Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

People who know me best describe me as an eighty-something year old man trapped in a twenty-something year old's body, who actually happens to be thirty-something. This makes me a fairly old fashioned Millennial. With that in mind, I'd like to offer some thoughts on premarital cohabitation to any fellow millennials willing to listen.

It seems as though living with a significant other prior to marriage would be a great way to test a relationship to see if it has what it takes for marriage, but living together to test a relationship actually has a pretty poor track record. I recently read an article from *Psychology Today* called, "What You Need to Know for Sure Before Moving in Together," which examined that particular reasoning.

According to the report, men cohabiting in order to test a relationship reported, "higher levels of depressive symptoms, generalized anxiety symptoms, difficulty depending on others, and anxiety about abandonment." Women also reported greater abandonment anxiety. Both men and women reported, "greater negative interaction and psychological aggression, and lower relationship confidence and adjustment."

The article concludes, however, that cohabiting does not *cause* these problems. Rather, these problems were present in these relationships before the couple moved in together. The author of the report says, "It seems to us that many people who think about testing their relationship by cohabiting already know, on some level, what the grade of that test may be; they are just hoping that the answer looks better over time."

In other words, if you are thinking about moving in with your boyfriend or girlfriend to test a relationship, ask yourself why your relationship needs to be tested in the first place. In other words, consider that a need to test your relationship might actually be an indicator that something is wrong.

If something is wrong, living together is not going to help at all. I've been saying it for years, but living together makes it much more difficult to break up and move on. This is a HUGE point. People living together often find themselves stuck in relationships that fall short of their expectations for love and marriage. That might sound harsh, but it has happened to our generation an awful lot. The article at *Psychology Today* said the same thing and was linked to another four articles to prove the point. Simply stated, the effort required to break up and move out is much greater than the effort to break up and go back to your own place.

Cohabiting is a bad idea and if you want to maximize the strength in your relationship, I suggest that you simply not do it. As the article states, there are better ways to strengthen your relationship and discern whether or not marriage is in the future for you and your significant other. Attending relationship counseling while dating is a great option.

I also want to make a quick case that living separately until marriage can strengthen a relationship in significant ways. Living separately can build important virtues that relationships need to thrive like patience, trust and self-control. These virtues take time to develop and mature, and they are not fostered when you begin sharing a bed together soon after meeting. Avoiding cohabitation will give you greater clarity that your love is real and true and can survive challenges.

24. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—

Lucas 15, 1-32: "Habrá alegría en el cielo por un solo pecador que se convierta."

Termina el verano, tiempo de vacaciones, y regresamos a la santa rutina del despertador matinal, del trabajo y, algunos hasta vuelven a la misa dominical. Volvemos al área de descanso y, hoy, nos proclamamos el evangelio de los objetos perdidos: la moneda perdida, la oveja perdida, el hermano perdido, el padre y la casa perdida. Hemos proclamado "el evangelio dentro del evangelio". Si la palabra evangelio significa Buena Noticia, la única Buena Noticia que nos trae Jesús es que hay perdón para todos. Todo lo demás son pequeñas noticias. Nosotros los que hemos vuelto a la casa de oración, sabemos y creemos que Jesús vino a buscar y salvar a todos los hermanos perdidos. "Ese acoge a los pecadores y come con ellos", fantástico piropo que le lanzan sus enemigos, los que se creen buenos, naturalmente. Dicen, y es verdad, que los santos tienen un pasado: fueron también ovejas perdidas, hijos pródigos, protestaron, pecaron, se alejaron de Dios... y los pecadores tienen un futuro porque las puertas están siempre abiertas y los brazos de Dios están siempre extendidos para abrazarnos. Nadie puede presumir de ser de haber sido siempre bueno y nadie puede presumir de haber sido siempre malo. Nosotros, santos con pasado y pecadores con futuro, vamos siempre en busca de una felicidad ilusoria. Recuerden, sólo el perdón de Dios no tiene límites. Cuando ustedes se mueran y se encuentren con Jesús, él les mostrará la película de su vida entera. Verán todas las cosas buenas que hicieron, pero verán muchos espacios en blanco. Si le preguntan a Jesús el porqué de esos largos silencios, Jesús les dirá que cada vez que pecaban y pedían perdón Dios borraba sus pecados. Bendito sea mi Padre Dios. 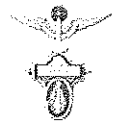
