Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

A few weeks ago at Youth Group we talked a little bit about faith and science and how they interact. A lot of our students reported that they see hostility from non-Catholic Christians towards science, as well as hostility from people who love science towards religion. My message to the students was that Catholics should use both God's revelation *and* science to learn about our world.

Still, there is an odd perception right now that people of faith must be opposed to science. In fact, there are many people who believe that Christians in general and Catholics in particular are *enemies* of science. This is actually an objection to our Catholic faith that is quite easy to disprove. Over the next few weeks we will look at a couple of responses that Catholics can make to people who believe that the Catholic Church is an enemy of science.

Perhaps the easiest argument is to point out the contributions that many Catholics have made to scientific progress. One of them was a priest named Roger Bacon. While many people in Bacon's day and before Bacon's day were interested in science, many struggled to replicate findings. The reason was that there was not a standard scientific method. Bacon is credited with perfecting this method which is absolutely crucial to replicating findings and making progress in the discipline.

Another priest who made significant contributions to science was Gregor Mendel. Mendel is considered by most to be the "Father of Genetics." That's right. The first person to systematically prove the presence of dominant and recessive traits passed to offspring was a Catholic priest. But Mendel was not just an ordinary priest. He was a very accomplished priest. In fact, he was the Abbot of an Augustinian monastery. Not only was he a brilliant scientist, but he was a brilliant philosopher as well. It is amazing to think of where we would be scientifically without his contributions.

One scientific theory that people like to point to disprove the existence of God is the so-called, "Big Bang Theory." Simply stated, this theory posits that the Universe originated from a single point and has expanded through time. Although the theory has evolved a bit over the years, it is really the best scientific explanation we have for the origin of the universe.

Well, the Big Bang Theory is also credited to a Catholic priest named Fr. Georges Lemaitre. It is incredibly ironic that atheists and agnostics point to this theory to try and prove our religion wrong while failing to realize that it was a member of our religion who advanced the theory, probably more than any other person in history.

That these men were all Catholic is not merely a religious preference like we sometimes think of today. These men were men of deep faith who gave their entire lives to God and His Church. Their love for God filled them with wonder about the world He made and this is what largely drove their inquiry. These men were not motivated by profit. Nor were they motivated by some type of ideology or agenda. They were motivated by a love of truth and a sense of wonder, which is placed inside us through the gift of faith.

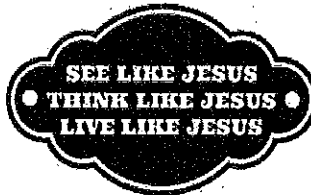

4 Domingo de Pascua - Ciclo A
Juan 10, 1-10: "Yo soy la puerta de las ovejas".

Después de una copiosa cena en una de esas grandiosas mansiones de Hollywood, un famoso actor entretenía a los convidados recitando pasajes famosos de las obras de Shakespeare. Al final aceptó una última petición. Un tímido y anciano sacerdote le preguntó si conocía el salmo 23. Sí, lo conozco y lo recitaré con una condición, que cuando yo termine de recitarlo, recite usted el mismo salmo. El sacerdote un tanto apenado aceptó el reto. El actor lo dijo maravillosamente y le aplaudieron entusiasmados. El sacerdote se levantó y dijo las mismas palabras pero esta vez no hubo aplausos, sólo un silencio contenido y alguna lágrima. El actor saboreó el silencio durante unos momentos y se levantó. Señoras y Señores espero hayan comprendido lo que acaba de suceder aquí. Yo conozco las palabras del salmo pero este sacerdote conoce al pastor. Pascua significa que somos personas transformadas. Y todos estos domingos son domingos de Pascua para recordarnos que Pascua no es un solo domingo, un solo día. Pascua no es solo una celebración, sino una manera de vivir. El cristianismo comienza con la Pascua. Sin la Pascua no tendríamos evangelio que predicar, ni Cristo en el que creer, ni iglesia a la que pertenecer, ni misión... Sin Pascua, silencio. Sin Pascua, nada. Sin Pascua, sólo muerte. Alégrese. Cristo ha resucitado. Cristo vive. Jesús es el pastor que vive. Jesús es la autopista por la que tenemos que circular y la puerta que nos introduce a la salvación del Padre. No hay otro camino ni otra puerta. Si Jesús es el pastor tiene que existir una relación entre el pastor y sus ovejas. Escuchar su voz es reconocer su autoridad y su importancia, comulgar con su mensaje, dejarse guiar por él y saber distinguir su voz entre los miles de voces que nos convocan de todas partes. Seguirle es ser miembro comprometido de su iglesia y pertenecer a su rebaño. Conocerle es experimentar su amor, acoger el don de la vida eterna, ser su amigo, compartir su mesa y comunicarse con él diariamente a través de la oración. Hoy, la Palabra nos invita a todos a escuchar su voz, a seguirle y a conocerle. Él no es un asalariado ni un intruso, es el Hijo de Dios, es la puerta del cielo y la puerta de su comunidad, la iglesia. Ustedes tienen todos una vocación, la vida cristiana vivida en plenitud es una gran vocación. Ustedes también han sido llamados por su nombre por Dios. 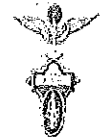

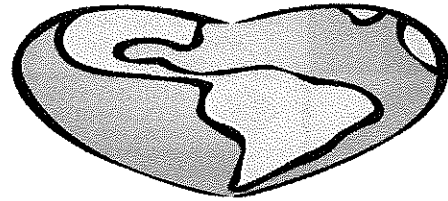
