Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics:

Unbound: I'd like to thank Fr. Jerry and Fr. Dick from *Unbound* for being with us in our parishes last week. I also want to thank all of you who said yes to sponsoring a child. Summerfest: No, this isn't *déjà vu*. This is yet another reminder that Summerfest is approaching and we need you to make it a big success. Many parishioners from all our parishes are serving us by putting in their time and energy to make this event great, and we owe it to them to support Summerfest with our presence if possible. If you aren't able to attend please consider making a donation to Summerfest by sponsoring your parish cake. We are having a friendly competition between our parishes to see who can raise most money per capita. Please come to celebrate being Catholic with other Catholics from our region.

Catholic Social Teaching: This is also not *déjà vu*. On July 28th at 6pm at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish in Kelso we will have an evening to introduce you to some important principles of Catholic Social Teaching, including the dignity of the human person, solidarity, and subsidiarity. I'm very excited about it. I think it will be eye opening and unifying at a time when we are very divided as a country.

There is a hesitation by many to learn about Catholic Social Teaching because it can often get political and political discussions can be a bit tense. I understand this concern and I too understand the discomfort that arises from political discussions. I don't believe that this experience will be one of those times. We will simply be learning about the principles of Catholic Social Teaching and trying to understand them. If any examination of one's political positions occurs, it will be done privately in prayer at the end of the evening.

As I stated last week, my goal is to challenge people to think about the issues in our society in a new way and to feel safe and comfortable to examine their own positions privately in prayer. I'm very excited about this and have been working pretty hard on it to make sure it's good. If you have friends or family members who are concerned about issues of justice, please feel free to invite them but make sure they know the presentation will be from our Catholic Tradition and will include prayer. 17. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C
Lucas 11, 1-13 "Enseñanos a orar".

Jesús rezaba. Con frecuencia sentía deseos de dejar por un momento a aquella muchedumbre interesada, a aquellos discípulos duros de cabeza, para retirarse a un lugar apartado o a una montañita, y allí se quedaba solo delante del Padre. Para sí mismo no tenía nada que pedir, ni pan, ni perdón, ni protección, ni favores. Pero en su presencia volvía a ser lo que era, se llenaba de paz, escuchaba en lo más hondo de su alma. La conciencia de su filialidad lo llenaba de fuerza y de alegría. Sabía de nuevo que era el Hijo muy amado que el Padre había llenado de sus dones. Se sentía de nuevo revestido de aquella paciencia infinita, de aquella misericordia incansable del Padre, de aquel amor dinámico y creador. Su oración se desbordaba en palabras de confianza y de cariño: "Padre, yo sé que tú siempre me escuchas. Padre, yo te bendigo. Te doy gracias. Padre, todo lo tuyo es mío..." Y cuando regresaba, luminoso, radiante, renovado, los apóstoles se preguntaban: "¿De dónde viene? ¿Qué le ha pasado? ¿Quién ha podido transformarlo de ese modo?" Alguno les contaba que había ido a rezar. Y entonces se decían: "¡Ah, si supiéramos orar así! ¡Qué pena que nadie nos haya enseñado a rezar!" Y un día se atrevieron a pedirle: "**Señor, enséñanos a orar**". Y Jesús les enseñó esa oración tan hermosa que es el Padre Nuestro. Es una oración muy parecida a la de Jesús: Santificado sea tu nombre - venga a nosotros tu Reino - hágase tu voluntad. Pero, a la vez es una oración adaptada a las necesidades de los discípulos: Danos el pan de cada día - perdónanos como nosotros perdonamos - no nos dejes caer en tentación. Más que una oración para rezar, es una oración para meditar. Es una oración que los iría transformando a los apóstoles, modelando por dentro, que los conduciría, a lo largo de su vida, a la misma entrega total que su Señor. Mediante esta oración, Jesús nos muestra el rostro verdadero del Padre: es tan bueno que resulta incluso un poco débil a los ojos de los superficiales; es tan cariñoso que no sabe negar nada; está tan entregado a nosotros que aparentemente hace uno con él todo lo que quiere. En el Padre Nuestro, Jesús se pone a atacar nuestro escepticismo y nuestra desconfianza, a sacudir nuestra timidez y a afirmar con todas sus fuerzas que no hay ningún límite para la generosidad divina. Nuestros deseos se ven limitados únicamente por nuestro miedo; nuestras oraciones sólo tienen la frontera de nuestra inconstancia; nuestras realizaciones fracasan solamente por nuestra falta de fe. Jamás hay que buscar en Dios la razón de nuestras fallas. El único obstáculo para que se nos escuche no es la dificultad de disponer al Padre en nuestro favor, sino que es la dificultad de convencernos a nosotros mismos de que hemos de acudir a Él con fe. La única resistencia que puede oponerse a una oración perseverante, no es la del Padre que se niegue a dar, sino la de nosotros que nos empeñamos en no recibir. Pero no se trata de que nos hagamos todavía más interesados de lo que ya somos. La única cosa que se puede pedir, la única cosa que Dios puede dar, es Él mismo, su espíritu, su amor. Tengamos cuidado, por eso, con los dones de Dios: son vivos, sorprendentes, activos, peligrosos para nuestro egoísmo y nuestra pereza. El don de Dios hace dar. El perdón de Dios hace perdonar. El amor de Dios hace amar como Él, hasta la pasión y la cruz.

Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)

16. En este Año Santo, podremos realizar la experiencia de abrir el corazón a cuantos viven en las más contradictorias periferias existenciales, que con frecuencia el mundo moderno dramáticamente crea. ¡Cuántas situaciones de precariedad y sufrimiento existen en el mundo hoy! Cuántas heridas sellan la carne de muchos que no tienen voz porque su grito se ha debilitado y silenciado a causa de la indiferencia de los pueblos ricos. No caigamos en la indiferencia que humilla, en la habitualidad que anestesia el ánimo e impide descubrir la novedad, en el cinismo que destruye.
