## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Cowlitz and Wahkiakum County Catholics,

This Tuesday is the official 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. As I stated several weeks ago, the reformation is a sad event in the history of Christianity and I am critical of churches and pastors that celebrate it as some kind of victory. As Catholics, we would do well to acknowledge the flaw of selling indulgences at the time of the reformation and also acknowledge that at the council of Trent this practice was abandoned.

Of course, so many of our friends and family members who left the Catholic Church to become protestant did *not* do so for theological reasons. Most of them simply left because they found something in a protestant Church that was lacking in the Catholic Church. The reasons were more cultural than anything else.

For example, many Protestant Churches have a particular culture that simply appealed to them more than the Culture in our Catholic parishes. For example, Evangelical Churches often have much better hospitality than the average Catholic Church. Evangelical Churches serve coffee before the service and let you bring it in to the sanctuary, which is frowned upon in our own parishes. Evangelical Churches have a reputation of having more for youth and young adults than the average Catholic parish. Protestant ministers have a reputation to be better preachers than Catholic priests. I could go on and on.

Some of these apply to us in Cowlitz County, but others do not. The point is that we have to acknowledge that our parish culture might not be exactly what the average person (especially young person) will identify with. If we acknowledge that, then maybe there are some ways our parish culture can change. For example, improving our hospitality ministry at any of our parishes would be a simple fix that wouldn't affect the liturgy or theology of the Church.

But there are other things that we can acknowledge are differences that might need to remain countercultural. For example, we should not want a parish culture that conforms to every element of modernity. Churches that work to have a youthful culture and play modern praise music in their churches with a young hip band go out of style as quickly as they come in when a Church up the street has a younger hipper band with even more current music. You can see this in our own counties as the Churches that were popular 20 (or even 10) years ago are no longer popular.

One way we can (and should!) talk with our family and friends who have left Catholicism is to acknowledge that the Church was lacking in a few of these things, but then to challenge them. If it was one of those things about Church culture that can (and perhaps should) change, rather than leave the Church, maybe they were called to start something in their own parish to fill a need. If they went to a new Church because it was, "cool," then maybe they need to hear that Church isn't supposed to be "cool." We don't go to Church for entertainment. We go to Church to learn what God has revealed to us about himself and human life, to thank him for the blessings he's given us, and to pray so that we can live our lives like saints. None of that is easy. It can even be tiring, but I wouldn't have it any other way.

So I readily acknowledge that the culture of our parishes isn't what everyone is looking for. As a priest, I apologize for things that are lacking in our parish culture that we should have and ask you, our parishioners, to help me discover what these are and help me implement them. But I also want to be clear that there are aspects of our parish cultures that are good and need to be maintained to preserve the teachings of Christ and to help us all to live the Gospel vibrantly. Above and beyond trying to be popular, we need to make sure that we are hearing the scriptures and being taught the scriptures in a way that is consistent with our two-thousand-year history, and obeying Jesus' command to offer the Eucharist in memory of his sacrifice for his sins.

## 30 th Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

29 de Octubre del 2017

Mateo 22,35-40

Y uno de ellos le preguntó con ánimo de ponerle a prueba: «Maestro, ¿cuál es el mandamiento mayor de la Ley?» El le dijo: «Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente. Este es el mayor y el primer mandamiento. El segundo es semejante a éste: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. De estos dos mandamientos penden toda la Ley y los Profetas.»"

### Reflexión

El evangelista hoy nos habla de la principal regla del cristiano: «Amar al prójimo y amar a Dios», pero enfrascados como estamos en nuestras propias cosas nos olvidamos de amar.

Para poner en práctica este mandamiento, lo primero que tenemos que hacer es amarnos a nosotros mismos, porque quien no se ama a sí mismo es incapaz de darse a los demás, incapaz de descubrir a Dios en el prójimo, porque tampoco descubre a Dios en su interior.

Decía S. Agustín: «Ama y haz lo que quieras». Amar a Cristo es sencillo, es disfrutar cada día los detalles que la vida nos ofrece, buenos o malos; es enriquecer el amor porque un amor pobre, enclenque, no da fuerzas ni alegrías, amar es despreocuparte de todo y dejar que cada día tenga su afán, amar es aceptar a los demás como son, es poner voluntad en mejorar las relaciones con aquellas personas, amigos, vecinos, compañeros, jefes o familiares con los que no nos entendemos. Amar no es caer en la rutina, ni en el desánimo, amar es compartirse, darse, caminar al lado del anciano, del preso, del enfermo, del matrimonio o pareja con problemas, de los jóvenes; es hacer a Cristo presente donde hay dolor, pero también donde hay alegría. Nos dice el libro de Corintios en su capítulo 13, que el amor no es egoísta, no envidia, no es descortés, sino todo lo contrario: el amor es paciente, fiel, sencillo, soporta y busca el bien.... Cristo nos avisa de la importancia que tiene el amor en la vida personal y comunitaria. Por ello ama, ¡Ama, sin cansarte!

¿Cómo respondo a estos dos mandamientos en mi vida diaria?

¿Soy capaz de dejar a un lado los chismes y la envidia para convertirme en un agente de paz en mi familia, centro de trabajo o parroquia?
