## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

The election is now one month away. Every four years the Bishops of the United States releases a document called, "*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*." I want to point you to this document, and encourage you to read it, as it is actually quite rich in content. The document is available online and you can find it quite easily by searching on google or visiting [uscbb.org](http://uscbb.org).

Recently, Pope Francis was asked about our election. His message is consistent with our bishops. He said that Catholics should "Study the proposals well, pray and choose in conscience." As Catholics we should participate in the public square and we should vote. We should try our best to understand the issues of our day and not merely think of our own needs but the needs of everyone in society, especially the most vulnerable. Here are some potential ways to use your vote.

**Vote for a Major Party Candidate:** This is the most obvious route that we could take when casting our vote. People might vote for a candidate because they think they will be a great president, or they might vote because they believe the other major party candidate will be a worse president and they want to elect the "lesser of two evils." The downside of the latter route is that your vote will not be interpreted in that way. Your vote will be interpreted as total support for a candidate, even if you don't like all of their positions. There are, of course, other options.

**Vote for a Third Party Candidate:** There are downsides to voting for a third party candidate. The biggest is that it does increase the likelihood of the major party candidate you dislike the most winning the election. But, there are positive aspects of voting for a third party candidate. It gives you the opportunity to express yourself authentically and with a clear conscience. As I said above, voting for the "lesser of two evils" will not be interpreted that way. It will be interpreted by our politicians as complete support for that candidate's position. Voting for a third party candidate will not give them the impression that you support a candidate's entire platform when you really don't.

In addition to that aspect, there are some minor parties that really do reflect Catholic Social and Moral teaching much more closely than either of the major parties. I feel uncomfortable naming them here in this column so I will pass, but it isn't hard to find them on google or some other search engine. I bet if you look you'll find something that appeals to you if neither of the major party candidates appeal to you.

**Don't vote in certain races:** In paragraph 36 of *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* the bishops state, "When all candidates hold a position that promotes an intrinsically evil act, the conscientious voter faces a dilemma. The voter may decide to take the extraordinary step of not voting for any candidate..." I was admittedly surprised to read that in the document but there it is. An act is intrinsically evil if it is evil by its very nature. An intrinsically evil act can never be performed, even if good might come about because of it.

The document *Gaudium et Spes* lists some examples. Intrinsically evil acts include "whatever is opposed to life itself, such as any type of murder, genocide, abortion, euthanasia or wilful self-destruction, whatever violates the integrity of the human person, such as mutilation, torments inflicted on body or mind, attempts to coerce the will itself; whatever insults human dignity, such as subhuman living conditions, arbitrary imprisonment, deportation, slavery, prostitution, the selling of women and children; as well as disgraceful working conditions, where men are treated as mere tools for profit, rather than as free and responsible persons."

Again, I encourage you all to please continue studying the issues prayerfully and consider what the bishops of the community of faith, the Church, have to say about all of these issues.

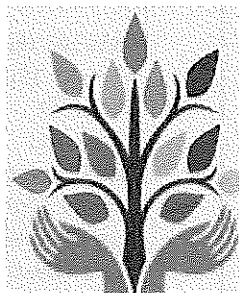

**28. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—  
Lucas 17, 11-19: " Gratitude "**

Érase una vez un niño que jugando en el muelle del puerto se cayó a las aguas profundas del océano. Un viejo marinero, sin pensar en el peligro, se lanzó al agua, buceó para encontrar al niño y finalmente, agotado, lo sacó del agua. Dos días más tarde la madre vino con el niño al muelle para encontrarse con el marinero. Cuando lo encontró le preguntó: "¿Es usted el que se lanzó al agua para rescatar a mi hijo? - "Sí, yo soy", respondió. -La madre le dijo: "¿Y dónde está el gorro de mi hijo? El evangelio de hoy nos recuerda una dimensión profunda de toda vida cristiana: la gratitud, la acción de gracias. Creer, tener fe, es ser agradecidos a Dios que actúa en las cosas normales de cada día. Muchas veces vemos a Dios en los acontecimientos extraordinarios y venimos a darle gracias porque algo inesperado y bueno nos ha sucedido, pero hay que ver a Dios en la vida de cada día: en el trabajo, en las luchas, en las benditas peleas y enfados... Dios es nuestro compañero y Padre cada día. Y casi siempre pasa desapercibido. La gratitud es una actitud necesaria. En ella experimentamos la salvación que Dios tiene para nosotros. Dios nos ha traído aquí para recordarnos que todo lo que nos rodea, todo lo que somos y tenemos es su don, su regalo. ¿Somos conscientes de lo mucho que hemos recibido sin hacer nada, sin merecerlo? ¿Da gracias a Dios todos los días? Sin el agradecimiento, nuestra salvación está incompleta, nuestras familias, nuestra Iglesia y nuestro mundo está en peligro. "Jesús, maestro, ten compasión de nosotros", gritaban los leprosos. Jesús no hizo nada. Sólo los mandó presentarse a los sacerdotes, ir al templo. Ya están los impuros, purificados. Ya están los apartados, integrados. Ya están los leprosos, sanados. Ya están los alejados, probados en la obediencia y la fe. Nueve eran judíos y fueron al viejo templo de Jerusalén, a la vieja ley y a los viejos sacrificios. Sólo uno, samaritano, pagano, cayó en la cuenta de que Jesús, al que habían gritado todos: "Señor, ten compasión de nosotros," era el nuevo templo, la nueva alianza, el nuevo perdón, el nuevo rostro de Dios. Y se volvió para ofrecerle a él un sacrificio de acción de gracias. La purificación sólo produjo la fe en el extranjero. El convertido, el que vuelve a Jesús vuelve a dar gracias. Gracias por la sanación, por la dignidad humana recuperada, por la amistad de Dios que es gratis, por encontrarse con Jesús el que desafía todas las fronteras y tiene compasión. Hay una fe que pide y se va a sus quehaceres, a su rutina, y olvida. Hay una fe que mira a Jesús, le da gracias todos los días y ve a Dios en los acontecimientos sencillos de la vida. Nosotros somos los diez leprosos que venimos a gritar a Jesús. "somos impuros", "Señor, ten compasión de nosotros". Y podemos quedar purificados. No te vayas al viejo templo, a la vieja alianza, a los viejos sacrificios, al corazón duro. Ven al único templo, a Jesús. Él te hace puro, él te ofrece un nuevo Padre, un nuevo amor y ofrece el único sacrificio de acción de gracias, la Eucaristía. ¿No sanaron los diez? ¿Dónde están los otros nueve? ¿El único que ha vuelto es este extranjero? Orar es tener a alguien a quien podemos dar gracias. La gratitud es una actitud siempre necesaria.

**Misericordiae Vultus—Año de la Misericordia (Papa Francisco)**

21. En el sacramento de la Reconciliación Dios perdona los pecados, que realmente quedan cancelados; y sin embargo, la huella negativa que los pecados dejan en nuestros comportamientos y en nuestros pensamientos permanece. La misericordia de Dios es incluso más fuerte que esto. Ella se transforma en indulgencia del Padre que a través de la Esposa de Cristo alcanza al pecador perdonado y lo libera de todo residuo, consecuencia del pecado, habilitándolo a obrar con caridad, a crecer en el amor más bien que a recaer en el pecado. Vivir entonces la indulgencia en el Año Santo significa acercarse a la misericordia del Padre con la certeza que su perdón se extiende sobre toda la vida del creyente.
