Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners:

Well, this is finally it. The end of my series ranking every U2 album from worst to first. For those just getting on board, the order so far is *Pop*, *Zooropa*, *No Line on the Horizon*, *Songs of Innocence*, *October*, *All that you Can't Leave Behind*, *War*, *Boy*, *Rattle and Hum*, *The Unforgettable Fire*, *How to Dismantle an Atomic Bomb*. Here are the final two:

2 – *Achtung Baby* – This album is loaded with classics you've likely heard, such as *Even Better than the Real Thing*, *Mysterious Ways* and *One*. What separates this album from the previous albums are a lot of the non-classics. They contain some of the most interesting and creative songs the band has produced.

Case in point, consider *Until the End of the World*. This song is Judas' interior monologue after he betrayed Jesus. It really brings out Judas' arrogance. Look at these: "Last time we met it was a low-lit room/ We were as close together as a bride and groom/ We ate the food, we drank the wine/ Everybody having a good time except you/ You were talking about the end of the world." It continues: "In the garden I was playing the tart / I kissed your lips and broke your heart/ You, you were acting like it was the end of the world."

There are too many tracks on this album that are a must hear. One of my favorites is *The Fly*, and my favorite version is on the *Live From Boston*. In fact, this is the version that got me into the song. Vocally, it is arranged differently than the album version and I actually like the Boston version a lot more. Another great track I love on this album is *Ultra Violet*. A great version to look up is "Live at the Rose Bowl." I was actually at this concert and this song was probably the best moment of the show for me. Even the microphone they used was amazing!

1 – *The Joshua Tree* – I mean, come on. Was there ever any doubt? The Joshua Tree is not just the best U2 album. It makes a case to be the best Rock album ever. Before I was a fan of U2 I knew this album was incredible. It features some of their most famous recognizable songs they've ever produced. *Where the Streets Have No Name*, *I Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For* and *With or Without You* are almost universally recognized for being amazing, and those are just the first three tracks on the Album.

But you know what? The rest of the Album is even better than these more famous tracks. You literally cannot go wrong on this Album. *Bullet the Blue Sky* is one of their best songs to hear live. *Running To Stand Still* has some of their best and haunting lyrics, which was about a couple struggling with Heroin addiction. If there are a few songs I've never heard live that I'd most want to hear, they would be *One Tree Hill*, *Red Hill Mining Town*, and *In God's Country* all from this album.

Lucky for me, U2 is celebrating the 30th Anniversary of *The Joshua Tree* and they are going on tour to mark the occasion. The band has pledged to play every single song from the album at every single show! I got my tickets, and now that I'm sure I've made you all fans, I'll see you all at Century Link field in Seattle on Mother's day!

Finally, thank you all for indulging me on this. I know a lot of you did not care about this at all, but I had fun writing it and I've even heard from a few of you who enjoyed reading it.

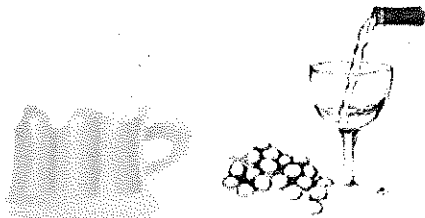

Quinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario — Ciclo A
Mateo 5, 13-16: "Ustedes son la luz del mundo".

Hay cristianos que viven instalados en el miedo. Tienen miedo al mundo porque les puede apartar de Dios, olvidándose que Dios está en el mundo y que se hizo uno de nosotros para permanecer con nosotros. Tienen miedo a predicar porque les pueden llevar la contraria y quedarse sin argumentos... Miedo a no desviarse de la doctrina establecida por temor a la condenación eterna... Se olvidan estos hermanos que el único miedo que tiene que tener el seguidor de Jesús es el no reconocer la libertad que Cristo nos ha dado. Tanta libertad nos ha dado Dios que podemos mirarle cara a cara y ser capaces de rectificar nuestros pecados y errores. La Palabra de hoy nos recuerda que tenemos que ser sal y luz para este mundo. La sal es algo físico, material, visible. La sal del cristiano son sus obras. La sal de Cristo es el amor incondicional a los seres humanos. Cada creyente debe de hacer obras dignas de la fe en Cristo. Las obras del cristiano son como una prolongación amorosa del amor que Dios nos tiene. La primera tarea del cristiano está en percibirse y quererse tal y como el Señor nos quiere. He visto muchos cristianos que toda su vida fue un entregarse olvidándose incluso de cuidar su vida de relación con Dios y con los demás. Su final siempre fue triste. Desilusionados, solos y desconsolados algunos llegaron incluso a abandonar la fe. Tenemos que empezar a ser sal para nosotros mismos a la vez de para los demás. Jesús nos da una gran responsabilidad. Somos la sal del mundo. Esto significa que el mundo existe pero en muchos casos no tiene sabor. La vida se ha vuelto para muchos invivible. Nuestra misión es mantener encendida la vela de la fe en un mundo tecnificado en sus aparentes adelantos. El mundo es la gente que sufre. Somos también la luz de este mundo. La luz es algo inmaterial, invisible. La luz es lo que nos hace ver pero ella en sí misma es invisible. La luz es la fe. La fe no es algo que debamos de tener escondida para evitar su pérdida o deterioro. La luz cuanto más se reparte más grande se hace. Vemos a nuestro alrededor personas que dicen que no saben qué hacer en la vida, que no saben cómo dirigir su vida. La fe es siempre una invitación a mirar hacia adelante, a progresar en el camino de la vida y de la unión con Cristo. Tenemos luz en la medida que aceptemos la Luz. Los cristianos siempre estaremos entre estos dos equilibrios de la fe y de las obras. Sólo Cristo es quien salva, pero esa salvación necesita ser anunciada y vivida. El Evangelio nos dice que esa luz de la fe cuando brilla delante de la gente se convierte en alabanza al Padre. Tenemos que hacer obras de fe. El mundo de hoy está cansado de las grandes palabras y de las teorías que se le ofrecen. Parece como si las personas no tuviesen oídos para lo trascendente. Es como si toda la vida se redujese al resultado de lo que queremos. Hemos perdido el aliento de la ilusión y la esperanza. Ser sal y luz es recordarle a las personas una y otra vez el proyecto que Dios tiene para la humanidad. Dios no quiere más sufrimientos porque Jesús tomó sobre sí todos nuestros dolores. No quiere más violencia porque Él asumió nuestros castigos. No desea nuestra desorientación porque con su vida nos enseñó el camino hacia el Padre. Sal y luz es darnos cuenta de todo ello y vivirlo con alegría. Jesús nos señala el cielo como el lugar de Dios, y es verdad. El cielo es Dios. Cada persona puede tener el cielo más cerca, en su corazón, en su latir espiritual, en su entrega diaria. Hay un espacio que sólo nosotros podemos abrir a Dios y a los demás. Es el terreno de nuestro corazón y de nuestra vida. Si me cierro a Cristo, si bloqueo mis entrañas, no entenderé nunca ese amor que me ama aunque yo le ignore. Ser sal y luz es tomar conciencia de ese amor. La sal cuando se disuelve se vuelve invisible pero su sabor perdura. La luz se va haciendo más grande cuando se va compartiendo. La mecha encendida de una vela sería el amor de Dios, el origen de la luz. La tarea de los cristianos es seguir pasando esa luz a los seres humanos de nuestro tiempo y de todos los tiempos. *¿Serás capaz de ser sal y luz para los otros?*
