## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Our parish in Castle Rock is looking for a new piano player. Annette Noe, who served this parish as well as St. Rose for many years is moving to Vancouver and she will no longer be available to play for us on a regular basis. We are all very sad that she is leaving, but we are happy that she will be a bit closer to her family. There will be a couple other groups joining us in Castle Rock, but we want to keep our choir together as well. Thus, we are hoping somebody will be interested in playing for us two to three times per month. If you are interested, please email [frbryan@strose-longview.org](mailto:frbryan@strose-longview.org).

Once again, it is time for the Annual Catholic Appeal. I like the Annual Catholic Appeal, and I believe it is very important. The Annual Catholic Appeal funds many of our chancery operations, as well as many ministries throughout the Archdiocese. It also helps to pay the tuition for our seminarians and helps us take care of our retired priests and religious women. I hope you will support the appeal this year.

As is the case each year, each of our parishes have been assigned a goal that we need to reach, and anything we raise above that amount comes straight back to our parishes. This gives each parish an opportunity to work on projects above and beyond our budgeted income.

Last year, St. Mary's in Castle Rock got a lot of work done thanks to their Annual Appeal rebate. We were able to reseal the parking lot, fix the roof, and get enough seed money to purchase new LED lights, which are already saving us in energy costs. This year, we will use our rebate to upgrade our sound system and equipment. When we sent out surveys earlier this year asking parishioners if they had any projects in mind, upgrading the sound system came back as a very popular response.

As was the case at St. Mary's, St. Rose decided to do some maintenance projects. St. Rose also replaced a lot of lights with LED bulbs, and we also upgraded our phone system. This year, we would like to address security. We have had our security problems at St. Rose. A couple years ago we had a relatively serious break in at the Church and parish center. They gained access to the parish center by breaking a window. Earlier this year we had horrible, racist graffiti sprayed on our Church doors. The parish center is difficult to secure during the day if meetings are being held. Quite often, people find their way into our offices rather than entering the parish center through the reception area. This can be dangerous. In response to that, we are hoping to put some special film on our windows at the parish center and Church so they will not break. We would also like to get a code system placed on our doors so we will not have to leave our doors unlocked when meetings are being held. We also plan to finish installing our security cameras inside the Church. The school is already making security upgrades, so we won't need to use any funds from the parish for the school at this time.

Immaculate Heart of Mary in Kelso has used funds from the Annual Appeal to do maintenance work as well. We are finally moving beyond those projects, and are hoping to use part of the funds this year to focus on our mission as a parish. Details aren't clear right now, but we hope to use some funds for the Alpha program. There is also an opportunity to help some homeless families which might require some upgrades to our facilities. Finally, I would love to have a parish mission if it can be arranged.

St. Catherine's in Cathlamet has used their rebate for maintenance projects as well and has also used funds to balance the budget. Well, thanks to selling property, St. Catherine's has an opportunity to focus on evangelization and missionary activity as well. Details have not been discussed yet, but we will be reaching an agreement on this soon.

**Tercer Domingo de Pascua - Ciclo A**  
**Lucas 24,13-35: "Lo reconocieron al partir el pan".**

Dos discípulos de Jesús van por el camino. Esta vez el caminar no conduce a la curación o a al encuentro de Jesús. Es un caminar desorientado. Sabían que iban a su lugar de origen pero ya sin esperanzas. Se les había muerto la persona en la que tanto habían creído. Vieron cómo enterraban su cuerpo; vivieron el desánimo de sus compañeros; sintieron el latido del fracaso ante la opción un día tomada. No me extraña que fueran discutiendo por el camino. Aquellos dos discípulos representan a muchos millones de personas que han tenido un contacto con Jesús, pero no con el Resucitado, sino con el Cristo de los milagros, el del entusiasmo del Domingo de Ramos. Pero no aciertan estos amigos a comprender que el Jesús de la cruz, el que recibe las preguntas desafiantes durante el sufrimiento "¿no eres tú Dios? Pues baja de la cruz..."; el que sangra y padece, sea ese Dios que ellos se imaginan. En esos momentos Jesús se vuelve ante los ojos del mundo su peor pregonero. El dolor y el sufrimiento son puertos a los que nadie quiere arribar. Los cristianos no somos masoquistas que disfrutamos ante nuestras dolencias. El dolor es malo, pero puede ser motivo de salvación. Aquellos amigos nuestros iban por el camino llenos de dolor sin resurrección. Dice la Palabra que estaban tristes. Jesús se puso a su lado pero no le reconocían. El dolor por el fracaso les había vendado no sólo los ojos sino también el corazón. Eran ciegos de sí mismos ya que no sabían digerir el fracaso de su maestro. Se sentían rotos por dentro porque todo había quedado en palabras. Le cuentan a Jesús la versión de lo que había ocurrido, pero lo hacen con desesperanza. Ellos esperaban pero su espera había sido inútil. Ahora vuelven más desilusionados que nunca. Las palabras de Jesús le animaban pero su muerte, el silencio de la palabra del maestro les dejó vacíos. Jesús comienza a explicarles nuevamente todo lo que de Él se decía en las Escrituras. Escuchan pero ya sin convencimiento. Siguen en el camino. Llegan al pueblo y Jesús hizo como si fuera a seguir su camino, pero ellos le invitan a quedarse. Se sientan a la mesa y de nuevo Jesús toma el pan y habiendo dado gracias a Dios, lo partió y se lo dio. Dice la Escritura que en ese momento se les abrieron los ojos y reconocieron a Jesús; pero Él desapareció. El último gesto que tuvo Jesús con sus Apóstoles fue la cena. Ahora, después de su resurrección hace de nuevo el gesto de la fracción del pan, que alimenta, que salva, que abre los ojos al ciego. La Eucaristía es el lugar del encuentro con Jesús. Él se les muestra entregándose nuevamente, esta vez de una manera incruenta. Parte para ellos y con ellos el pan y bendice a Dios. Y ellos le descubren... La vida cristiana estará siempre enlazada entre Eucaristía, Cruz y Resurrección. Una y otra vez en la vida del seguidor de Cristo estarán presentes estos tres momentos. Hay una pregunta que nuestros amigos no creyentes o no muy creyentes nos suelen hacer: Si Jesús resucitó, ¿Dónde está ahora? Jesús no está en el sepulcro. El sepulcro se quedó vacío. Tampoco la resurrección es un retorno al pasado. El verdadero encuentro con Cristo está hoy en la Palabra, en la Eucaristía y en la profesión de fe. El Señor está en la vida nueva que ha llegado en la transformación del sufrimiento de este mundo. Encontrarlo es encontrar el camino de la salvación. Jesús resucitado está en la Eucaristía. La Eucaristía es el lugar preferente de la presencia de Cristo. Participar en la Eucaristía significa tener un encuentro personal con Cristo resucitado.
