## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

It's time for the annual public service announcement regarding Mass attendance if you are experiencing any illness. Based on the coughing and sneezing I heard at Mass last week, it was apparent that cold and flu season is definitely upon us.

The bottom line is that if you are experiencing any type of illness that you think can spread to other parishioners, I respectfully ask that out of concern for their health and wellbeing that you do not attend Mass. Yes, you read that right. If you are sick, please stay home and recover and do not put other people's health at risk. Concern for the health of other people is most definitely a valid reason to stay home and if you miss Mass for those reasons, it is not a sin.

Again, it is not a sin to miss Mass if you believe that your attendance will put other people's health at risk. Some of you may have had priests growing up who did not teach you that. Well, I am teaching you right now. It is not a sin to miss Mass if you believe that you will cause other people to become sick. So, if you miss Mass because you are ill, please do not come to confess that because there is no sin to confess.

Also, if you do come to Mass, even if you are healthy, please remember that there are people who have anxiety about germs and illnesses. Thus, they might not want to actually shake your hand at the sign of peace or hold your hand during the Our Father (Holding hands during the Our Father is kind of outdated anyway). If you want to hold hands during the Our Father, please feel free to do so, but respect other people in our congregation who don't want to.

This is especially true of our extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. If you are on the schedule to distribute communion please try to call us and let us know that you won't attend, but please do not show up expecting to serve. When I was sick in the past, I stepped back and did not distribute communion so as to avoid spreading germs to other people.

If you choose to stay home, I would still encourage you to spend some time in prayer. You can also read the readings from that weekends Mass, which are published on the bishops website ([www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org)). I also encourage you, if you have a computer readily available to listen to Bishop Robert Barron's weekly homily which you can find at [www.wordonfire.org](http://www.wordonfire.org). You can also (usually) listen to my homily which is (usually) recorded and uploaded onto the internet.

**War Dogs:** Last week I reviewed some movies. I get a lot of positive comments when I do that, for some reason so here is a bonus. War Dogs is the true story about two very young men in Florida who get into the business of selling weapons to the US government. The movie was advertised as a low brow comedy, and it certainly had those moments, but I thought the movie was much more serious overall.

I liked it a lot. Jonah Hill, as always, was thoroughly entertaining. I researched the actual story online and it looks like the film was pretty accurate in many important ways. It's not for everyone and it is definitely not for children, but adults who aren't uncomfortable with crude humor might enjoy it.

**27. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—  
Lucas 17, 5-10 "Señor, Auméntanos la Fe".**

Una de las preguntas que con más frecuencia hacen los incrédulos es: "¿Para qué sirve la fe? ¿Acaso el que tiene fe no va a caer en la enfermedad, en la ruptura matrimonial, en la depresión...? En un mundo como el nuestro las cosas se buscan para que "sirvan" para algo. Vale lo que me sirve. Es inútil lo que no me aporta nada. Esa es la concepción que tienen muchas personas de nuestro mundo. La fe se mueve en otras claves totalmente diferentes. La fe no es una conquista humana, ni se compra, ni se obtiene por el propio esfuerzo personal. La fe es un magnífico regalo que Dios nos hace. ¿Qué hay que hacer para acoger la fe que Dios nos regala? Dice la Escritura en Hebreos 11,6: "Pero no es posible agradar a Dios sin tener fe, porque para acercarse a Dios es necesario creer que existe y que recompensa a quienes le buscan." La búsqueda constante de Dios debe ser la tarea más urgente en nuestra vida. Tenemos fe, claro que tenemos fe, pero nunca nos olvidemos que es una fe llena de tentaciones. Una fe que sucumbe muchas veces con cierta facilidad. Unas veces pueden más las tentaciones que la propia fe, de ahí que tengamos los creyentes que estar más que atentos a ejercitar nuestra vida cristiana en todos los aspectos. Quien no vive en intensidad lo que cree tarde o temprano termina por debilitarse. Los Apóstoles piden al Señor que les aumente la fe ya que sin ella quedarán incapacitados para entender y vivir el Reino de Dios. Nuestra fe tiene que estar cimentada en Cristo por encima de todas las circunstancias de la vida. Mi fe no se sostiene porque tenga unas severas leyes morales ni tan siquiera porque tenga conceptos teológicos sólidos. Mi fe está anclada y alimentada en Cristo Resucitado. Mi diálogo interior y mi oración no es conmigo mismo o un diálogo con las ideas que se mueven en mi mente. Mi fe no es un sentimiento. Mi fe es un asentimiento y un experimentar al Señor vivo en mi vida. Al lado de la fe el Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que la humildad tiene que ser un elemento fundamental en el seguimiento del Señor. Ser humilde es reconocer nuestras limitaciones y debilidades y en actuar de acuerdo con este conocimiento. Por mucho que hagamos en el servicio del Señor siempre tenemos que mantenernos en la actitud de humildad. No soy yo quien he optado por Cristo. Es Jesús vivo quien me invita a seguirle y yo respondo desde mi fe con agradecimiento. La cosa no es realizar muchos trabajos pastorales ni tan siquiera sacrificarse, la respuesta es amar intensamente al Señor y dejar que sea Él quien nos acompañe en el camino de la vida. Somos "servidores inútiles" no porque no sirvamos para nada sino que por mucho que hagamos no le daremos a Dios más de lo que tiene. Él tiene que ser nuestra fuente y nuestro motor espiritual. Hay cristianos llenos de sufrimientos más que de amor porque el mundo que imaginan en su mente no se parece en nada al mundo real. Sufren porque existe una ruptura entre el ideal y la realidad. Más que en el amor de Dios viven en los propios esquemas personales y eso les produce un dolor intenso. Ya va siendo hora que en nuestra vida de cristianos se hagan más presentes los criterios de Dios que los nuestros, la voluntad de Dios más que la nuestra.

**Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)**

22. El Jubileo lleva también consigo la referencia a la indulgencia. En el Año Santo de la Misericordia ella adquiere una relevancia particular. El perdón de Dios por nuestros pecados no conoce límites. En la muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo, Dios hace evidente este amor que es capaz incluso de destruir el pecado de los hombres. Dejarse reconciliar con Dios es posible por medio del misterio pascual y de la mediación de la Iglesia. Así entonces, Dios está siempre disponible al perdón y nunca se cansa de ofrecerlo de manera siempre nueva e inesperada. Todos nosotros, sin embargo, vivimos la experiencia del pecado. Sabemos que estamos llamados a la perfección (cfr Mt 5,48), pero sentimos fuerte el peso del pecado. Mientras percibimos la potencia de la gracia que nos transforma, experimentamos también la fuerza del pecado que nos condiciona.

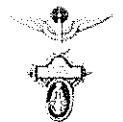
