Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Easter Sunday

Dear Catholics of Cowlitz and Wahkiakum Counties,

Thank you for joining us to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Whether you are at Mass every week, once in a while, once a year, or if this is your first time ever at Mass, we are grateful you decided to spend part of your day with us. I hope that despite the business of the day you found your time at our parishes helpful, inspiring, and hopeful but also challenging you to think in new ways.

Of course, some of you might be reading this right now who came to Mass today unwillingly. Your parents or your spouse dragged you through the doors, you didn't expect to get anything out of Mass and now that it's over you question whether any of it was worthwhile. Well, thank you for sticking it out. Even if your presence didn't seem to benefit *you*, I want to invite you to consider that it benefited somebody else.

While most people came to Mass today in a relatively good mood, not everyone did. Some people came in the midst of great trials, difficulties, and suffering. Many people who attended Mass with you today did so after recently losing people they loved. Others came in the midst of suffering depression, cancer, or some other troubling medical condition. Others came in the midst of joblessness and economic distress. If any of that describes anything you are going through, know that my prayers are with you.

All of the above sources of suffering mentioned, as well as the countless others not mentioned, have a tendency to isolate us. Suffering, perhaps more than anything else, conjures up a terrible sense of loneliness in the person suffering. These are people who came to Church today hoping for a small share of peace to carry them through the next few days. And despite this hope, they also came with some shreds of doubt that God is listening to their prayers – if God even exists at all.

Your presence at Mass was comforting to them. It sent a message to those suffering in our community that they aren't alone and that calling out to God in the midst of these trials was not worthless. When you responded, "Lord, hear our prayer" during the prayers of the faithful you sent a message that you are aware of their struggles and that you care enough to pray for them. Yes, the faith that you brought with you – even if it is only a very small amount – brought comfort to somebody else and sent a message that they aren't alone.

You also sent a subtle message to them that even in the midst of these awful things, God's work isn't done. You affirmed your faith that Jesus rose from the dead and that he pulled something great out of something awful, and that he can do the same for us as well. You affirmed that God can pull great things out of the terrible things we endure. So thank you for being with us and witnessing your faith to all of us today.

Have a blessed Easter. I hope we will see you again soon.

Domingo de Pascua - Ciclo A
Juan 20, 1-9: "La Pascua como testimonio de vida y esperanza".

La Resurrección del Señor, fundamento de nuestra fe. Jesucristo vive: ésta es la gran alegría de todos los cristianos. En verdad ha resucitado el Señor, aleluya. A él la gloria y el poder por toda la eternidad. Si queremos, no habrá un solo instante de nuestra existencia que pueda librarse de la alegría esplendorosa de Pascua. El verdadero cristiano es incapaz de vivir al margen de la alegría. Por Cristo se ha visto introducido e instalado en la alegría, entregado a la alegría. En su vida no puede ya existir el fracaso: ni el pecado, ni el sufrimiento, ni la muerte son para él obstáculos insuperables. Por eso los mayores sufrimientos y las mejores alegrías pueden coexistir, íntimamente unidos en el lecho de una misma vida. Pero sentimos tantas tentaciones de resistir. Aceptar creer en la alegría es casi aceptar a renunciar a nosotros mismos, a nuestra experiencia, a nuestra desconfianza, a nuestras quejas. Y nuestra alegría es la medida de nuestro apego a Dios, a la confianza, a la esperanza, a la fe. Nuestra negativa a la dicha es nuestra negativa a Dios. Dios ocupa en nuestras vidas el mismo lugar que la alegría. Los padres de la Iglesia decían que no hay más que un solo medio para curar la tristeza: dejar de amarla. Creer en Dios es creer que Él es capaz de hacernos felices, de darnos a conocer una vida que deseamos prolongar por toda la eternidad. Porque, para muchos de nosotros, la cuestión difícil no está en saber si tienen fe en la resurrección, sino en saber si sienten ganas de resucitar, no en esta pequeña vida nuestra, egoísta, dolorosa y ciega. Si esto hiciera, el prolongar indefinidamente esa vida, sería más un castigo que una recompensa. Por eso, la fe en la resurrección no puede brotar más que de un amor verdadero. Cristo nos ha dado a conocer ese amor que no pasa: "La fe y la esperanza pasarán, pero la caridad vive para siempre". Nuestra fe, nuestra esperanza de resucitar para nosotros y para los demás, depende estrechamente de nuestra capacidad de resurrección, están a la medida de nuestra fuerza de amar. Para que podamos experimentar una vida de amor y de fe, tenemos que morir a nuestras faltas, a nuestras tristezas y a nuestros resentimientos. No existe Pascua para nosotros, si no aceptamos morir en esa zona de nuestra propia alma en la que estamos demasiado vivos: en nuestras agitaciones, nuestros temores, nuestros intereses, nuestro egoísmo. Y si no aceptamos resucitar en esa zona en la que estamos demasiado muertos: resucitar a la paz, a la fe, a la esperanza, al amor y a la alegría. No existe Pascua sin una buena confesión: un morir a nosotros mismos, a nuestros caprichos que son nuestros pecados, para resucitar a la voluntad de Cristo, que es amor, esperanza, renovación, cariño. No existe Pascua sin una comunión pascual: un salir de nuestras costumbres, de nuestro pan y nuestra vida, para saborear otro pan, otra vida, un pan de la sinceridad, de entrega a los demás, una vida de amor, de fe y de alegría. Eso es la fiesta de Pascua: un cambio de vida, un pasar de esta vida nuestra a otra admirable, maravillosa, que será nuestra vida para siempre, en la casa del Padre celestial. La alegría profunda de este día tiene su origen en Cristo, en el amor que Dios nos tiene y en nuestra correspondencia con ese amor. Se cumple aquella promesa del Señor: Yo les daré una alegría que nadie les podrá quitar. La única condición que nos pone es no separarnos nunca del Padre, no dejar nunca que las cosas nos separen de Él; experimentar en todo momento que somos hijos suyos.

Estatuto para la Protección de Niños y Jóvenes
