Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

This election cycle was brutal and I'm happy it's over. Now we can move on. As a pastor, there is never an ideal time to talk about political issues, but now that the election has just occurred I'm hoping people will be open to learning a different way to see elections in light of the Gospel.

First of all, Donald Trump being elected is going to make some people's lives more difficult, and every single Catholic should be sad about this. President Trump might also make some people's lives better, and that's good. But those expecting Donald Trump to usher in a new era of peace and tranquility are going to be sorely disappointed, just as Clinton supporters would be if the tables were turned.

One of the dominant themes in the Gospel is the inability of the law to save souls. Salvation, of course, involves the renewal of the human person. It is an experience of peace within a person that comes from possessing love for the True God and love for our neighbors. Laws are important, but the law cannot force anybody to love God or others. The peace that comes from loving God and loving others is something we receive as a gift through faith.

Two awful sins that people commit during election seasons are idolatry and despair. I saw a lot of idolatry leading up to election day among supporters of Clinton and Trump. Many supporters acted as though these politicians were capable of saving the country, and turned away from God and the Church. It's no shock that Mass attendance dropped a bit. Similarly, many people on both sides committed a sin of despair, demonizing the other person and proclaiming doom for the entire human race if they were elected. Both are sins, and both actually disturb our peace and remove our love for God and others.

Peace does not come through the law. Repeat that again and again until you get it right. Peace does not come through the law. Peace is an experience within the human person. Without this, people who are celebrating a Trump victory will eventually go back to being fearful and anxious of the future, and the same exact thing would be said of Clinton supporters if they were the ones celebrating.

The peace that we receive through faith in Christ endures bad leaders. Just look at the early Christians who remained faithful in the face of persecution from Roman Emperors, or the Christians in our own time who experience interior peace amidst persecution. The peace we seek through political parties is short lived. Every two to four years we repeat the cycle of idolatry and despair, of unwarranted optimism and fear. There is no end, and it is crazy to expect it will end.

We have a decision to make. We can keep idolizing politicians and living in that cycle, or we can live the teachings of Jesus Christ and be freed from that. Living the teachings of Jesus is a good life. It really does bring peace and joy no matter who the president is. Furthermore, it does more to build up a just society than our politicians are able to by making laws.

We can start right now. If you're celebrating the victory of Trump, be careful it doesn't become idolatry. Start celebrating the victory of Christ instead. If you are still grieving the loss of Clinton, stop that and also start celebrating the victory of Christ. This brings us into communion with Jesus, and communion with Jesus is the only place I know of where true, lasting peace is found.

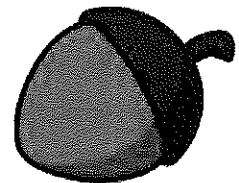
Daily Rosary

Solemnidad de Jesucristo, Rey del Universo

Lucas 23, 35-43: "Señor, acuérdate de mí, cuando llegues a tu reino".

La fiesta de Cristo Rey, corona el año litúrgico como corona toda la historia universal. Nuestra fe, reconoce a Cristo como el rey divino que instaura en el mundo la paz y la reconciliación por medio del servicio de amor a los hermanos. El Evangelio de este Domingo comienza con burlas. Todos: tanto los jefes de los judíos, como los soldados romanos se ríen de Jesús. Para ellos, ese rey sin vestido de seda, colgado de la cruz, sin palacio, sin sirvientes, sin soldados, es... una caricatura. Según su parecer, Jesús merece la inscripción irónica que hay sobre su cabeza: Jesús Nazareno Rey de los Judíos. El famoso INRI que aparece en muchos crucifijos. Y Jesús...no obligó, ni obliga a nadie a creerle o seguirlo. Quien no quiso creer, podía seguir mirándolo como el hijo del carpintero, o burlándose de él. Jesús no obliga a creer en él, pero tampoco se desvía de su camino por las ironías de la gente. Jesús con su ejemplo, nos enseña a nosotros, que queremos ser sus discípulos, que es frecuente que cuando tratamos de tomar en serio la fé, nos encontremos con los que se sonríen diciéndonos: qué tontería; con los que lo quieren ridiculizar. Y tal vez, esas cosas a nosotros, nos hacen flaquear, pero el Señor nos enseña que tenemos que seguir en nuestro camino hasta las últimas consecuencias. Y en este evangelio hay un episodio que es un mensaje real de esperanza para todos nosotros. Durante su vida pública, Jesús evitó el que lo llamaran rey y huyó de la gente para no serlo. Sin embargo desde la cruz, cuando uno de los ladrones le dice: Acuérdate de mí cuando llegues a tu reino; el Señor no niega su reino, y le contesta: Hoy mismo estarás conmigo en el paraíso. Este ladrón, había comprendido que Jesús vino como Rey para salvar a los demás, y por eso estaba clavado en la cruz. El trono de nuestro Señor fue la cruz, y su corona una corona de espinas. El Reino de los cielos no es de este mundo, porque se maneja con valores que nos son apreciados por nuestra sociedad. Pero es de este mundo en la medida que ya está entre nosotros y tenemos el compromiso de vivir su justicia para hacer realidad el mensaje liberador de Jesús. El Señor reina sobre la cruz y desde la cruz; allí encuentra su supremo vínculo de unidad toda la humanidad. Los reyes de este mundo pasan inevitablemente al olvido, pero el reinado de Jesús no pasa ni puede pasar. Penetramos a través de la cruz y de la resurrección del Señor en el misterio de Dios. Esta fiesta de hoy, fue especialmente instituida, para mostrar a Jesús como el único soberano ante una sociedad que parece querer vivir de espaldas a Dios. Cristo vino a establecer su reinado, no con la fuerza de un conquistador, sino con la bondad y mansedumbre del pastor. Con este espíritu buscó Jesús a los hombres dispersos, a los hombres alejados de Dios por el pecado. Jesús, curó, Jesús sanó sus heridas. Jesús los amó y nos amó, dando por nosotros la vida. Y Cristo como Rey viene para revelar el amor de Dios. Por eso quienes queremos seguir a Jesús, debemos ser fermento y signo de salvación, para construir un mundo más justo, más fraterno, más solidario. Para construir un mundo inspirado en los valores evangélicos de la esperanza, de la Vida verdadera a la que todos fuimos llamados. Así es el Reino de Cristo, y cada uno estamos llamados a trabajar por él, para extenderlo. Tenemos que hacer presente a Cristo en nuestro mundo. Tenemos que poner al Señor de cara a quienes los tienen contra la pared o en un rincón de su alma. Tenemos la misión de afirmar, con nuestras palabras y con nuestras obras, que aspiramos a hacer de Cristo un auténtico Rey de todos los corazones.

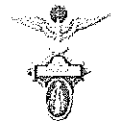
