Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

First Saturday: For several years now we have offered Mass on the first Saturday of the month at St. Mary's in Castle Rock. Recently, the Maronite Monks have also been offering Mass on the first Saturday of the month. I believe this is an important ministry for the monks to continue as they establish themselves here in our County. With that in mind, I have decided to stop offering Mass at St. Mary's in order that we can all pray with the monks on the first Saturday. Please keep your eye on the bulletin for more information if you'd like to join us!

Catholic Social Teaching: Our introduction to Catholic Social teaching went very well. We learned about the dignity of the human person, which is a principle that every person is worthy of respect and honor and has certain rights. We also learned about the principle of subsidiarity, which states that problems are best solved at the most local levels of organization possible, and that higher forms of organization should not interfere in lower levels of organization if it does not have to. We also learned about solidarity, which is a firm and enduring belief that we are all united as one human family.

The evening went so well that we are going to offer it again soon exactly as we offered in last week. Keep your eyes and ears open for this to come up in September or October. In the meantime, we have another opportunity for you to learn about Catholic Social Teaching. Over the next several weeks we will build on the principles we learned about last week and go a little bit deeper.

If you missed last week you are still more than welcome to come. We will meet four consecutive Thursdays at 6:30 pm at Immaculate Heart in Kelso. On August 11th we will cover the importance of the family, because the family is the vital cell of society. On August 18th we will cover the dignity and importance of work. On August 25th, we will look at what the Church says about different economic models and we will learn about the rights and duties of government. Finally, on September 1st we will look at international issues like trade, and international conflict, and the environment.

The Name of God is Mercy: I recently completed Pope Francis' book, *The Name of God is Mercy* and I thought it was a very worthwhile read. It is short and simple with many good points to ponder. It is the transcript of an interview that he gave with a journalist. If you have not yet had a positive experience during this Jubilee Year of Mercy, I hope you'll read it.

Confirmation: We are about to begin signups for sacrament of confirmation preparation classes for our high school students. The sacrament of confirmation is not an adult decision to be Catholic. The sacrament of confirmation is a sacrament whereby a person is sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit so that they can become stronger disciples. Specifically, the gifts are Knowledge, Wisdom, Understanding, Fortitude, Counsel, Piety, and wonder and awe in God's presence. These gifts are not ordered towards our worldly success, but rather to our ability to live out the teachings of Jesus in the world.

If you are a high school student or if you know a high school student that is eligible for the sacrament of confirmation, please be on the lookout for signups. This year, our classes will be on Sunday afternoons at St. Rose. Students will be able to attend Mass in Kelso or at St. Rose and then head right over to begin classes. We hope this time will work for you and your family.

19. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C
Lucas 12, 32-48 "Estén preparados."

"Donde está tu riqueza, allí estará también tu corazón". Jesús nos llama al despojo de las cosas que atan nuestra vida y que lejos de hacernos felices nos entristecen más. Hay que invertir en riquezas que no pasen con el tiempo o con los contratiempos del mundo bursátil. La gracia no se echa a perder con el tiempo sino que nos acompaña hasta la eternidad. Nuestro mundo está lleno del ansia de tener. Fíjate cuántas veces al día escuchas a los que te rodean la palabra "tener" y todas sus derivaciones... A la vez es como una invitación y una obligación. La gente tiene porque necesita tener para poder dar sentido a su vida. Nos hemos amoldado a una sociedad aparentemente justa pero que en su raíz no está la solidaridad y la justicia que proclama, sino más bien el ansia desbordada por tener. El mensaje de Jesús es justo lo contrario. Las palabras que el Señor utiliza en este texto son: Vende, da, procura riquezas sin fin en el cielo. No es una llamada a alejarnos del mundo en el que vivimos. Cuando Jesús dice: "Yo estaré con ustedes todos los días hasta el fin del mundo..." es bastante claro. Dios no nos abandona incluso en este mundo nuestro tan criticado por nosotros mismos. ¿Qué nos quiere decir entonces? El afán por tener puede en el creyente hacerle bajar la guardia en el camino de la fe. Puede hacer que cambien sus prioridades. Puede poner el Evangelio en un lugar muy secundario en su vida, de ahí la alerta que Jesús nos lanza hoy. Lo que el Señor espera de sus fieles es que al llegar Él y llamar le abramos en seguida. Tenemos que estar vigilantes porque las cosas de la vida nos pueden distraer tanto que la solidaridad, la justicia, el amor pueden quedar en nuestra vida como algo irrelevante. Hay que estar preparados para el encuentro permanente con Dios. No es la preparación para la muerte sino la preparación diaria para saber reaccionar en el mundo tal y como Jesús quiere, cada día, en cada momento. Muchos cristianos vivirían una vida de fe más intensa si en primer lugar de su vida estuviese la espera amorosa del Maestro. Estar preparados significa ver a Cristo en nuestras calles y plazas, en nuestros sucesos y alegrías y tener sus mismos criterios de actuación por amor al Reino que nos trae. Hay cristianos que reaccionan ante los problemas y dificultades de la vida con la misma virulencia que lo hacen los no creyentes. Si aquellos usan violencia, ellos también. Estas preparados significa descubrir la actitud y la acción que nos pide el Evangelio en cada momento. Un cristiano no puede ir por la vida despistado, sin entrenamiento espiritual. Cuando tantas personas de nuestro tiempo acuden al gimnasio para preparar su cuerpo nosotros debemos acudir al entrenador del alma para tener a punto nuestra vida. ¿Cuánto tiempo hay que esperar? Este es un tema que desconcierta a muchos. Se quejan de que llevan toda la vida haciendo cosas por los demás y que nadie hace nada por ellos... Creo que debemos de estar vigilantes, pero desde el tiempo de Dios. No es un tema de reloj sino de corazón, de fe, de esperanza, de amor. Quien tiene prisa nunca podrá esperar bien; ya saben ustedes que "el amor es paciente". Tienen la lámpara encendida quien tiene los ojos abiertos y la atención despierta. La lámpara encendida es la fe.

Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)

La predicación de Jesús nos presenta estas obras de misericordia para que podamos darnos cuenta si vivimos o no como discípulos suyos. Redescubramos las obras de misericordia corporales: dar de comer al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, vestir al desnudo, acoger al forastero, asistir los enfermos, visitar a los presos, enterrar a los muertos. Y no olvidemos las obras de misericordia espirituales: dar consejo al que lo necesita, enseñar al que no sabe, corregir al que yerra, consolar al triste, perdonar las ofensas, soportar con paciencia las personas molestas, rogar a Dios por los vivos y por los difuntos. . En cada uno de los que ayudemos de los "más pequeños" está presente Cristo mismo. No olvidemos las palabras de san Juan de la Cruz: « En el ocaso de nuestras vidas, seremos juzgados en el amor ».

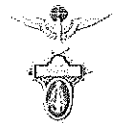
