Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Last week I encouraged you to read a document that our bishops publish every election year called, *"Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship."* This week I'd like to highlight some information in paragraphs 40-62 from that document, which explain some key principles of Catholic social teaching. If you were at our summer series on Catholic Social Teaching, you will remember these!

The Dignity of the Human Person: This is a foundational principle of Catholic Social Teaching. According to this principle, every single human life from conception to natural death has inherent right to life and to live in conditions worthy of human life. Catholics must oppose the direct taking of human life through acts such as abortion, assisted suicide, the death penalty (when it can be avoided) indiscriminate use of drones in warfare. Catholics must also support healthy working conditions and work done to eradicate poverty. See paragraphs 44 and 45 for more!

The Common Good: The Common Good is, "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily." The Common Good is about building a society where individuals and groups of people can flourish. We need to remember that when we vote, we are not just voting for things that help us. We are voting for conditions for everyone to flourish. When one person develops their humanity we all benefit. See paragraphs 49-51 for more!

Solidarity: The principle of solidarity is related to the Common Good. The principal of solidarity focuses our attention on the global dimension of humanity. According to the principle of solidarity, we are one human family. We bear responsibility for every person's wellbeing. This includes people who live close to us as well as people who live far away from us. According to the document, "Loving our neighbor has global dimensions and requires us to eradicate racism and address the extreme poverty and disease plaguing so much of the world. Solidarity also includes the scriptural call to welcome the stranger among us-including immigrants seeking work-by ensuring that they have opportunities for a safe home, education for their children, and a decent life for their families and by ending the practice of separating families through deportation." For more, see paragraphs 52-56 of the document.

Subsidiarity: Subsidiarity focuses our attention on the importance of local communities. The principle of subsidiarity is our Church's teaching that it is preferred that problems are solved at the most local level possible. According to this principle, higher levels of organization (like the federal government) should not intervene unnecessarily in local communities. Furthermore, higher forms of organization should not bypass smaller levels of organization to serve the needs of their citizens. In other words, higher levels of organization like the federal government or state government should empower more local levels of government to flourish.

The most local level of organization is the family. According to the document, "The family -based on marriage between a man and a woman- is the first and fundamental unit of society and is a sanctuary for the creation and nurturing of children. It should be defended and strengthened, not redefined, undermined, or further distorted. Respect for the family should be reflected in every policy and program. It is important to uphold parents' rights and responsibilities to care for their children, including the right to choose their children's education." For more on the principle of subsidiarity, please see paragraphs 46-48.

It is difficult to find candidates that completely hold to all of these principles. The important thing is that we learn these principles and understand them so that we can vote with a clear conscience whether it is to vote for a major candidate, or a minor candidate, or to even conscientiously abstain from voting in a particular race (See paragraph 36 of the document).

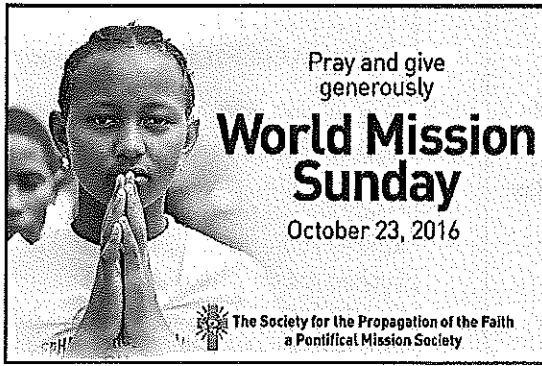

**29. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—
Lucas 18,1-8: "Dios hará justicia a sus elegidos que claman a Él."**

El Evangelio, así como la primera lectura de hoy (Éxodo 17,8-13), llaman nuestra atención sobre la eficiencia de la oración perseverante. En el Evangelio, Jesús nos enseña la necesidad de orar sin desfallecer, por medio de la parábola del juez y la viuda. Porque si ya un juez inicuo hace justicia a la viuda para que deje de importunarlo, cuánto más Dios, que es Justo, escuchará a los ruegos de sus elegidos. Me parece que estos textos nos invitan a reflexionar, un poco, sobre nuestra vida de oración. No se puede separar nuestro rezar de nuestra vida cristiana; siempre van juntos. San Agustín expresa esta relación interior entre vida de oración y vida cristiana de la siguiente manera: "Quién reza bien, vive bien". Y por el contrario se puede decir: Quien reza mal, vive mal. También Santa Teresa, explica: "Para mí siempre es lo mismo: rezar y encontrar el camino hacia Dios". Quien, por eso, no reza, no encontrará nunca el camino hacia Dios. Así entendemos, por qué muchos hermanos no viven como cristianos, no tienen una relación personal con Dios. Ellos no se esfuerzan por orar. A estos hombres, San Alfonso les dice una palabra muy dura: "Quien no reza, quien deja de rezar, no debe ser condenado, porque ya está condenado". Aún cuando no perdamos nunca la esperanza de salvación para esos hombres, sin embargo sentimos que la oración es absolutamente necesaria para un cristiano vital. ¿Qué es, pues, rezar? Rezar, simplemente dicho, es hablar personalmente con Dios, hablar de persona a persona con Él. Nuestra oración es impersonal, cuando sólo es una repetición sin reflexión, cuando sólo es un mover de los labios, cuando no hay interés interior en lo que decimos exteriormente. Rezar personalmente, por el contrario, es tener un diálogo con Dios, una intercomunicación vital entre Dios y yo. Hablo con Él, como con una querida persona; hablo sobre mis intereses personales y familiares, y también sobre los intereses de Dios. Todo lo que personalmente experimento, siento, deseo, sufro; todo se lo digo a Él. De tal manera me uno a Dios en la oración con todo mi ser, toda mi vida, toda mi alegría, todos mis problemas. Rezar, en este sentido, toma al hombre entero, sobre todo su corazón. Porque la oración verdadera se entiende también como un diálogo de corazón entre Dios y el hombre. Hay un proverbio que dice: Mejor es rezar con mucho corazón y pocas palabras, que con muchas palabras y poco corazón. Porque rezar con el corazón es signo de un amor maduro y de una vinculación profunda a Dios. Y a medida que el amor se vuelve más profundo, menos necesita de gestos y palabras para expresarse. Necesita cada vez más la tranquilidad, para mirar simplemente, para amar en silencio. Tal vez creamos que no tenemos tiempo orar. Pero no falta el tiempo sino la estimación de Dios. Porque tenemos tiempo para todo lo que nos parece importante: para el diario, para el deporte, para una fiesta, y que sé yo. No tenemos tiempo para Dios porque Él no es importante, no tiene mucho valor para nosotros. Quizás no sepamos rezar. Cuanto más sencilla y filial es nuestra oración, tanto más gusta a Dios. Dios busca al hombre simple, que habla con Él, como un niño con su padre. La perseverancia en el orar, pero conjuntamente con la humildad y la confianza, nos la muestra la viuda en el Evangelio de hoy.

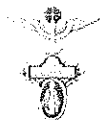
