## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Here are a few things going on in the County that we would like you to know about.

**St. John's Hospital needs your help!** One very important ministry within the Church is bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. St. John's, our local hospital, is in need of people to visit patient's rooms and bring them Communion. If you have one or two hours available during the week and can commit to a particular time with relative consistency, this would be a great way for you to serve.

I spent time doing this all throughout seminary and always found it to very worthwhile. Bringing Communion to the sick is, in my opinion, still one of the most important things I do as a priest. Doing so strengthens my faith. This is also an incredibly important opportunity for our Church to encounter people who have been away from the Church. I have seen people return to the Church after being visited by a volunteer from our parish.

If you would like to offer your time in this important ministry or if you would like more information, please contact Colette Wolfe, hospital chaplain, at 360-414-7575. Please prayerfully consider this, and ask God to bless our hospital with more volunteers!

**In the vestibule/narthex of some of our parishes** we have racks and tables where we put information about the Catholic faith. Unfortunately, we have had some people begin to put their own materials in those locations. This is not ok, and I'm asking you not to do this anymore. It is important that the pastor controls the message coming out of the parish, and when people put various materials out without asking, it causes problems.

This does not mean that everything that people have put in these areas is bad. In fact, some of the materials are quite good. But, even if they are good, it is not appropriate. If you have materials you'd like to see offered or distributed in these areas, please ask permission first. Note that if anything is unnecessarily critical of Church leaders, contains doctrine or morals contrary to the Catholic faith, or is weird in any way I will not approve them. Even if the materials are good, I ask that you get my permission before you distribute them.

**When I was in seminary, Gonzaga basketball got me through each year.** I watched a lot of games, and even attended a game or two when the Zags played Loyola Marymount. Needless to say, I was thrilled when the Zags reached the Final Four and the eventual national championship game. I caught a few minutes of the South Carolina game, but missed most of the second half because I had Mass. I didn't catch a single moment of the National Championship because I was teaching RCIA.

Several years ago I said to myself that if the Zags were ever in the National Championship game or a Final Four I would frantically find coverage for my Masses and cancel everything on my schedule so I could watch with my friends. Instead, I chose not to. I thought about cancelling RCIA for about two seconds before I decided to commit to teaching, and I can't tell you how free I felt in doing so. Putting God first really does pay off.

Immaculate Heart of Mary hosted FISH March 15 - 17, serving 59 families, including 118 adults and 61 kids, for a total of 179 people. The majority of the people who came were households of only one or two people, with several of those homeless, but they had the ability to cook; most were probably "couch surfing" with friends or family.

One woman took the bus for a total of three hours from Longview to reach us; unfortunately it was one of our very rainy days. One of our parishioners donated several small blankets for babies, toddlers, or preschool age kids. They were a big hit - one little girl was very excited to choose "her own" blanket! We discovered that chicken livers are very desirable! We had eleven containers of them that came frozen from Safeway. Knowing that not everyone likes liver, we put the containers out on our "miscellaneous" table so people could choose one if they desired. All of the containers were snapped up before the end of our first morning of serving families. As Cory said, people's eyes either lit up in pleasure or their face showed significant dislike as they grimaced!

We will next serve FISH in June so we will have more time to refill our pantry shelves. We need more canned fruit (15-16 oz. cans are best), tuna, peanut butter (15-16 oz. jars are best), pork n' beans, soups, stews, chili, and Top Ramen. We give one can of fruit per person so we go through a lot of fruit, e.g., 179 cans this month.

Many thanks to our volunteers for setting up tables; gathering food items from the CAP Warehouse, Winco and Outlet Grocery; and distributing food on three days: Jacob Bauer, George Brajcich, Joe Brunelle, John Coleman, Pete Foley, Phyllis Heuett, Tom Laird, Mike Marum, Chuck Marshall, Cory Mugaas, Darrel Tietze, Linda Waterman, and volunteers from St. Rose - Sarah Hines and her two children.



