Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

For the last several years, Claudia Alvarez has served our parishes as a staff member. She is our parish secretary and directs our children's faith formation programs, including Vacation Bible School and sacramental preparation for first reconciliation and first communion. The Pastoral Assistant for Children's Faith Formation is responsible for directing religious education and sacramental preparation programs for our students from Kindergarten to 5th grade. This position also requires a bilingual candidate. It is going to be a 15-20 hour a week position and will not include benefits.

3º Domingo de Cuaresma - Ciclo A

Jn 4, 5-42: "Un surtidor de agua que salta hasta la vida eterna."

Cuando una persona se encuentra mal, triste, sin ilusión, sin ganas de vivir, dice que está "seca por dentro..." El Evangelio de hoy nos convoca a descubrir una escena entre Jesús y una samaritana, que trata de responder a esa sequedad interna de muchas personas de nuestro tiempo. Los samaritanos eran judíos mestizos, tanto en su sangre como en la religión. Habían mezclado su sangre elegida con sangre pagana. Adoraban a Dios no en Jerusalén sino en el monte Garizim, cerca de Siquén. Tanto era la lejanía afectiva y relacional de los judíos contra los samaritanos que los primeros cuando deseaban insultar a alguien le decían: "Eres un samaritano..." El propio Jesús encargó a sus discípulos que "no entren en ninguna ciudad de los samaritanos." (Mt 10,5). ¿Quiénes son estos "samaritanos"? Todavía queda una pequeña porción de esta comunidad étnica y religiosa. Viven en Nablus (Cisjordania) y en zonas de Holon, cerca de Tel Aviv en Israel. Actualmente son unas 500 personas. Tanto los samaritanos del tiempo de Jesús como los de hoy proceden del reino del norte que fue destruido entre los años 722-721 antes de Cristo. A la caída de este reino los israelitas residentes se mezclaron con los colonos asirios, de esta manera los judíos mezclan su sangre y sus costumbres religiosas con los asirios logrando que sus hermanos del pueblo elegido les despreciaran profundamente. Todos estos acontecimientos llevan a un proceso de sincretismo religioso y cultural. Es como si al mezclar sus costumbres y la pureza de su religión se hicieran despreciables para Dios y sus seguidores. Pasaron de ser miembros del pueblo elegido a miembros odiados y despreciados de los elegidos por Dios. La mujer samaritana ve a Jesús como un pobre judío que le pide de beber; pero Jesús le habla sobre sí mismo, sobre quién es. El encuentro de las personas con Dios se establece muchas veces por cuestiones accidentales o no propiamente religiosas. Las conversiones se dan en las calles, en los hogares, en los hospitales... Cuando vamos al templo lo que hacemos es ponernos ante Dios que nos ha cautivado. ¿Pueden existir conversiones dentro de un templo? Por supuesto, pero no es el único lugar donde se puede dar el encuentro con Jesús. El cristiano está llamado que cada espacio en el que se mueve esté muy cerca de Dios para que al menor intento la persona pueda percibirlo en la hondura del corazón. "Si supieras lo que Dios da y quién es el que te está pidiendo agua, tú le pedirías a él, y él te daría agua viva." Puede que muchos hermanos en la fe se olviden de este magnífico texto de gran hondura espiritual. Muchas veces nos han educado para que nos ofrecamos a Dios, para llevarle las manos llenas de frutos a Dios. La verdad es bien distinta. La vida cristiana tiene que ser una continua acción de gracias al Padre porque hemos descubierto "lo que Dios da... y su agua viva". La cosa no está en intentar hacer méritos ante Dios. El tema es que después de descubierto al Señor en nuestra vida no podemos hacer otra cosa que vivir para Él. La conversación de Jesús con la mujer se centra en estos puntos: el agua, el marido, el lugar de culto y el Mesías. Jesús se acerca a la realidad de aquella mujer y por extensión a la del pueblo de Israel. Dios no está en las nubes ni escondido. Dios está en la realidad diaria, en las posibilidades de encuentro que nos ofrece la jornada que vivimos. El agua que lleva a la eternidad. Hoy se predica poco sobre la eternidad. Es como si lo que de verdad merece la pena de atenderse es siempre lo efímero, lo pasajero. Pero el Evangelio es una invitación a la eternidad de Dios. La eternidad no está de moda, pero la eternidad es el tiempo de Dios. Muchas de las angustias de las personas de nuestro tiempo se dan por la falta de tiempo, por el no llegar a todo lo que hay que hacer. Dios se sitúa en la eternidad, fuera del tiempo, para que nos demos cuenta que nuestra vida y relación con Él es para siempre. Dios no tiene nunca prisas con nosotros... Te invito a que el sagrario, la Eucaristía y la Palabra no estén solo en los muros de tu Iglesia, sino que tengan sede en tu corazón. Quien quiera encontrar a Dios, lo encontrará en Jesucristo.
