Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear parishioners,

Growing up Catholic, I knew the rules the Catholic Church placed on sexuality. I had never been taught why these rules were in place and nobody in the Church had ever tried to inspire me to follow these rules in my life. When I got to college I had never heard the fullness of Catholic teaching regarding marriage and sexuality.

The summer before my sophomore year of college the World Trade Center was bombed and I decided that I was going to make going to Mass a priority. I began attending a chapel specifically for college students at Western Washington University. There I made some very close friends, and we started questioning our faith in a healthy way. Being typical college students, a lot of our questions pertained to our Church's teachings about sex and marriage which we had been taught were seriously misguided.

We gathered once a week for a couple of months to learn about these issues. It was the first time most of us had heard the Catholic vision for sexuality in its fullness. It was also the first time most of us had heard these rules talked about in a positive manner. It was good news to our young ears. The teachings and actions of Jesus shed a surprising amount of light on the meaning of sexuality. I remember us all asking, "Why have we never heard this? Why didn't anybody teach us this beautiful vision of sexuality before?"

Today, many young Catholics around the world are seeing the same thing. The vision of sexuality proposed by the sexual revolutionaries is not bearing the fruit it promised. It is not making for stronger relationships. It's making our relationships shallow and self-centered. Divorces have surged and many of us and our friends experienced the pain of growing up in broken homes. This vision of sexuality which is mostly rooted in pleasure has made the sexual act almost, if not completely, meaningless and often unfulfilling.

The Catholic vision of sexuality, my friends and I recognized, was far different. In the Catholic vision of sexuality the sexual act is packed with meaning for the couple. The Catholic vision of sexuality is positive and beautiful, and many young Catholics are waiting to hear it and when they do they often embrace it. When I first heard it I thought for sure it was the solution to the problems we see in marriage and family life today, including divorce and the sexual violence we see throughout the world.

One aspect of this teaching that we especially found attractive is the way in which the Church invites us to plan our families in a responsible way. Specifically the Church suggests couples plan their families using natural methods that are open to life and rely on the collaboration of spouses. Many of my friends who are married have chosen one of these methods and it's been amazing to see their relationship with each other and with God deepen and grow stronger, which I've sadly learned is not always the case in marriage.

This past week was Natural Family Planning Awareness Week. Natural Family Planning (NFP) is a healthy, collaborative, and surprisingly effective way of planning family size. I say it's surprising because many Catholics erroneously refer to NFP as the "Rhythm Method." The Rhythm Method is an ineffective method of family planning based on the calendar. Models of NFP like the Creighton method are not based on the calendar. They are based on signs and processes within a woman's own body. If couples can learn how to interpret these signs well they can plan their families quite accurately.

NFP takes discipline to practice effectively and it also requires patience and self-control during times when the couple is fertile. But the data is clear, that this discipline, patience and self-control benefit the marriage relationship. Couples who practice NFP tend to divorce less and experience greater satisfaction in their marriage. Some couples find NFP easier than others, but it is worth looking into. It could benefit your marriage *especially* if you experience side effects from a hormonal type of contraceptive. But you won't know if you don't look into it for yourself. 18. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C
Lucas 12,13-21: "Lo que has acumulado, ¿de quién será?"

Uno trató de inmiscuir a Jesús en un asunto familiar. Era un tema entre hermanos. Era un tema de herencia y Jesús le contesta algo molesto que Él no se mete en esos asuntos. Hay cristianos que con la mejor intención del mundo se meten donde no les llaman y tratan de poner en los ambientes familiares una cierta paz. Aprendamos de Jesús con su talante y claridad: nosotros no estamos para estar solucionando todos y cada uno de los problemas temporales de la gente donde actúan mejor los técnicos que los bienintencionados. Aportemos nosotros las actitudes de la fe para asumirlas. Dice el Maestro que tengamos cuidado de no caer en la avaricia "porque la vida no depende del poseer muchas cosas." Muchas veces el afán desordenado de poseer y adquirir riquezas para atesorarlas hacen de nosotros unos inmensos indigentes que creyéndonos que tenemos mucho nos sentimos interiormente vacíos. Hay gente que tiene la despena de su casa llena y la cuenta del banco saneada pero su corazón está más que vacío y lleno de ecos de tristeza y desesperanzas. ¿Qué es lo que de verdad enriquece a una persona? Esta es una de las preguntas claves de la vida. Hay muchas personas que responden con el ansia de tener: "Soy cuanto más tengo." Son personas atadas al consumismo más radical. En la medida que tienen se creen alguien y siempre tienen que tener para creerse que vale la pena vivir. Mientras está ocupado con esas cosas no se da cuenta que la vida pasa y cuando llega a su casa y coloca lo nuevo que ha comprado, a las pocas horas aparece de nuevo la soledad más remota de su corazón y espera con ansia que llegue mañana para repetir la misma escena del tener compulsivo del día anterior. Hay otras personas que no están apegadas al tener cosas materiales, pero no son mejores que ellos. Estos son más sutiles, más cuidadosos; aparentan mejor el desprendimiento. Viven como si las cosas materiales no tuviesen importancia, pero buscan el sentido de su vida en el saber, en el poder, en el prestigio, en el sexo, en la religión que les da seguridad... Son también formas ocultas de riqueza que buscan los corazones que no se han encontrado con Cristo. Hay un tercer grupo que viven aún más desprendido de las cosas materiales y de sus influencias en su vida, pero viven anhelando el tener. Por un lado ven que han dado el paso del desposeimiento, tienen lo justo para vivir, pero esto no les hace felices. Miran a los demás con desconsuelo y con las ganas de volver atrás en su vida para no seguir el camino que un día alegres emprendieron. No hay nadie más triste que una persona que un día optó porque nadie ni nada les robara el corazón y el paso de los años les ha hecho caer en la cuenta que esa decisión fue equivocada... Crecer como personas y como cristianos. Tener sentido trascendente y sentido común. Valorar nuestros proyectos y nuestra propia persona. Jesús ha venido a demostrarnos que queriéndonos y queriendo las cosas de Dios es como creamos riquezas en el cielo. Perdonen; no estoy hablando del cielo de después de la muerte al que estamos llamados. Les hablo del cielo que ya comienza aquí en el encuentro con Jesús y los hermanos.
