## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

As I write this on Tuesday morning there is a lot of anxiety in the country about the election and what will happen if (candidate) gets elected. Remember that whatever happens, we are still the Church, and that means two things. First, it means that we can be at peace knowing that God is looking after each of us and equipping us to live in the world. Second, it means that no matter who wins this election we have work to do.

There is also a lot of impatience. The world has become uglier, and a lot of Catholics are frustrated by the disrespect they see among their fellow citizens. With that in mind, a friend passed along this wonderful prayer from Archbishop Oscar Romero, the courageous martyr of El Salvador and I thought I'd share it with you. I hope you like it!

It helps now and then to step back and take the long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection, no pastoral visit brings wholeness.

No program accomplishes the Church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.

We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities.

We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well.

It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders, ministers, not Messiah's. We are prophets of a future not our own.

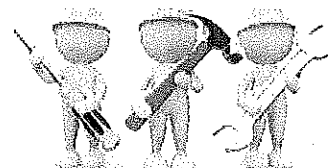

**33. Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo C—  
Lucas 21, 5-19: "Con su perseverancia, salvarán sus almas."**

¿Cree usted que la gente de nuestro tiempo es constante en lo que comienza y en lo que vive?. La verdad es que la vida y sus acontecimientos van tan rápidos que en muchas ocasiones ni tan siquiera tenemos tiempo de mantenernos en la constancia de un ideal. Jesús toca hoy este tema de la perseverancia dentro del contexto de su segunda venida al final de los tiempos. Algunos estaban hablando de la belleza de las piedras del templo y de los adornos que este poseía. Jesús les dice que toda esa belleza quedará destruida algún día. La gente extrañada le pregunta sobre el tema y el Señor les ofrece algunas claves para interpretar el momento: - **"No se dejen engañar"**. Hay muchas distracciones en la vida. Tantas que nos hacen olvidarnos de cosas importantes. Creen que nos ofrecen respuestas a la vida y lo único que hacen es crearnos más interrogantes interiores. - **"Vendrán muchos haciéndose pasar por mí..."** Hay líderes humanos que ofrecen nuevos caminos y proyectos pero sólo Jesús nos ofrece un proyecto duradero y eterno. Tenemos que estar alertas para saber cuál es la hondura y la trascendencia de los mensajes que nos ofrecen. - **"Cuando oigan alarmas de guerra y revoluciones, no se asusten..."** Cualquiera puede decir que este tiempo final es hoy... La verdad es que por desgracia la humanidad siempre ha estado en ese estado de violencia. Algunos creen ver en todos estos signos el final del tiempo presente... Jesús nos dice que no nos asustemos... - **"Habrá grandes terremotos, hambres y enfermedades..."** La descripción que nos hace el Señor es para echarnos a temblar y desear, la paz eterna. - **"Les echaran manos y les perseguirán..."** Incluso ya no es catastrófico lo que sucede a nuestro alrededor, es que también nuestra vida física corre peligro... - **"Así tendrán oportunidad de dar testimonio de mí."** Entre las ruinas de la vida y del mundo humano, también desde la amenaza constante de la propia vida podemos dar testimonio de nuestro Salvador. - **"Serán traicionados incluso por sus padres, hermanos, parientes y amigos.** Matarán a algunos de ustedes, y todo el mundo les odiará por causa mía; pero no se perderá nin un cabello de su cabeza." No es el mundo en el que vivo quien puede hacer tambalear mi fe. También las personas, más cercanas que me rodean, pueden ser para mí motivo y excusa para el alejamiento de Dios. - **"Permanezcan firmes, y salvarán su vida."** Todas las cosas y las circunstancias de la vida no pueden alejarnos de la presencia de Dios. Jesús da la respuesta a todos estos interrogantes de las personas de todas las épocas y nos alerta para que cuando perdamos todas las seguridades exteriores y cercanas, Él siga estando en lo profundo de nuestra vida. No podemos hacer oídos sordos, y mucho menos desentendernos a la hora de buscar soluciones para los graves problemas que sufre la humanidad. Vivir haciendo que la Palabra se cumpla, dejar que Dios camine entre nosotros y mantenernos en el Señor por muy fuertes que sean los tiempos es el reto que tenemos ante nosotros. Necesitamos la perseverancia para que nuestro mundo no se quede huérfano de la presencia del buen Dios. Si te cansas y abandonas el mundo, la humanidad no será mejor, ni tú tampoco...

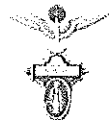
