## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

I'd like to spend a little time this week to promote Catholic education in general and St. Rose School in Longview in particular. I am a supporter of Catholic Schools. I am proud to be an alumnus of Assumption School in Bellingham. Catholic School kept God in the forefront of my mind as a child and it was in this school where I felt called to the priesthood.

Aside from daily prayer and religion classes, our students at St. Rose attend Mass once a week on Thursdays at 10:50. I have appreciated the reverence our students show during the Mass. After Mass, some classes even talk about what they heard at Mass and do further reflection on the readings and homily.

Aside from the opportunity we have to pass faith onto our children through this ministry, we also have an opportunity to help our students succeed academically. Our students have a great track record of doing well in the High School and College Classrooms. In their English classes, for example, our Middle school students read books that they will study in high school. When they read *Lord of the Flies* in High School, for example, they will be reading it the second time and deepening their insights.

We have recently changed our tuition rates at St. Rose. One big change will be for our preschool students. Our preschool will offer a two-day rate of \$120 per month, a three-day rate of \$160 per month, and a five-day rate of \$300 per month. Our preschool is not merely a glorified day care. Our preschool is academic and our students are here to learn so that they can get a great start in Kindergarten.

This year in the Elementary and Middle School, our tuition rate started at just under \$6,500 per year. We have reduced that to \$5950 for next year, to try and be competitive with other private schools in our area. However, we also know that in order for St. Rose School to thrive, we need thriving Catholic parishes. For this reason, if families visibly participate in the life of **any of the parishes** in our region and help make them vibrant we reward them with a grant. Next year, the tuition rate after receiving this grant is \$4,750 per year.

But that's not all. One improvement we wanted to make this year was to make our school more accessible to large families. A lot of families in our area can afford tuition for two students, but not three. So, this year we are offering a significant reduction in what we charge for a third child. A family with three children will get a 10% discount for their second child and a 50% discount for any other children they send to St. Rose.

But that's still not all! There are also many opportunities for financial aid and scholarships. We have our own scholarship fund at St. Rose, and the Archdiocese also provides scholarships through a wonderful group called the Fulcrum Foundation. The fulcrum foundation has provided many scholarships to many of our students throughout the years and we are very grateful for their support.

We are beginning our registration for the 2017-2018 School year. Our principal, Cathy Strader, and I would love to welcome your family to the school and give you a tour of our amazing (and safe) facilities. Please call our school at (360)577-6760. We can't wait to see you!

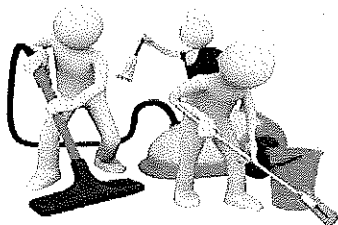

**5º Domingo de Cuaresma - Ciclo A**  
**Juan 11, 1-45: "Yo soy la resurrección y la vida."**

Las lecturas de este domingo nos invitan a mirar la muerte cara a cara. Pienso que todos hemos tenido que llorar la muerte de un pariente o amigo. Probablemente habrá pocos entre nosotros que no hayan visto a un muerto, que no hayan rezado al lecho de un difunto. Al morir alguna persona amada, quizás sentimos la tentación de pedirle a Dios que le devuelva la vida. Pero si seguimos pensando en esto, nos daremos cuenta de que esta petición es hecha un poco a ciegas. No se trata de hacer que nuestros muertos vuelvan a esta vida terrenal. La resurrección de Lázaro no es la resurrección que se nos ha prometido a todos. No es una resurrección satisfactoria, ya que no es definitiva y en nada cambia la condición humana. Lázaro salió vivo de su sepulcro, pero tuvo que volver a él tarde o temprano. El milagro es un signo. Cristo no ha hecho este milagro para trastornar las leyes naturales y suprimir en este mundo la muerte. El milagro es un signo, una manera de enseñar, la revelación de una verdad duradera con ocasión de un hecho pasajero. El que se aferra a un prodigio como tal, cierra los ojos ante su significado. El que quiere forzar un milagro, se interesa en sí mismo, pero no en Dios. Por medio de la resurrección de Lázaro, Cristo quiere enseñarnos que Él es el Señor, el Dueño de la vida, y que cuantos se ponen en sus manos, vivirán. Marta cree en la resurrección universal, pero ignora que la Resurrección está a su lado. Ésta es la gran revelación cristiana: "Yo soy la resurrección y la vida: el que cree en mí, aunque haya muerto, vivirá". De este modo, Jesús enseña la existencia de otra vida, de la que Él mismo es el origen y la clave. Nos dice que Él mismo tiene poder sobre la vida y la muerte, y que para los que creen en Él la muerte es como un sueño - despertar es resucitar para la verdadera vida. En la primera lectura, Ezequiel habla del poder del Espíritu Santo para devolver la vida a lo que estaba muerto. Y el mismo Espíritu vivificante es el que resucita a Jesús de entre los muertos. Y con Cristo resucita a todos los que creen en Él. El cristiano es un hombre que ha recibido el Espíritu y con Él la vida, enseña San Pablo en la segunda lectura. Este Espíritu de Dios dará la nueva vida también a nuestros cuerpos y hará desaparecer nuestro natural temor a la muerte. La muerte del hombre es un nacimiento. Existe una ley natural: el hombre debe morir. Pero hay también una ley sobrenatural que no contradice a la natural, sino que la complementa: la muerte del hombre es un nacimiento. "Si el grano de trigo que cae en la tierra, no muere, queda solo, pero si muere produce mucho fruto" (Jn 12,24). Por eso, pensando en nuestros muertos, todos sabemos que no están muertos de verdad: sabemos que sus almas viven, piensan, aman y nos ven; sabemos, además, que sus cuerpos volverán a vivir, transformados, algún día. Pero, sobre todo, sabemos que existe un Dios que resucita a los muertos, un Dios que ha vencido a la muerte. Es un Dios que, en cada misa, en cada una de nuestras comuniones, introduce en nuestros cuerpos una levadura de inmortalidad. Queridos hermanos, la resurrección de Lázaro es como un anticipo de la Resurrección de Jesucristo en Pascua. Ojalá sea también anticipo de nuestra propia resurrección, al final de nuestra vida: la culminación de una vida auténticamente cristiana, una vida que nos ha preparado y madurado para ese momento tan decisivo... Que la Virgen María, nos acompañe y fortalezca en nuestro caminar hacia la victoria final.