## Domingo de Ramos - Ciclo A

### Mateo 26,14-27,66: "¿Dónde quieres que te preparemos la Pascua?"

No quiero agregar mucho a esta dramática lectura de la Pasión y Muerte del Señor. Sólo quiero actualizar, un poco, estos grandes acontecimientos para nosotros. Porque el Evangelio no es sólo una historia del pasado. Es una revelación viva, actual. Nos descubre lo que hoy está pasando entre Jesús y nosotros. Nos explica como nos trata Él y como lo tratamos nosotros a Él. El Evangelio es como un espejo: no hay más que abrirlo para poder reconocerse en él. En la pasión de este año se mueven los mismos actores que en aquel tiempo de Cristo. En primer lugar, los indiferentes: son los cansados, los meros espectadores, que no les gusta meterse en líos, que dejan hacer a los demás - pero sin los cuales nunca se harían estas cosas. ¿Ante cuántas injusticias y dramas hemos demostrado nosotros esa indiferencia? A continuación van los cobardes: son las personas que en los momentos difíciles dicen, como San Pedro, que "no conocen a este hombre". Son cristianos que a lo mejor oyen muchos sermones, participan en la misa todos los domingos. Pero cuando las cosas se ponen feas, cuando hay cruz y se derrama sangre - entonces dicen que no tienen nada que ver con Él, que no conocen a este hombre. ¿Quién de nosotros no es también cobarde, en determinados momentos? Están también los verdugos. No podrán faltar, son los mismos de siempre - con sus métodos brutales y sádicos, con sus corazones de piedra. Y nosotros, ¿cuántas veces hemos sentenciado a otros con nuestros juicios injustos y nuestras calumnias arbitrarias? Y no falta la misma víctima, inocente, dolorida, paciente. Hoy hay más víctimas que nunca: justos que sufren, inocentes perseguidos, viejos inútiles, huérfanos, encarcelados en todo el mundo. Pero no hay que ir tan lejos. A nuestro lado hay quienes sufren, lloran, pasan hambre, están enfermos, no tienen trabajo, se sienten solos... Y así Jesús, con mil rostros distintos, sigue estando en medio de nosotros y vuelve a iniciar cada día el camino hacia el Calvario. Y nosotros, ¿qué papel jugamos? Podemos escoger el rol que nos guste, podemos hacer para con Jesús lo que queramos. También podemos hacer que haya algunos servidores fieles, algunos corazones atentos, algunos rostros amigos. Podemos regalarle a Jesús presente en los hermanos, gestos de piedad, de compasión, de solidaridad y unidad. Entonces, ¿quién va a hacer de Verónica? ¿Quién quiere ser Simón de Cirene? Simón de Cirene, al principio, se sintió indignado y sin ganas de llevar la cruz. Pero poco a poco su atención se dirigió hacia el hombre que caminaba por delante: aquel compañero suyo tan paciente, digno y silencioso, tan valiente y fuerte en el sufrimiento. Al principio vio sólo la carga de la cruz, pero al final ya no vio más que a Jesús. Y se alegró de poder ayudarlo y acompañarlo en su camino. **¿Cómo empezar la Semana Santa?** Dejando el corazón en silencio para que pueda oír y entender el misterio de estos días. Acudir a los oficios y celebraciones no perplejos sino admirados. Puede ser que estés atravesando momentos de sufrimiento, sea físico o moral; te invito a que te dejes acompañar por Jesús en su entrada triunfal y no temas cuando llegue la dura asignatura del dolor. La Semana Santa no es otra cosa que la vida humana en breve; un resumen del proyecto que Dios tiene sobre cada uno de nosotros. Por eso no es una semana cualquiera; por eso la tenemos muy en cuenta, porque fue Jesús quien nos mostró el camino y las actitudes que debemos de tener en todos los momentos de nuestra vida.
