Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Before I delve into the exciting part of this letter, I want to take one last chance to let you know about an opportunity to work for our parishes. We are hiring a new receptionist at Immaculate Heart of Mary for twelve hours a week as well as a receptionist at St. Mary's in Castle Rock for eight hours a week. If anyone wants to apply for both of these positions, you would be most welcome to. If you are interested we encourage you to apply as soon as possible. Applications are available in our parishes or by email. Email Robbie@strose-longview.org.

Now onto the fun stuff. Last week, I had an opportunity to accompany four of our high school students and a couple of chaperones on a mission trip. We went to Whatcom County to serve some of the migrant farm workers and their families. We had a pretty amazing time, and I want to make sure I share how proud I am of our students. They represented our parish so well. They were very patient and even though the schedule was demanding, they didn't complain at all.

My favorite day of the week was day 2. We got up a little before 5am and after morning prayer and a reflection we hopped in our van and drove to Breckenridge Blueberry Farm in Everson. Once there, we spent several hours working on the farm. After some work we were allowed to pick to see what it was like. We had 21 people there and we picked for 15-20 minutes a piece. So we are talking about 5 hours to 7 hours of labor. We picked 37 pints of blueberries in that time.

Breckenridge employs a woman named Angelica to pick their big orders of blueberries. Angelica is a friend of the family and receives a very generous wage for her work. Angelica can pick 30 pounds of blueberries in an hour. It was pretty amazing to see how fast she was. I, for one, will never consider this "unskilled labor."

After our work at the farm we drove to a grocery store. We were put into "Families" which were small groups of 3 or 4 people. We were then told that we were given a "wage" for our work, which (after other expenses) came down to \$1.25 a piece. We then had to use that money to buy our dinner in the store. And yes, it was our real dinner. We had to include vegetables and some type of protein and we only had 10 minutes to be in the store.

Our students from our parishes were in a group of four, so they had \$5 to spend. They made pasta with cheese sauce, green beans and bought a few bananas with the money left over. My group only had three people in it, and if I learned anything through this experience it was that an extra \$1.25 a day can make a huge difference of the type of food you can put on your table.

My group went with Top Ramen as a base. I swear I used to buy Top Ramen in college for 10 cents a pack. That isn't the case anymore. At this particular store, we could only buy 6 packs at a time for \$1.50. We then bought some frozen vegetables. That left us with about \$1.25 left. Since we were running out of time we had to find protein. We wound up with some hot dogs and made this weird top ramen stew.

Even though this was just a simulation, it was definitely a worthwhile one. It was very difficult to find good, *healthy* food for that little money and, yes, there are plenty of families in Cowlitz County trying to do just that. This was eye opening to say the least.

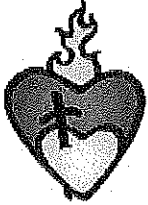

Décimo Séptimo Domingo Ordinario - Ciclo A
Mateo 13, 44-52. "El reino se parece a un tesoro escondido".

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos habla por medio de parábolas. Así quiere atraernos a su Reino de los Cielos, presente ya en la Iglesia. Por las parábolas del tesoro escondido y de la perla preciosa, Jesús nos llama la atención sobre la suerte incomparable y la ocasión única de ganar ese Reino. Encontrar un tesoro escondido era el sueño de muchos en la antigüedad. En una época sin bancos quedaba como único recurso seguro esconder la fortuna debajo de la tierra. Y si el poseedor murió sin desenterrarlo, un golpe de fortuna podía sacar a luz este tesoro. El hombre en nuestra parábola parece ser un pobre jornalero. Él encuentra el tesoro, trabajando en un campo ajeno. Por eso tiene que vender todo lo que posee, para poder comprar el campo. Resuelta y alegremente aprovecha la única ocasión de salir de la miseria. Por el contrario, el hombre de la segunda parábola es un rico comerciante mayorista en perlas. En aquel tiempo las perlas eran obtenidas en el mar Rojo y valían, además del oro, como máxima preciosidad. Él las adquiere de pescadores de perlas o de pequeños negociantes. También este rico aprovecha el caso fortuito, vende su propiedad y compra esta perla de gran valor. Ahora, *¿cuál es el mensaje de estas parábolas?* Me parece que Jesús quiere destacar, sobre todo, dos rasgos en el procedimiento de los dos hombres: El primer rasgo: la alegría radiante de los que encuentran el tesoro o la perla. Su gozo es tan grande que toda otra cosa palidece ante el brillo de su hallazgo. Conmovidos y cautivados por su suerte, ponen en juego toda su existencia. Es el segundo rasgo: su abandono total para ganar el tesoro o la perla. Conocen un solo fin y venden hasta todos sus bienes para conseguirlo: adquirir esa preciosidad. Están seguros de hacer el gran negocio de su vida. Lo mismo pasa también con el Reino de los Cielos. La Buena Nueva de ese Reino conmueve los corazones, despierta una alegría desbordante, causa una entrega apasionada. Los que oyen y comprenden esta noticia, arriesgan todo lo que tienen para ganar a Dios y su Reino. Es la oportunidad única de toda su vida. Esta suerte incomparable hay que aprovecharla a riesgo de todos los medios y todas las posibilidades. Es el verdadero y único valor que vale la pena en este mundo. Una ganancia extraordinaria y eterna espera a los que se juegan la vida por Dios y su Reino. Además, la parábola doble quiere decirnos que Dios ofrece a cada uno de sus hijos esta ocasión única para la salvación: al pobre jornalero tanto como al rico mayorista. También hoy en día Dios da esta oportunidad. Porque la humanidad de nuestro tiempo sigue buscando su suerte duradera, lo mismo como en el tiempo de Jesús. Me parece que también todos nosotros estamos todavía en camino, en busca de este Tesoro, ¿Quién de nosotros puede decir que ya encontró en Dios la suerte para siempre ¿Quién de nosotros realiza su vida con esa alegría desbordante que caracteriza a los que hallaron la felicidad en Dios? · ¿Y quién de nosotros está dispuesto a arriesgar todo lo suyo para ganar ese tesoro celestial? La segunda Lectura de hoy (Romanos 8, 28-30) nos muestra el camino para lograr esta actitud solicitada. Consiste en reproducir la imagen de Jesús, seguir sus huellas, para que Él sea el primogénito entre muchos hermanos. En él tenemos nuestro molde siempre vital y actual. Él nos regala, en su seguimiento, la alegría verdadera que transfigura toda pena y miseria de este mundo. Él nos da la fuerza de arriesgar todo para ganar todo, o sea lo único necesario y decisivo: El cielo y la comunidad con los nuestros y con Dios para siempre. Nosotros también hoy podemos comprender tantas y tantas cosas del Señor profundizando en Él, en su vida, en su oración, en su experiencia constante de encuentro con el resucitado. Termina el evangelio diciéndonos que tenemos que compaginar lo viejo y lo nuevo, lo que nos anunciaba el Antiguo Testamento con el Nuevo Testamento. Lo que hay de nosotros desde una fe recibida cuando pequeños a la fe adulta que intentamos vivir. En ese encuentro actualizado es donde nuestra fe y nuestra vida se encuentran y se gustan mutuamente...

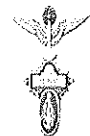
