## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners

I've recently begun to pay closer attention to what prominent atheists are saying, and I've particularly been following a few relatively popular YouTube personalities. I appreciate the thought that these atheists put into their projects and I do find them very entertaining. One of these atheist YouTubers in particular has caught my attention because he seems to have shifted his focus quite a bit over the last couple of years.

This particular personality has mostly stopped bashing religion. Instead, it appears that he is starting to notice what a world without religion is going to look like and I wouldn't say he likes what he sees. He, like many other atheists who actually take the time to spread their ideas love logic and reason. When many of them began their campaigns against faith they envisioned a world in which logic and reason would increase as religious devotion declined.

This isn't happening, and some atheists are beginning to notice. "Organized Religion," might be in decline (it most certainly is), but logic and reason are not taking its place. Instead the decline of religion is opening space for other ideas to dominate the culture. GK Chesterton put it this way: "When man ceases to worship God he does not worship nothing but he worships everything." His point is that if we stop putting our faith in God we will put our faith in just about anything.

This particular Atheist I've mentioned above is noticing this and so he has moved on from bashing organized religion to bashing many of the other trends people are putting their faith in. Some of them are a bit bizarre. One movement starting to gain ground on the internet is a group of people who believe that they are animals trapped in human bodies. Some of these are real animals like bears, but other people believe they are dragons and other mythical creatures. As the atheist said (and I'm paraphrasing here to avoid using profanity), "This had better not be what replaces organized religion."

But this is exactly what is replacing organized religion. But that isn't all. The atheist YouTuber also laments that human emotion is triumphing over reason and logic. This is the case in politics. He has lamented the fact that even many of his ideological allies are not able or willing to have a reasonable conversation about important issues. Instead, they appeal to their emotions in order to shame those who disagree with them and force their views on others by threatening to label anyone who disagrees with them as a bigot.

If I was able to have a few moments face to face with this young man, I'd point out to him that, contrary to the narrative he has bought into, logic, reason and science have actually flourished within a culture dominated by Christian faith. I've written about this before. Scientific progress took giant leaps forward due to Christian Monasticism. The Catholic Church also began many of the Universities that have taught science and logic to thousands throughout history.

The decline in Christian religion is not going to be good for science, logic and reason. We are already seeing it and even people who would seem to be our natural enemies are noticing. But this also brings with it an opportunity to evangelize. If you have relatives or friends who are still operating under the false assumptions that science, reason, and logic are going to increase as religion decreases I'd share this with them. Share the historical facts that Christianity in general (and Catholicism in particular) have contributed to scientific progress.

**23th Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario**  
**Mateo 18, 15-20. "Si tu hermano peca, repréndelo a solas".**

¿Qué debemos hacer como cristianos cuando alguien nos ofende? La asignatura del perdón es de las más difíciles de aprobar dentro de la carrera del cristiano. Dentro de lo que es la vida humana, el perdón siempre es una invitación a ser mejores en la relación con los demás. Perdonar es relativamente fácil, pero perdonar de corazón no siempre es algo que cualquier persona pueda conseguir. La corrección fraterna tiene que tener unos elementos imprescindibles: amor, humildad y mansedumbre. Si faltan estos presupuestos no se dará un auténtico encuentro ni humano ni cristiano. Dice la Palabra que con una persona en pecado debe seguirse este proceso: Debe ser reprendida en privado, a solas, haciéndole ver su pecado. Si se da cuenta y acepta su realidad buscará el cambio y la conversión. Si no te escucha, trae a dos testigos, trata de persuadirle otra vez con amabilidad y cariño. Si tampoco quiere escuchar, hay que plantearlo a la comunidad. Si no hace escucha a la comunidad, sea tenido como un pagano. ¿Qué haces y cómo te relacionas con los que no viven el Evangelio? ¿Cómo debe ser el comportamiento de un cristiano hacia una persona que no vive el Evangelio? ¿Cómo les acogemos? En numerosas ocasiones, el mensaje universal del Evangelio lo cerramos en nuestras manías y nuestras fobias personales. Tenemos que irnos capacitando para crecer con el Evangelio desde la libertad, no desde el temor o la imposición. El poder de atar y desatar que Dios da la Iglesia sirve para ir haciendo la voluntad de Dios en nuestra vida. Si "dos se ponen de acuerdo...", nos deja ver que la unanimidad en la oración obtiene siempre de Dios una respuesta segura. "Donde dos o tres se reúnen en mi nombre, allí estoy yo en medio de ellos". Por pocos que sean, si se reúnen en comunión con Cristo y con los hermanos, Jesús estará no sólo con ellos, sino en medio de ellos. No es la multitud quien atrae la presencia de Dios, sino la fe y la devoción de los congregados los que atraen la presencia y la bendición de Cristo. Jesús nunca puso límites al perdón humano ¿Qué quiso decir entonces con lo de considerar a la otra persona después de los intentos fallidos anteriores como si fuera un pagano o un publicano? No es un mandato de perder la paciencia con nadie. Para Jesús ninguna persona es un caso perdido. Se refiere a cuando una persona, después de ser buscada una y otra vez por Dios, elige el darle la espalda. Quien pudiendo cambiar no lo hace, y en esta cerrazón hace mucho daño a los demás, debe ser apartado, no de los corazones sino del sentir de la comunidad. En realidad es un autoapartamiento donde la persona no encaja en la unidad de los que intentan seguir el camino de Dios. La conversión, e incluso la oración eficaz, es aquella donde se ha suprimido el egoísmo y se han superado nuestras propias necesidades y deseos. En la oración recibimos lo que Dios cree lo mejor para nosotros aunque nos cueste muchas veces creerlo. Las cosas de Dios hay que verlas con la perspectiva del tiempo y con los ojos de la fe. Dios no nos da el escape de una situación humana, nos permite aceptar lo que no podemos entender. Cuando oramos sin mezcla de egoísmo, Dios envía su respuesta; pero es su respuesta, no la que esperábamos nosotros. La Iglesia ha vivido desde siempre la práctica de la oración en común, que no se opone ni sustituye a la oración personal privada por la que el cristiano se une íntimamente a Cristo. Muy grata al Señor es, de modo particular, la oración que la familia reza en común; es uno de los tesoros que hemos recibido de otras generaciones para sacar abundante fruto y transmitirlo a las siguientes. «Hay prácticas de piedad –pocas, breves y habituales– que se han vivido siempre en las familias cristianas, y entiendo que son maravillosas: la bendición de la mesa, el rezo del Rosario todos juntos (...), las oraciones personales al levantarse y al acostarse. Se tratará de costumbres diversas, según los lugares; pero pienso que siempre se debe fomentar algún acto de piedad, que los miembros de la familia hagan juntos, de forma sencilla y natural. "La Familia que reza unida, permanece unida".

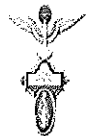

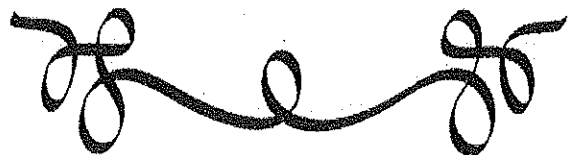
We currently have Prayer Partner openings available on the Prayer Line.
