## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Last weekend we heard from the very end of the second letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. In that letter St. Paul instructed his readers to encourage one another. At weekday Mass this week we also started hearing from St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians. In fact, we heard the very first few verses and, again, the word encouragement front and center. God encourages us in our afflictions, and we need to encourage one another.

The definition of encouragement is, "Words or actions that makes someone more determined, hopeful, or confident." When I think back over my life I can think of many encouraging words I received. A physics teacher in high school used to say, "Hard work, done well, feels good." His message was that hard work pays off and always ends up being worth it. My parents also encouraged me in school by telling me that hard work was important.

I also received lots of encouragement in sports. I remember being at soccer practice, exhausted from all the work we had put in and our coach making us run laps at the end of practice. He would say, "I know this is hard, but this is what's going to help you score that game winner in the last few minutes." When it happened and we did score in the closing minutes of a game, he'd make sure we all know that our extra laps had paid off.

Sadly, I don't know that I ever received encouragement like that about living out our faith. I don't recall anyone ever saying, "I know this is tough to be Catholic right now but it will pay off in the future." I don't recall anyone saying, "Spend that few extra moments in prayer. It will be worth it." I don't recall anyone saying, "You might not understand why we're asking you to do this right now, but it will make sense when you're older and you'll be grateful you did."

The lack of encouragement we receive in living out our faith is a scandal. Our faith has some high standards for us. The standard is, "Live like Christ lived." This is not easy, especially when we're so tired from our daily trials. We don't feel like, "Running those extra laps" so to speak by dedicating a few extra moments in prayer or studying our faith or making a sacrifice for our spouse. But those moments when we're tired and ready to give up are the moments we can grow in our faith.

Those moments when the cross of our faith is the heaviest are the moments when we really deepen our relationship with God. It's worth it to carry the cross in those moments. So I want to encourage you not to put your cross down when it gets difficult. Keep going. Run those extra laps! Put in those moments of prayer. You'll be happy you did when trials come and you're able to persevere through them with joy.

Along those lines, I want to thank those of you who have encouraged me. This last year was the toughest of my priesthood so far, for a few reasons. During these trials, many of you offered me some very important words of encouragement. When you shared that you were praying for me, I felt hopeful and confident. When you shared that you were going deeper in your faith or that my homily touched your heart, you made me more determined to do my best. You made those "extra laps" seem worth it.

This year was hard, but I'm still happy to be your priest. I'm excited for this coming year. If we keep encouraging each other, I know a lot of good things will happen.

**Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. — Ciclo A**  
**Juan 6, 51-58: "Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida."**

Entramos en el mundo de Dios: Tenemos un nuevo Padre, un nuevo cielo, una nueva Palabra, un nuevo alimento, una nueva vida... Hoy la Palabra reclama nuestra atención en el alimento del cielo. Los alimentos junto con el agua es aquello que nos mantiene vivos físicamente hablando; pero nosotros sabemos bien que nuestra vida no está formada sólo por nuestra frágil constitución física. Mientras la comida y el agua mantienen nuestro cuerpo sabemos que en nuestro interior hay otras realidades que necesitan alimentos para ayudarnos a crecer. La Eucaristía es el mejor medio que tenemos para alimentar y conservar nuestra vida divina. El cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo es nuestro primer manantial de vida eterna. La Eucaristía ocupa el lugar central de nuestra fe. Muchas veces me he preguntado si los católicos somos conscientes de esta realidad que una y otra vez celebramos en nuestros templos. Se abre la Iglesia; entran las personas que van a participar de la misa. Empezamos el canto de entrada. El sacerdote comienza el ritual y los asistentes contestan grandes realidades que muchas veces no se adaptan a la vida diaria. Hagamos un recorrido a nuestra Eucaristía. Vamos a la Misa no sólo porque tengamos "la obligación" o "la devoción". Venimos porque es el mismo Señor quien nos ha llamado. Nunca pienses que vas a Misa por tu propio pie. Es el Señor quien te invita. Antes de comenzar medita esto en tu corazón: "Aquí estoy Señor porque me has llamado." Empezamos en el nombre de Dios Padre, Dios Hijo y Dios Espíritu Santo. Tengo que dejar hueco a la Santísima Trinidad. Me confieso pecador. Veo mi realidad con respecto a Dios y a los demás. Sé que mi vida está siempre invitada a crecer desde mi miseria no desde mi superioridad. La Palabra. Llega la Palabra con su bistruf espiritual. Sabe abrir mis adentros sin destruirme. Ante ella sólo queda la alabanza que sale de mi corazón y de mi boca. Creo con toda la fe de la Iglesia. La Iglesia no es nunca un local privado. La Iglesia es la patria del alma. Las ofrendas. Con el pan y el vino presento ante el Señor mi propia vida para ser alimentada. Pan y vino. Estamos ante Jesús que se nos da una y otra vez. Es una extraña sensación de miseria y grandeza que se encuentran. Mi miseria es mi propia vida. La grandeza es Dios mismo que se me da a través de la Iglesia. La oración. Levanto mis manos y mi alma. Necesito orar y poner ante Dios mi vida y pedirle para que nunca me aparte de su presencia. Cordero de Dios. Se acerca el momento de la comida espiritual. El se me da porque yo lo acepto. Comunión. La Eucaristía es un misterio de comunión. Recibir la grandeza de Dios en nuestra propia fragilidad. Grandeza que te ayuda a descubrir a Dios como Padre y a los demás como hermanos. Pero la Eucaristía que es algo tan íntimo no puede convertirse en algo intimista. Me acerco a Él para que mi vida se vea llena de su presencia. Mi vida sale a la calle, se encuentra con los demás en las tormentas y zozobras de la vida. No sé si los otros notarán que llevo a Cristo dentro de mí. No sé si el sagrario se ha instalado allí donde vivo y me relaciono con los demás? ¿Cuál es el termómetro para saber si el alimento de Cristo llena mi vida? Cuando tengo hambre del Señor en mi vida diaria. Hambre de verdad y de vida, de amor y de entrega, de generosidad y cariño por parte del buen Dios. ¿Cuál es el termómetro para comprobar que la entrega de Cristo de verdad me alimenta? Cuando soy capaz de amar sin medida a los demás, en especial a los más débiles y necesitados. Si soy capaz de ver en los demás al Señor Resucitado es cuando toda la energía eucarística se ha asimilado en mi vida. Sólo desde el amor en la entrega es como podemos acercarnos a recibir el cuerpo de Cristo para luego llevarlo en el sagrario de nuestra vida a quienes no se acercan a la Iglesia. La vida de cada católico tiene que ser como un sagrario andante, un sagrario digno y solidario con el dolor y las esperanzas de nuestro mundo, sólo de esta manera es como el Señor se hará más visible a las personas de nuestro tiempo. La próxima vez que vayas a la Eucaristía y cuando el sacerdote diga aquello de "Levantemos el corazón..." piensa bien lo que vas a contestar...
