Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners;

Last week I wrote about the impact many Evangelical Protestants have had on my personal faith. I am grateful for the many evangelicals who helped my faith, especially when I was in middle school and high school. I also expressed that I am sad that I am not in greater communion with them.

This week, we will go a little bit deeper and look at an issue that still divides Catholics and Protestants. One of the most important doctrines that came out of the reformation is called, *Sola Scriptura*. *Sola Scriptura* is a latin phrase meaning, "Scripture Alone." People who believe in *Sola Scriptura* believe that scripture alone is our highest rule of authority in the Church.

As Catholics, we do not believe in *Sola Scriptura*. We believe that Scripture as well as non-scriptural traditions, that go back to the apostles as well as our bishops throughout history, work together to serve as our authoritative rule of faith. Being a Catholic priest, I obviously believe this latter way is true, but before I go into why this is I think we should acknowledge how attractive this view must have looked to Martin Luther and how attractive it looks to people today.

For those unfamiliar with the reformation, you should know that there was a Catholic practice at the time of reformation which involved selling indulgences. The idea of an indulgence is a little complex; however, to keep things simple, the Catholic Church was trying to raise money by telling people if they gave to a certain fund that this would give them time off purgatory. The perception, then, was that people were buying their salvation.

Of course, the notion that we can purchase salvation with money rightfully sounded absurd to Luther and many other reformers. It should sound absurd to us today as well. While this wasn't the only thing driving the reformers, Luther believed that this practice had arisen because the Church was not using the scripture as its sole rule of authority. Instead of referring to scripture alone, the Church was referring to its own teaching authority which seemed circular. His solution to this harmful practice and other errors of doctrine and practice was *Sola Scriptura*.

I hope you can see why this was attractive. I have often said that if I was alive in this time period and heard this doctrine explained that I may have been persuaded by it, (I believe the evidence needed to reject *Sola Scriptura* is historical, because since the reformation there has been less unity among Christians, but I digress.) On the surface it sounds like a wonderful idea. *Sola Scriptura* remains a foundational point of all Churches united in the reformation and thus, it is something that divides protestants from Roman Catholics today

Despite the fact that it is still a point of division, the reasons are not necessarily the same. Luther believed that *Sola Scriptura* would prevent harmful practices from entering the Church but we have seen even today that many harmful practices enter into churches that profess *Sola Scriptura*. If you want an example, Google, "Snake Handling," or "Jamie Coots." Today, the common objection among most Protestants is that Catholics don't take the Bible seriously and that our religion is not Bible-based.

This is one objection that I encourage you to push back on until it hurts. Anyone who makes this objection has clearly never been to Mass. At Mass we, of course, read scripture in large chunks. Scripture is also quoted many times throughout the liturgy. We even hold up the book of the Gospels and process through the Church singing Alleluia. The thought we don't take it seriously is ludicrous and I would wager that Catholics hear more scripture during Mass than the average Protestant hears at their service.

Don't be afraid to investigate this teaching. There are so many good reasons to be Catholic and the more we know the better we can discuss the challenges with our non-Catholic friends and family. I might write more later on this, but I'm out of space!

26 th Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Mateo 21, 28-32.

En el Evangelio de hoy nuestro Señor nos cuenta la historia de dos hijos. Su padre les pide que vayan a trabajar a la viña. El primero responde de un modo muy poco cortés y un tanto violento: -"¡No quiero!" -le dice al padre. En cambio, el otro, con palabras muy atentas y comedidas, dignas incluso de un caballero: -"Voy, señor" -le contesta, pero no va. En cambio, el hijo rebelde y "rezongón" se arrepiente y va a trabajar. Y Cristo pregunta a sus oyentes: -"Cuál de los dos hizo lo que quería el padre?". La respuesta era obvia: el primero. Sus obras lo demostraron.

Y, después del "cuentito", el Señor dirige unas palabras muy duras a los sumos sacerdotes y jefes del pueblo que le oían: -"Yo os aseguro que los publicanos y las prostitutas os llevan la delantera en el camino del Reino de Dios". ¡Un juicio duro, pero muy certero! ¿Por qué? Porque los pecadores y las prostitutas son como el primer hijo de la parábola: a pesar de que sus palabras no eran las más "bonitas" y adecuadas, ellos hicieron la voluntad del Padre: creyeron en Cristo y se convirtieron ante su predicación. Mientras que los fariseos y los dirigentes del pueblo judío, que se consideraban muy justos y observantes, y se sentían muy seguros de sí mismos, éstos son como el segundo hijo: sus "pose" externo es muy respetuoso y comedido, pero NO obedecen a Dios. Y lo que Cristo quería era que hicieran la voluntad del Padre.

Lo que nuestro Señor quiere decirnos con esta parábola es, en definitiva, que lo que verdaderamente importa para salvarse no son las palabras, sino las obras. O, mejor: que las palabras y las promesas que hacemos a Dios y a los demás cuentan en la medida en que éstas van también respaldadas por nuestras obras y comportamientos. Éstas son las que mejor hablan: las obras, no los bonitos discursos; las obras, no los bellos propósitos o los nobles sentimientos nada más.

Se cuenta que en una ocasión, la hermana pequeña de santo Tomás de Aquino le preguntó: -"¿Tomás, qué tengo yo que hacer para ser santa?". Ella esperaba una respuesta muy profunda y complicada, pero el santo le respondió: "Hermanita, para ser santa basta querer". ¡Sí!, querer. Pero querer con todas las fuerzas y con toda la voluntad. Es decir, que no es suficiente con un "quisiera". La persona que "quiere" puede hacer maravillas; pero el que se queda con el "quisiera" es sólo un soñador o un idealista incoherente. Éste es el caso del segundo hijo: él "hubiese querido" obedecer, pero nunca lo hizo. Aquí el refrán popular vuelve a tener la razón: "del dicho al hecho hay mucho trecho".

Por eso, nuestro Señor nos dijo un día que "no todo el que me dice ¡Señor, Señor! se salvará, sino el que hace la voluntad de mi Padre del cielo". Palabras muy sencillas y escuetas, pero muy claras y exigentes.

Y nosotros, ¿cuál de estos dos hijos somos?
