## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

**Job Openings:** A couple of weeks ago I wrote that we are interested in hiring a new parish secretary to serve in Kelso for 12 hours a week. We are also hoping to hire a new parish secretary in Castle Rock as well for 8 hours a week. Some have asked if the positions can be combined into one position and they can. If you are interested in serving both parishes for a total of 20 hours per week that would certainly work.

We plan to open the office in Kelso three days per week for four hours and the office in Castle Rock for two days per week for four hours. If you would like to consider applying for either of these positions or for both of the positions, please apply. **Capital Campaign:** You may have heard at Mass recently that the Archdiocese is launching a capital campaign. This major fund raising effort has several goals. First, it is to support our priest pension plan which (like so many pension plans) is underfunded. Second, it will help support retired women religious who have served our archdiocese in many different capacities. Finally, it will bring in money for our parishes to use on items they believe are important.

Recently, the Archdiocese completed a planning study for this campaign. The Steier group, based in Nebraska, helped to study the feasibility of the campaign and their report is that support for this campaign among those surveyed is strong. Out of 2,451 people who were surveyed, 79% favored the campaign and the Archdiocese has decided to move ahead.

Previously, the priest pension plan has been a pay-as-you-go system, which isn't sustainable over a long period of time. This capital campaign will attempt to get out in front of problems that may arise if we continue to pay out as much as we have been. If we don't bolster our pension plan there could be greater problems in the future.

As for the women religious that the funds will support, there will be further communication on this in the future. Since different communities of women religious have different needs, it has been determined that a committee of women religious must be established to determine how funds are distributed.

Like so many campaigns that we hear about in the Church, we have an opportunity to help our parishes by participating in the campaign. The exact model of the campaign has not yet been determined, but one possibility is that it could be like the Annual Catholic Appeal where each of our parish has an assessed goal, and anything we raise above this goal will come back to our parish. Another possible model would be similar to the Catholic Community Services campaign each December, where a fixed percent of money donated from our parishioners comes back to the parish.

You will be hearing more about this from the Archdiocese in the future. Overall, the campaign will take about three years to run. I plan to contribute to the campaign, and I hope you will consider it as well. If this campaign is successful it will benefit our parishes, our clergy, and our women religious who have given their lives to serve our Church.

**Décimo Sexto Domingo Ordinario - Ciclo A**  
**Mateo 13, 24,43. "Dejad crecer juntos el trigo y la cizaña".**

Jesús sigue hablando en parábolas y quiere tocar un tema que ha preocupado al ser humano en todo momento de la Historia. El Evangelio nos propone una de las respuestas más increíbles que podamos imaginar: el bien camina junto al mal por el mismo camino, por las mismas sendas. Pero hay una seguridad: el mal se desvanecerá antes de llegar al final del camino. Se desvanecerá por la fuerza invisible del bien. El mal sólo se destruye con el ejercicio del bien. El trigo y la cizaña cuando empiezan a crecer se parecen tanto que los judíos de la época pensaban que la cizaña era trigo que se había corrompido. El bien y el mal andando juntos en nuestra realidad humana, se parecen pero no son ni mucho menos iguales. El Reino de Dios necesita ser sembrado, cuidado, mimado, vivido. El mal se propaga por sí solo, sólo hay que sembrarlo. Hay una realidad fácilmente comprobable y es que el mal logra esconderse largo tiempo en la vida de las personas en forma de odio, maldad, celos, alejamiento de Dios, etc. En el mundo el mal está presente en forma de toda clase de acciones que conducen al ser humano a la infelicidad permanente. Existe un estado donde la persona va perdiendo el norte de su vida y al final no sabe ni quién es, ni dónde está ni adónde va. La paradoja del mal y del bien en el mundo es que el mal parece no exigir gran esfuerzo, se hace con facilidad y hasta con impunidad. Hacer sufrir a alguien es muy sencillo, destruir es muy fácil; pero hacer el bien, crear, hacer crecer a los demás, hacerlos personas, recrearlos de nuevo libres ya de las ataduras de los pecados, es una obra que sólo puede hacer Dios a través de nosotros. Una persona se puede contagiar del mal fácilmente con la actuación de otra persona. Una persona sólo puede estar incitada permanentemente al bien si Dios la ilumina, le da la fuerza necesaria y el apoyo en el interior de su corazón. Para sembrar el bien cada persona debe ser para la otra hermano y hermana. Para muchas personas el Evangelio aparece como algo sin fuerzas, sin posibilidad de transformar la vida de las personas que nos rodean. ¿Te sientes transformado por Dios? ¿Por qué? ¿En qué? El Evangelio es como una pequeña semilla, casi insignificante: no está hinchada de filosofía, no quiere alardes y puede ser predicado y entendido por cualquier persona que se abra al bien. No debemos olvidar que ambas siembras la de la bondad de Dios y el mal se hacen casi al mismo tiempo, cada persona debe decidir qué cosecha escoger. Tengo el convencimiento prometido por la palabra que Cristo triunfará al final de la Historia... Para saber lo que está bien y lo que está mal, tenemos que recurrir una y otra vez a la palabra y al corazón de Dios, a la experiencia cristiana de tantos hombres y mujeres donde la bondad ha hecho su morada. Tenemos que volver una y otra vez a nuestro corazón para que en ese diálogo interior y personalísimo con el Señor, nos haga entender que nosotros no estamos llamados a juzgar a nadie. Jesús no nos ha nombrado jueces de nadie sino hermanos y hermanas de nuestros hermanos y hermanas... Dejo el juicio para Dios y prefiero acoger al que dejó crecer la cizaña en sí mismo, con el amor con el que Dios me acoge. Un llamamiento a la humildad y a la misericordia que desprende, por lo tanto, de la parábola del grano y de la cizaña. ¡Hay un solo campo del que es lícito y necesario arrancar inmediatamente la cizaña, y es el del propio corazón!

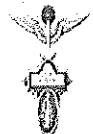
