## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

Summer is almost over, which means that the fall is about to begin, which means that we are gearing up for another year of teaching the Catholic faith to the people of our Counties! Here is a look at some things we are planning.

**Bible Study:** Our Bible study will resume on Sunday, September 11<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the St. Rose parish center. Our first topic to study will be a ten week series on St. Peter the Apostle. We will look at who he was, what he did, and what he wrote. It is a good opportunity to learn and it is also a good opportunity to meet other Catholics in the area.

**The Alpha Course:** Last year, we held *The Alpha Course* at Immaculate Heart of Mary in Kelso, and we are going to do it again this year. Our first meeting will be at 6pm on Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup>. *The Alpha Course* is an introduction to the basics of Christianity, but it has something for everyone. Alpha is for people who have been Catholic their whole life, and it is also for people who have never attended Church before.

Every single Alpha begins with a meal. We then listen to a presentation. Sometimes the presentation is a live talk by a presenter, but it is usually a video. The presentation covers questions like, "Is there more to life than this?" and "Why is Jesus important?" We then have a discussion on the presentation. Alpha is something that many parishes in the Archdiocese are starting to use and I know from my priest friends that it has been fairly successful.

If you know somebody who has been away from the Church for a longtime (Catholic or not) you might consider telling them about Alpha and joining them. Similarly, if you know somebody who has been on the fence about the question of God and Church you might consider inviting them as well. If you aren't sure, I want to encourage you to visit the Alpha website and to watch the video that we will be using for the first evening. **Mass in Slow Motion:** We have tentatively scheduled a "Mass in Slow Motion" for Wednesday, September 21<sup>st</sup> at 5:45pm at St. Rose. This is an opportunity to learn how to pray the Mass a little bit better. This is a regular Mass, but we stop periodically to explain why we do certain things. We did this in seminary, and I learned how to pray the Mass better every time.

**Youth Ministry:** As was the case in previous years, we will host youth ministry on Wednesday nights at 6:30pm. Middle School youth will meet in the St. Rose school gym, and High School youth will meet in the St. Rose parish center. We had a lot of successes in youth ministry last year and are excited to build on what we did.

Youth ministry is very difficult. Some students know a great deal about our faith and other students don't know much at all. Thus, it's very difficult to plan a night where every student *gets* something. For this reason, we emphasized that the best reason to participate in youth ministry is because every single student has something to *give* to their peers and it is better to give than to receive. We hope your students will attend! We also need volunteers. If you think you might be called to help our high school and middle students discover the beauty of our Catholic faith, please let us know.

## IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY FISH NEWS

We hosted FISH on August 4th and 5th, serving 46 families, including 86 adults and 61 kids, for a total of 150 people. We saw several of the kids since they aren't in school at this time of the year. The grade school and pre-school kids were happy to choose a book from the RIF supply (Reading Is Fundamental program). Again, we had a couple of people who rode their bikes to pick up their food boxes. Also, we again had homeless people in need of food, this month three persons.

Please know that all of your donations help the poor and challenged amongst us. On Friday, we received several pounds of fresh produce from the School Community Gardens. The assorted beans, cucumbers, peas, and squash were eagerly chosen by our families. One mother commented on how much she loved the opportunity to have fresh produce and was eager to take as much as she could home to her family that includes five kids.

We need your support to carry out this ministry for the poor in our community. Our pantry shelves need canned soups, stews and chili, canned veggies, peanut butter (15-16 oz. jars are best), tuna, tomato sauce, mac & cheese, Top Ramen, cereal and canned fruit, and then some more canned fruit! To feed a person three meals a day for three days (total of nine meals per family member) we need one 15 oz. can of fruit per person. Many thanks to our volunteers for setting up tables, gathering food items from the CAP Warehouse, and distributing food: Joe Brunelle, Joe Buttle, John Coleman, Jim Fernandez, Bobbi Jo Gushman, Tom Laird, Caleigh Maffett, Chuck Marshall, Cory Mugaas, Linda Waterman, Sara Beth Waterman Our next time to host FISH is October 6th and 7th. If anyone has fresh produce from their garden and/or orchard, please consider sharing with FISH.

It can be brought to the church on the 5th or 6th. Or, by 9am on the 7th. It can be left outside Room 3 if no one is available to accept it directly.

