## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

I am very excited for the various faith formation opportunities that will be offered in our parishes in the coming weeks. In fact, for the first time in a while, we will actually be offering classes for adults in all of our parishes. The times these classes are offered will vary, as well as the actual programs that are offered. Even if you don't regularly attend the parish the class is held at, you are welcome to attend any of these courses. I'd love to get everyone involved, so please prayerfully consider attending one of these classes.

**St. Mary's, Castle Rock:** Beginning January 9<sup>th</sup> at 1pm, we will begin to offer *Catholicism: The Pivotal Players*. Many of you have seen Bishop Robert Barron's *Catholicism* series. Well, this is the latest installment, and if you liked *Catholicism* I know that you'll enjoy this series as well. *The Pivotal Players* focuses on the lives of some very influential Catholics. Over the course of 13 sessions, we will study the lives of St. Francis of Assisi, St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Catherine of Sienna, Blessed John Henry Newman, G.K. Chesterton, and Michelangelo.

This class will ordinarily be offered on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of the Month. We have decided on 1pm in order to accommodate people who can't drive at night. As stated above, this is open to anybody, including those of you who might not attend Mass in Castle Rock Regularly. Let Joe know if you'd like to purchase the guide.

**St. Catherine, Cathlamet:** Beginning on the evening of January 7<sup>th</sup>, right after Mass in Cathlamet ends, we will also offer *Catholicism: The Pivotal Players* although since it is in the evening, we will offer a meal either in the form of a potluck or a meal that can be easily prepared for a group. We will usually offer the series after Mass on the first and third Saturdays of the Month. If you are interested in attending, please contact Deacon Fred Johnson directly or email him at [deaconfred@strose-longview.org](mailto:deaconfred@strose-longview.org). You can also call and leave a message for him at St. Rose at 360-425-4660.

**St. Rose, Longview:** We will continue our Sunday night Bible Study at St. Rose beginning January 15<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. This session we will offer *Follow Me: Meeting Jesus in the Gospel of John*. The Gospel of John stands out among the other Gospels because of its rich, poetic language. It can be a bit difficult to interpret from time to time, but the content is incredibly rich and will deepen your faith. Please contact Joe Buttle at 423-3650 or [paff@cni.net](mailto:paff@cni.net). As is the case with some of our other studies, there is a study guide you can purchase to help you learn the material. We are excited about this and would love it if you could attend.

**Immaculate Heart, Kelso:** Kelso will once again host *The Alpha Course*. *The Alpha Course* is not a systematic study of theology, but an opportunity to reflect on some of the deeper questions about life and how faith can play a role. We offered *The Alpha Course* for the first time earlier this fall, and it was very successful, so we are excited to do this again. If you know anybody who has talked about coming to Church but can't quite pull the trigger and go, Alpha is for them.

The next session will begin on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, at 6pm in the parish hall at Immaculate heart. We begin with a meal, and then we watch a brief video presentation and have a brief discussion about the content of the video. It is a great way to get to know other parishioners and to reintroduce friends to the parish who have drifted away from parish life.

I hope you will take advantage of at least one of these opportunities this year. The more we know our faith, the better we can live our faith. I hope to see you soon!

## Solemnidad de la Epifanía del Señor. Ciclo A

### Mateo 2, 1-12: "Epifanía: Jesús se manifiesta al mundo".

Epifanía quiere decir manifestación. En la solemnidad de hoy, la Iglesia conmemora la primera manifestación del Hijo de Dios hecho Hombre al mundo pagano, que tuvo lugar con la adoración de los Magos. La fiesta proclama el alcance universal de la misión de Cristo, que viene al mundo para cumplir las promesas hechas a Israel y llevar a cabo la salvación de todos los hombres. La fiesta de Epifanía nació en los primeros siglos del Cristianismo. En el evangelio de hoy, se relata que llegaron estos magos a Jerusalén; tal vez pensaban que aquel era el término de su viaje, pero allí, en la gran ciudad, no encuentran al recién nacido rey de los judíos. Quizá, - parece humanamente lo más lógico si se trata de buscar a un rey,- fueron directamente al palacio de Herodes; pero los caminos de los hombres no son, frecuentemente, los caminos de Dios. Indagan, ponen los medios a su alcance: ¿Dónde está?, preguntan. Y Dios, cuando de verdad se lo quiere encontrar, sale al paso, nos señala la ruta, incluso a través de los medios que podrían parecer menos aptos. ¿Dónde está el recién nacido rey de los judíos? Y nosotros, que como los Magos nos hemos puesto en camino muchas veces en busca del Señor, nos damos cuenta que Jesús no puede estar en la soberbia que nos separa de Dios, ni en la falta de caridad que nos aísla. Debemos encontrar las verdaderas señales que llevan hasta el Niño-Dios. En estos Magos llamados a adorar a Jesús, nos reconocemos a nosotros mismos, que nos encaminamos a Cristo a través de nuestros quehaceres familiares, sociales y de nuestro trabajo, de la fidelidad de lo pequeño de cada día. San Buenaventura nos dice sobre este pasaje que la estrella que nos guía es triple: la Sagrada Escritura, especialmente el Evangelio, que debemos conocer bien. Una estrella que está siempre arriba para que la miremos y encontremos la justa dirección, que es María, nuestra Madre. Y una estrella interior, personal, que son las gracias del Espíritu Santo. Con estas ayudas encontraremos en todo momento el camino que conduce a Belén, hasta Jesús. Así como en Belén, Dios se dejó encontrar por los magos, así también quiere que nosotros lo encontremos y le entreguemos nuestros dones. El Señor no necesita de lo que podamos darle, es que nosotros, para encontrarlo, necesitamos poner a sus pies cuanto somos y cuanto de valor tenemos. No es el día de Reyes, una fiesta para pedir o esperar regalos de nuestro Dios y de nuestros seres queridos; debería ser un día para ejercitarnos en la entrega de lo que somos y de cuanto tenemos a Dios, en primer lugar, y a todos los nuestros; la única forma auténtica de adorar a nuestro Dios es convertirse en su benefactor: a quien sea generoso, Dios le permite hoy convertirse en su rey mago. Como escribe un sacerdote, hoy es la fiesta del regalo, sobre todo, del regalo de la fe que nos trae Jesús, el principal de los regalos, que no es otro que regalarnos su Amor, su Paz, su propia vida divina. Jesús nos acoge como humanos para llevarnos a Dios y abrirnos su Corazón de Padre. ¡Maravilloso regalo! Lo demás, lo que nosotros le podamos ofrecer a Dios es nada en comparación con lo que Él nos da, pero aun así, Jesús acoge el pobre regalo de nuestra humilde fe y de nuestro sencillo amor. Y todo de forma gratuita e incondicional. El regalo de la fe que hemos recibido del Señor, por medio del cual Él se nos manifiesta como a los Magos, es un tesoro que no podemos ni malgastar ni dejarlo improductivo. Además de agradecerlo, de manera permanente, hemos de hacerlo producir con muchos frutos de santidad personal, en medio de la vida ordinaria, gastándonos y desgastándonos, como San Pablo, por Dios y por la Iglesia. Pidamos a María que busquemos siempre a su Hijo, como lo hicieron los Magos venidos de Oriente, y no reparemos en las dificultades ni en los sacrificios que debamos hacer hasta encontrarlo. Gracias, Reyes Magos; porque Dios sigue hablando en millones de corazones, de pueblos y ciudades, de países y de continentes siguen fijándose en los destellos de la estrella que es la Fe.
