's moral teaching. She is simply a thoughtful person of deep faith who can help our Church apply its moral teaching in a loving way. I'd like to encourage you to Google the article and prayerfully read it.

**16. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C— Lucas 10,38-42:
"Marta lo recibió en su casa; María ha escogido la mejor parte."**

El Evangelio de hoy que acabamos de escuchar, nos relata el encuentro de Jesús con las dos hermanas de Lázaro, en Betania. ¿Cuál es el mensaje de este Evangelio para nosotros? Creo que este encuentro de Jesús con las dos hermanas nos aclara que el cristiano no ha de ser sólo un hombre de acción, como Marta, sino también y esencialmente un hombre de oración, como María. Entonces, ¿cómo hemos de interpretar la palabra central del Señor en el Evangelio de hoy? "Marta, Marta: andas inquieta y nerviosa con tantas cosas; sólo una es necesaria. María ha escogido la mejor parte..." Cuando Dios está presente, cuando Dios nos visita, una sola cosa es necesaria: dedicarnos a Él, escucharlo, dejarnos enseñar por Él. Todo lo demás es secundario. Marta le ofrece a Jesús sus servicios materiales cuando Él quiere entregarle las riquezas eternas. Ella trabaja, se preocupa, se inquieta mucho por las cosas de la casa, y por eso no tiene tiempo para escuchar al Señor, para conversar con Él. Y nosotros, ¿cómo estamos en esto? Pienso que la actitud de Marta es, muchas veces, también la actitud nuestra, la actitud del hombre moderno. No tenemos tiempo para Dios, para escucharlo, para hablarle, para rezar. Pero, en el fondo no es el tiempo que falta, sino la valorización de Dios. Tenemos tiempo para todo lo que nos interesa y nos parece importante. No tenemos tiempo para Dios si Él no es importante para nosotros, si no tiene mucho valor para nosotros. Como cada amistad auténtica, también nuestra amistad con Dios exige un poco tiempo, de atención, de cuidado y dedicación. Si amamos a alguien, hemos de encontrar tiempo para amarlo y encontrarnos con él. Y orar significa justamente detenerme, darme tiempo para cultivar mi amistad con Dios. Una verdadera amistad surge lentamente: Tengo que tener paciencia para amar, saber hacer un alto, dedicarme exclusivamente al ser amado. Tal vez conocemos el lema de la gran tradición de los monjes benedictinos: "Ora et labora". Subraya la importancia de los dos aspectos fundamentales de la vida cristiana: la acción y la oración. El cristiano ha de cultivar tanto el amor a Dios como también el amor al prójimo. Las dos dimensiones tienen que unirse y complementarse. Y es una de las grandes tareas de cada cristiano, buscar y conquistar el equilibrio en su vida: entre el amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo, entre la vida de oración y el servicio a los hermanos, entre estar arraigado en Dios y vivir en medio del mundo, entre Marta, símbolo de la vida activa, y María, símbolo de la vida contemplativa. También nosotros debemos ser, no solo hombres de acción, sino también de oración. Porque sabemos que la acción sola vacía al hombre interiormente, le quita alma y profundidad, le lleva al activismo sin meta y futuro, le inquieta y le pone nervioso como a Marta. Mientras que la oración nos da interioridad, paz, alegría y serenidad. El diálogo continuo con Dios y María, nos ayuda a crecer y madurar, nos hace construir sobre fundamentos sólidos y duraderos siguiendo el deseo y la voluntad de Dios. "Quien reza bien, vive bien": nos dice San Agustín. Y San Alfonso comenta: "Quien no reza, no debe ser condenado, porque ya está condenado". Terminemos con una palabra del Fundador de Schoenstatt, el Padre José: "Oración es para nosotros la expresión normal del amor a Dios y el medio más poderoso de hacer fecundos nuestros trabajos por el Reino de Dios".

Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)

15. Así entonces, misericordiosos como el Padre es el "lema" del Año Santo. En la misericordia tenemos la prueba de cómo Dios ama. Él da todo sí mismo, por siempre, gratuitamente y sin pedir nada a cambio. Viene en nuestra ayuda cuando lo invocamos. Es bello que la oración cotidiana de la Iglesia inicie con estas palabras: « Dios mío, ven en mi auxilio; Señor, date prisa en socorrerme » (Sal 70,2). El auxilio que invocamos es ya el primer paso de la misericordia de Dios hacia nosotros. Él viene a salvarnos de la condición de debilidad en la que vivimos. Y su auxilio consiste en permitirnos captar su presencia y cercanía. Día tras día, tocados por su compasión, también nosotros llegaremos a ser compasivos con todos.