## 21. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—Lucas 13, 22-30

*"Vendrán de Oriente y de Occidente y se sentarán a la mesa del reino de Dios."*

La salvación es un tema que hoy no está públicamente presente en muchas personas. Muy pocas veces vemos en los medios de comunicación social una referencia a la salvación que nos trae Jesús. Si preguntamos a muchos cristianos qué es eso de la salvación probablemente también se quedarán en la duda de no poder expresar con palabras un contenido tan amplio. La salvación es nada más y nada menos que estar en Dios, vivir en plenitud una vida eterna presente ya en nuestra vida diaria. Cuando le preguntan a Jesús sobre el número de personas que se salvan no da ninguna cantidad sino lo que hace es decirle qué es lo que hay que hacer para salvarse. Es una manera muy pedagógica de enfrentar a la persona con su propia realidad. La respuesta la tiene que dar cada persona contrastando su vida con el ideal de Cristo. *¿Estás salvado?* Los requisitos que Jesús nos propone no son fáciles y menos para el mundo donde nos movemos donde lo que se persigue es la comodidad, la ley del mínimo esfuerzo y el resultado rápido y eficaz. Veamos las propuestas que nos hace: - **Entren por la puerta estrecha:** La puerta estrecha no es como alguno puede creer una vida llena de sufrimientos, privaciones y sacrificios, cosa por desgracia tan arraigada en personas que se dicen "cristianas" pero que lo que realmente ocultan son sus traumas o conflictos mentales. Hemos sido llamados a la salvación, a vivir en plenitud, pero sé que esa salvación demanda de mí una aceptación plena de Jesús. La puerta estrecha es el encuentro consigo mismo en la soledad de tu interior. Es ese diálogo interno donde se fragua la aceptación de Cristo. Es la conversión personal en su mayor nivel. La puerta estrecha no son las alabanzas de las personas ni el éxito material, la puerta estrecha es la que me hace entrar al interior de mí yo. Creo que Jesús nos invita a este camino de salvación por esta puerta estrecha, la de nuestra realidad despojados de todo lo que obtenemos en la vida. Hay personas de todas latitudes y credos que hacen la experiencia de pasar por la puerta estrecha. Aquella persona que se pone ante Dios tal cual es, sin estar rebotando de los logros del mundo está haciendo la experiencia de pasar por ese lugar indicado por Jesús. Ser uno mismo ante Dios, no llevar exceso de equipaje para que nuestra vida no esté llena de temores ante la posible pérdida o robo de las cosas mundanas. Llevar nuestra vida a Dios tal cual es, eso es pasar por la puerta estrecha. - **Estén alerta:** En las sociedades cristianas tenemos el peligro de pensar que nuestra forma de vivir la fe es la más auténtica, la más verdadera. Recuerdo que cuando empezó la libertad religiosa con la aparición de distintos grupos, varias personas se me acercaron preguntándome "cuál era la verdadera..." Tenemos que estar alertas para vivir una fe llena de Dios y no de nuestros proyectos y presupuestos humanos. Dios no reconoce a quien no es capaz de dejarlo todo por Él a pesar de que compartieron mesa y palabra. Estar alerta es preguntarnos con frecuencia dónde está Dios y dónde estoy yo en este momento de mi vida. Vivir la fe con alegría y optimismo dejándose llevar por la voluntad de Dios. Vivir el camino así significa tener una existencia no frustrada sino realizada. En este camino del Señor vendrán otras personas de donde menos lo esperamos y compartirán con nosotros el reino de Dios.

### *Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)*

17. De nuevo ponemos en el centro el sacramento de la Reconciliación, porque nos permite experimentar en carne propia la grandeza de la misericordia. Será para cada penitente fuente de verdadera paz interior. Nunca me cansaré de insistir en que los confesores sean un verdadero signo de la misericordia del Padre. Ser confesores no se improvisa. Se llega a serlo cuando, ante todo, nos hacemos nosotros penitentes en busca de perdón. Nunca olvidemos que ser confesores significa participar de la misma misión de Jesús y ser signo concreto de la continuidad de un amor divino que perdona y que salva. Cada uno de nosotros ha recibido el don del Espíritu Santo para el perdón de los pecados, de esto somos responsables. Ninguno de nosotros es dueño del Sacramento, sino fiel servidor del perdón de Dios.
