## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz County Catholics,

*This column is really for the young people of our parishes especially our high school students. I wrote it a year ago, but it is still applicable. They don't often read the bulletin, so you might need to point it out to them and encourage them to read.*

I want to take a moment to welcome all of you back to your respective schools this week and offer you some encouragement as you head into the new school year. I specifically want to encourage you to work hard (which I know you do) and take advantage of this opportunity you have to be educated. I also want to encourage you in some other ways. Specifically, here are some things I wish I knew when I was in high school.

**Your experience in high school does not have to define you as an adult:** In high school there are always popular people and less popular people. Ten years after high school some of the popular people will be less popular and some of the less popular will be the happiest and most successful. It's just the way it works. So if you don't like the way people think of you or treat you now, just know that this will be temporary. If you are among the more popular students and enjoy the way things are going, don't think it will always be like that either. What will make you a happy and well liked adult is that you treat people well and develop the skills to act like an adult. This leads me to my next point:

**Enjoy high school, but move on when it's over:** I enjoyed my time in high school. I loved going to football games and basketball games. I loved being around my friends most of the day. Overall, my experience was very positive and I was sad when it ended. But high school isn't supposed to last forever and that is good because life after high school can be way better. It might be harder in some ways, but life can be much more meaningful and fulfilling when you are committed to your family, or your job, or some other positive endeavor. Some of you might go off to college and it will be easier to move on. Some of you, however, will stay home for a while and it will be a little more difficult to move on from your high school life. Enjoy this experience for what it is, but try to avoid acting like a high schooler into your adult years. It might sound fun to stay young, but it doesn't look good.

**Please don't say or do anything stupid on social media:** No, Twitter and Instagram didn't exist when I was in high school (or college) and I'm glad. I made some mistakes in high school. Thankfully, these were not documented on social media and I was able to move on from them. Please know that mean things you say or do on Twitter and Instagram can come back to haunt you. Even if you delete them, people can screenshot them and use them against you in the future. The best way to avoid that is to not say or do anything stupid or rude or mean at all, and if you already have, just stop.

**Finally, don't forget to spend time with your family:** When I was in high school I spent more time at my friends houses than I did my own home. I thought that I would be best friends with some of these guys my whole life, but it just wasn't true. I barely see the guys I hung out with so much. Yes it was fun, but I regret blowing off my family to hang out with them so much. Yes, your family is probably embarrassing, but you aren't going to care that they are embarrassing in a few years. You'll wind up appreciating them and you will likely be spending a lot more time with them in the future than your high school friends.

**23. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C— Lucas 14, 25-33**  
**"El que no renuncie a todos sus bienes, no puede ser discípulo mío."**

La Palabra de hoy es algo desconcertante. Mucha gente acompañaba al Maestro por el camino. Entre esas personas había de todo tipo de gente. Unos le acompañaban porque descubrieron en Él a alguien a quien merecía la pena seguirle. Otros le seguían por interés y algunos por curiosidad. Se volvió y les empezó a explicar lo difícil que es acompañarle. Ellos le estaban siguiendo físicamente, pero ahora Jesús les expone la necesidad de seguirle con el interior, con el amor más profundo. Los seres humanos, incluso los que intentamos llevar un seguimiento de Jesús con una cierta dignidad, siempre podemos caer en la tentación de dejarnos absorber por otras situaciones de la vida. Puede ser el trabajo, los amigos, las dificultades e incluso nosotros mismos. La mayor dificultad que tenemos las personas para seguir a Cristo no está en los demás, ni en los que me dan alegrías o los que me dan penas. Mi mayor obstáculo puedo ser yo mismo si no soy capaz de poner a cada situación y cada persona en el lugar que les corresponde en mi vida. No es que Jesús haga un desprecio al amor hacia los más cercanos. No nos dice que les dejemos de amar. Lo que nos recuerda es que la fuente del amor, el amor más grande lo tenemos que tener hacia Dios; de esa fuente nacerá la enseñanza para aprender a amar de verdad a los otros. Muchos de los amores de la vida nos pueden apartar del camino del amor verdadero. Jesús nos anima a amarle más allá de lo físico, por eso su amor aparece como más exigente. Seguir al Señor necesita de un amor más fuerte porque sus exigencias son mayores. Seguir a Cristo es intentar vivir como Él vivió. Su vida fue una total entrega por encima de los lazos familiares y de las relaciones filiales. Instauró una nueva forma de relación entre los seres humanos: ver a todos, de una manera especial a los más débiles y necesitados, como miembros de la propia familia de Dios, de esa manera todos pasamos a la categoría de hermanos en el Señor. Amar a Cristo es preferirlo sobre otros amores. Las renunciaciones no se refieren solamente a cosas físicas pues hay muchas personas que dan el corazón a cosas materiales. La renuncia que Jesús nos pide pasa también por renunciar a nosotros mismos. Hay personas que han sido capaces de desprenderse en el seguimiento de Jesús de las cosas materiales. No son ambiciosos. Pero, sin embargo, el camino de discípulo no ha llegado a plenitud porque no ha sabido desprenderse de sí mismo: de sus manías y obsesiones, de sus traumas y cerrazones. Estos creen que son discípulos pero no lo son porque o bien no han querido o no han podido sentir el amor de Cristo en plenitud. Solamente hay una cosa más difícil que desprendernos del amor a las cosas materiales y de las personas que nos rodea, y es precisamente desprendernos de nosotros mismos. Cuando estamos muy centrados en nuestra vida, cuando estamos obsesivamente preocupados por nosotros, por nuestro futuro, por nuestra situación, es muy difícil que el amor de Dios perdure en nosotros ya que nuestros intereses serán otros. Quien sigue a Cristo tiene pocas preocupaciones por sí mismo ya que en el Señor encuentra en cantidad lo que otros no le pueden ofrecer.

**Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)**

**19.** La palabra del perdón pueda llegar a todos y la llamada a experimentar la misericordia no deje a ninguno indiferente. Mi invitación a la conversión se dirige con mayor insistencia a aquellas personas que se encuentran lejanas de la gracia de Dios debido a su conducta de vida. Por vuestro bien, os pido cambiar de vida. Os lo pido en el nombre del Hijo de Dios que si bien combate el pecado nunca rechaza a ningún pecador. No caigáis en la terrible trampa de pensar que la vida depende del dinero y que ante él todo el resto se vuelve carente de valor y dignidad. Es solo una ilusión. No llevamos el dinero con nosotros al más allá. El dinero no nos da la verdadera felicidad. La violencia usada para amasar fortunas que escurren sangre no convierte a nadie en poderoso ni inmortal. Para todos, tarde o temprano, llega el juicio de Dios al cual ninguno puede escapar.

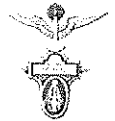
