Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

It's been a while since I've done this, but I finally saw some movies worth commenting on, so here you go. I hope you enjoy them!

Kubo and the Two Strings: Kubo and the two strings is a PG rated animated film that has received very high praise from critics. In terms of its style it was a thing of beauty and will likely be nominated for some awards. The film was a bit scary for little ones, hence the PG rating. The evil twin sisters, for example, were just fantastic. They were scary!

The first third of the movie really captivated my attention. It was brilliant! But as it went on, the story didn't develop very well. It started to get a little boring and I found the themes to be a bit banal. There were also a handful of unanswered questions pertaining to the plot (though I may have missed them after I got bored). I wouldn't recommend this movie, but the main reason is that it was spiritually very pessimistic. The "God" figure in the story simply is not good and if you take your kids you might want to have a conversation with them on this point. Overall, the movie was artistically strong enough for adults to watch on Netflix or DVD.

Hell or High Water: Hell or High Water is the type of movie I usually love. It had a fairly simple plot and was driven by great acting and excellent dialogue. But for some reason, I didn't love this one when I walked out of the theater. As I've thought about it I've come to appreciate it more and will try to see it again after it comes out on video. I have a feeling I'll like it more a second time.

Basically, it is about two brothers robbing banks. Their mother was in debt because of a reverse mortgage loan, and the younger brother (played by Captain Kirk, I mean Chris Pine) wanted to get the property back because he recently found out there was oil on the property. I don't want to give much away, but as I said, the acting was super and I think that alone is a reason to see the movie. I expect some academy award nominations for this one.

Sully: *Sully* is the true story of Captain "Sully" Sullenberger, and his Miraculous landing of a passenger plane on the Hudson River. Immediately hailed as a hero by the plane's passengers and the public, Captain Sullenberger underwent serious scrutiny by the National Transportation Safety Board for not trying to get the plane back to an airport. Sully was believed by some to have put people's lives in danger by landing on water in the middle of January.

The movie was very good. I especially liked the non-linear method of telling the story. The movie began in the middle of the story. The emergency landing has already occurred and they present the audience with the controversy, before they actually show the audience what happened on the plane. There is so much to like about this movie! One character I loved for some reason was the air traffic controller. It gave you a great feel for what actually goes on in a control tower.

I also loved the credits, which showed real passengers reuniting with the real Sully and his family in front of the real plane they flew on. I love it when films based on true stories do that well (MacFarland USA did that well, The 33 did not)! There were a few problems with the final act keeping this from being a great film, but for all the good reasons explained above, I strongly recommend you see this film!

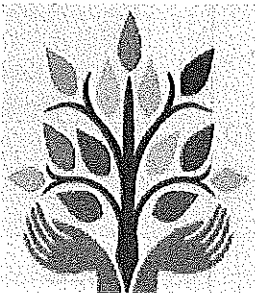

26. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C— Lucas 16, 19-31 “Lázaro y el rico”.

Hace unos años una mujer llamada Sara Miles vio la puerta de una Iglesia abierta, entró y desde ese día ya no es la misma persona. En su libro, *Take This Bread*, cuenta lo que pasó aquel día. “Una mañana nublada cuando yo tenía cuarenta y seis años, entré en una Iglesia al comenzar el día, comí un trozo de pan, y bebí un poco de vino. Esa fue mi primera comunión y mi vida cambió completamente. El sacramento misterioso resultó ser algo más que un mero símbolo, fue verdadero alimento, pan de vida. Comulgé, pasé el pan a los otros y seguí caminando”. Sara Miles describe su conversión así: “Descubrí una religión enraizada en la práctica de lo más ordinario y al mismo tiempo más subversivo, una mesa a la que todos son invitados. Y me hice cristiana. Siguió asistiendo los domingos a la iglesia de San Gregorio de San Francisco y a partir de aquel día comenzó a distribuir alimentos a los pobres de la ciudad durante la semana. En la mesa del Señor encontró la mesa de la fraternidad. La puerta abierta de la iglesia permitió a Sara Miles contemplar por primera vez el adentro de la casa de Dios, y sin saber lo que hacía se sintió agraciada y alimentada con un trozo de pan y un trago de vino. El Señor le abrió la puerta y el corazón. LA PARÁBOLA DEL HOMBRE RICO Y DE Lázaro es la historia de una puerta que separa estos dos mundos. Detrás de la puerta “hay un hombre que banquetea diariamente”. Tiene tantas riquezas que no necesita tener un nombre. Lo único que no tiene es ojos para ver a Lázaro tumbado al otro lado de su puerta. Afuera “hay un mendigo llamado Lázaro”. Lo único que tiene es un nombre. Lázaro que significa Dios ayuda. Separados sólo por una puerta, tan cerca y tan lejos, no se ven, no se hablan, no se conocen, se ignoran. El pecado del hombre rico no está en su riqueza. Su pecado imperdonable es su ceguera y su indiferencia. No ve e ignora a sabiendas a Lázaro que está ahí, al otro lado de su puerta. Esta historia contada por Jesús hace dos mil años, nosotros la seguimos contando, mejor, la seguimos viendo diariamente. Nosotros hemos abierto la puerta de la iglesia, la puerta de la fe, y hemos entrado para celebrar a Dios, escuchar su Palabra y alimentarnos en la mesa de la fraternidad. Venimos porque queremos ver con los ojos de la fe lo que nuestros ojos de la carne se niegan a ver, los lázaros que nos rodean. Venimos porque queremos curar nuestra ignorancia, ignorancia intencionada y razonada con mil sabios argumentos. ¿Acaso soy yo el guardián de mi hermano? Pregunta de Caín que seguimos haciendo también nosotros. ¿Qué puedo hacer yo para ayudar a los lázaros que están ahí afuera? La Palabra de Dios quiere curar nuestra ceguera y nuestra ignorancia y nuestra indiferencia que pueden tener terribles consecuencias. Todos conocemos las estadísticas de la pobreza, pero las ignoramos y no nos convierten. Todos conocemos las exigencias del evangelio de Jesús, pero las ignoramos y no nos convierten. Todos nos sentimos un poco culpables, pero nuestra culpabilidad no alimenta a nadie. Al final de la vida, hoy podemos ignorar dos palabras que ustedes conocen bien, la palabra cielo y la palabra infierno. Al final de la vida se abrirán dos puertas, la puerta de la vida para los servidores, los que han visto y han aprendido en la escuela de Jesús, y la puerta de la muerte para los que sólo han vivido para sí mismos detrás de sus puertas. Nadie se equivocará de puerta, instintivamente elegirá la puerta que ha elegido a lo largo de la vida.

Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)

21. Si Dios se detuviera en la justicia dejaría de ser Dios, sería como todos los hombres que invocan respeto por la ley. La justicia por sí misma no basta, y la experiencia enseña que apelando solamente a ella se corre el riesgo de destruirla. Por esto Dios va más allá de la justicia con la misericordia y el perdón. Esto no significa restarle valor a la justicia o hacerla superflua, al contrario. Quien se equivoca deberá expiar la pena.
