Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear parishioners,

The Church recently made headlines because Pope Francis established a commission to explore the possibility of women deacons. I have seen a lot of speculation on what is going to happen as a result of the commission, as well as speculation of what is not going to happen. As has been the case with other issues I've written about, I want to caution you from speculating about what the Church should or should not do. It's not our place to judge these matters. It is our place to learn from the Church.

Here are some things I think you should know as you listen to media reports. The first is that the Church is not the same as the United States, and our gender categories and battles that rage in our own culture are not happening all over the world. Certain ideas about sex and gender that arise from our culture are not compatible with what God reveals to us about sex and gender. Thus, people who are presupposing these battles as universal and projecting them onto the Church and her decision to have or not have women deacons are likely to be confused when it is resolved.

Another thing to know is that Pope John Paul II really settled the issue of women priests during his pontificate, stating quite clearly that the Church has no authority to ordain women to the priesthood. The question of women deacons, however, has not been resolved so clearly. The primary reason for this is that women are quite clearly referred to as deacons in scripture. There are several examples in the writings of St. Paul which mention women serving as deacons.

However, what St. Paul meant by deacon might not be what we are inclined to think of when we think of deacons. In our modern practice we have a very narrow conception of what a deacon is and what a deacon does. In the early Church, the term "Deacon" seems to be applied much more broadly and, to my knowledge, did not necessarily entail serving the liturgy or preaching at the celebration of the Eucharist. (In fact, the ministry of deacons in the early Church was almost exclusively outside of the walls of the Church)

This is all to say that there are many different directions that this could go and I believe that it is of great importance that we trust the Holy Spirit here and be open to a wide range of possibilities. I will be surprised if there are major changes in the Church as a result of this commission, and I will also be surprised if there aren't some minor changes to the way the diaconate is thought of in the Church.

That being said, I do worry about certain aspects of the commission. Specifically, I'm very worried that this will play into a lot of the division and anxiety that presently exists in the world over issues of sex and gender. I repeat what I have said in other columns and what I have said above. We cannot project our modern American conceptions of sex and gender onto the Church. Our Catholic tradition teaches us that women and men are equal in dignity, but it also affirms that there are some differences in men and women that are deeper in our physical form.

When the study is over there will certainly be people saying the Church did not change enough and others saying the Church changed too much. You don't need to buy into the division and let these voices disturb you of your peace. I'm not going to let them do that. Instead, I'm going to pray for the commission and help people accept and make sense of whatever happens.

20. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C
Lucas 12, 49-53 "Jesús, división y contradicción".

Si observamos el mundo de hoy, si miramos al hombre moderno, podemos distinguir dos tipos o clases de personas. **1. El hombre adaptado.** Sufre bajo una enfermedad grave y universal: *la masificación*. Es aquel que piensa lo que piensa, porque los demás lo piensan; aquel que dice lo que dice, porque los demás lo dicen; el que hace lo que hace, porque los demás lo hacen. El hombre masificado no piensa por sí mismo y no decide por sí mismo, sino se deja arrastrar por los demás. Por eso, no tiene personalidad, ni carácter, ni interioridad. Tal vez deberíamos vernos también a nosotros mismos en ese espejo del hombre moderno. Probablemente encontraríamos algunos rasgos nuestros en él. **2. Al otro tipo de hombre podríamos llamar el hombre-contradicción.** Es el hombre plenamente libre, que puede pensar y decidir por sí mismo. Es capaz, por lo tanto, de asumir responsabilidades, de comprometerse, de ser fiel. Y es porque actúa de acuerdo con su propia conciencia, y no con la opinión pública. Pero eso le da también una paz verdadera, una lucidez interior, una serenidad muy grande. Modelo de este hombre pleno, de este hombre nuevo, de este hombre-contradicción es Jesucristo mismo. En Él y en su mensaje se dividen los espíritus. Cuando es todavía un niño ya se profetiza de Él: "Este será un signo de contradicción para muchos" (Lc 2, 34). Y al final de su vida, los jefes de Israel lo acusan ante Pilato con estas palabras: "alborota al pueblo" (Lc 23, 2). La vida de Jesús no es una vida tranquila y tranquilizante. Todo lo contrario, es un profeta perseguido sin piedad por las autoridades del pueblo, excomulgado de la comunidad judía, traicionado por falsos amigos, entregado a los romanos y crucificado para escarmiento de todos. Pero no cabe duda de que Jesús quiere la paz y no la guerra. Sólo que su paz no tiene nada que ver con lo que el mundo entiende por paz. Esta es una falsa paz, construida sobre la injusticia, la discriminación, la marginación. Frente a esta falsa paz, Jesús sí quiere la guerra. Jesús no viene al mundo para ser un hombre de paz, es decir, un hombre sin problemas y compromisos. Jesús viene al mundo para dar testimonio de la verdad y luchar contra la mentira, para anunciar la Buena Nueva a los pobres y denunciar la injusticia de los ricos y poderosos. Jesús viene al mundo para decir a unos: "¡Bienaventurados!" y a otros: "¡Ay de vosotros, hipócritas!". En este contexto debemos entender el Evangelio de hoy: "No penséis que he venido a la tierra a sembrar paz: no he venido a sembrar paz, sino espadas. He venido a enemistar al hijo con su padre, a la hija con su madre, a la nuera con su suegra..." El Evangelio de Jesús es conflictivo: Lleva la división dentro de la familia y crea conflictos en nuestra conciencia. Nos obliga a definirnos, a tomar posición, a optar entre dos alternativas. La palabra de Dios es conflictiva, porque pide nuestra conversión, la renuncia a nuestros planes egoístas, la lucha por un mundo mejor. Hermanos, decidirse por Cristo y seguirle fielmente no es asunto fácil. Pero su camino nos colma también de una alegría profunda y una paz verdadera y segura. Y al final del camino nos espera el gozo y la felicidad de Cristo para siempre.

Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)

En el Evangelio de Lucas encontramos otro aspecto importante para vivir con fe el Jubileo. El evangelista narra que Jesús, lo llamaron para que leyera la Escritura y la comentara. Era el del profeta Isaías donde está escrito: « El Espíritu del Señor está sobre mí, porque me ha ungido para anunciar a los pobres la Buena Nueva, me ha enviado a proclamar la liberación a los cautivos y la vista a los ciegos, para dar la libertad a los oprimidos y proclamar un año de gracia del Señor » (61,1-2). "Un año de gracia": es esto lo que el Señor anuncia y lo que deseamos vivir. Este Año Santo lleva consigo la riqueza de la misión de Jesús que resuena en las palabras del Profeta: llevar una palabra y un gesto de consolación a los pobres, anunciar la liberación a cuantos están prisioneros de las nuevas esclavitudes de la sociedad moderna, restituir la vista a quien no puede ver más porque se ha replegado sobre sí mismo, y volver a dar dignidad a cuantos han sido privados de ella. La predicación de Jesús se hace de nuevo visible en las respuestas de fe que el testimonio de los cristianos está llamado a ofrecer.

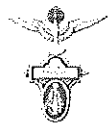
