## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

I want to Thank everyone who came to the Reformation Conversation at St. Rose this last Monday. I'm proud how well represented are parishes were at the event. We set up for 140 people, and expectations were shattered. Fifteen minutes before we began we had to start setting out more tables and chairs. A conservative count was 245 people and the parish hall was jam packed. Thank you so much for attending.

We set the stage in the center up like a living room, with a couch and a chair and some other furniture to give it a conversational feel. I went first with the reflections, and shared many of the things I shared in my bulletin columns over the last few weeks. I shared the positive ways Protestant Christians have impacted my faith growing up. I also had some challenging words, and pointed out to many people how our division causes doubt and confusion. I then went a bit theological, sharing that we recognize Protestant baptisms which implies God is encountering people through these other Christians.

Pastor Dave Martin from Emmanuel Lutheran went next. I was surprised by the passion with which he spoke. He clearly got emotional during his talk as he shared how his faith was nourished by many outside of the Lutheran Church. He also humbly shared how some people within his own denomination have perpetuated division, which is a difficult thing to admit. He did seem to dismiss some of the theological differences between us, which I don't necessarily agree with, but that is why we have to have these conversations in the first place.

Pastor Mark Schmutz from Northlake Church also began to tear up a couple times. He humbly apologized to us Catholics about attitudes he has harbored towards Catholics in the past, and he thanked us for having such a strong voice in the pro-life movement. He also acknowledged a "Separatist" disposition which exists within his own denomination where people split off to settle disputes. He also shared a message of hope that there is great unity among the pastors in Cowlitz County, and he shared that several charismatic Catholic women thirty years ago were the first (that he knew of) to pray for this unity.

After our reflections, we had some small group discussions. We asked the Catholics to share a positive experience they have had in a protestant setting, or to tell their table about a protestant who positively impacted their faith. Similarly, we asked the protestants to share a positive experience they had in a Catholic setting, or to tell the group about a Catholic who has inspired them. The discussions were mostly very good and I think people enjoyed meeting new people.

I will be honest that I had a pretty narrow set of hopes for this event. I didn't want it to be too soft on division. As I've said, our divisions are real and we should not turn a blind eye to our divisions or pretend like they are unimportant. The proper response is not to be in denial of division, but to confront division with the Gospel. But I also didn't want this to make division worse and be in denial that there is a greater love and respect among Christians today. Overall, I'm very happy with how it went. I think it turned out as close to my hopes as I could reasonably expect. As I told a reporter covering the event, I'm not sure what the outcome of this event will be but the purpose of hosting this was not to obtain an outcome. The goal of the event was to have the event, and I'm proud of everyone who helped make it happen. Thanks again for your support!

31 th Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario  
5 de Noviembre del 2017  
Mateo 23,1- 12

En aquel tiempo, Jesús habló a la gente y a sus discípulos, diciendo: «En la cátedra de Moisés se han sentado los escribas y los fariseos: haced y cumplid lo que os digan; pero no hagáis lo que ellos hacen, porque ellos no hacen lo que dicen. Ellos ligan fardos pesados e insoportables y se los cargan a la gente en los hombros, pero ellos no están dispuestos a mover un dedo para empujar. Todo lo que hacen es para que los vea la gente: alargan las filacterias y ensanchan las franjas del manto; les gustan los primeros puestos en los banquetes y los asientos de honor en las sinagogas; que les hagan reverencias por la calle y que la gente los llame maestros. Vosotros, en cambio, no os dejéis llamar maestro, porque uno solo es vuestro maestro, y todos vosotros sois hermanos. Y no llaméis padre vuestro a nadie en la tierra, porque uno solo es vuestro Padre, el del cielo. No os dejéis llamar consejeros, porque uno solo es vuestro consejero, Cristo. El primero entre vosotros será vuestro servidor. El que se enaltece será humillado, y el que se humilla será enaltecido.»

**Reflexión:** "Dicen y no hacen".

Jesús se dirige a la multitud y a los discípulos y critica a los escribas y fariseos. El motivo del ataque es la incoherencia entre palabra y práctica. Jesús reconoce la autoridad y el conocimiento de los escribas. "Están sentados en la cátedra de Moisés. Por esto, haced y observad todo lo que os digan. Pero no imitéis su conducta, porque dicen y no hacen!"

El error es la incoherencia: "Dicen y no hacen". Jesús enumera varios puntos que revelan una incoherencia. Algunos escribas y fariseos imponen leyes pesadas a la gente. Conocían bien las leyes, pero no las practican, ni usan su conocimiento para aliviar la carga sobre los hombros de la gente. Hacían todo para ser vistos y elogiados, usaban túnicas especiales para la oración, les gustaba ocupar sitios importantes y ser saludados en la plaza pública. Querían ser llamados ¡"Maestro"! Representaban un tipo de comunidad que mantenía, legitimaba y alimentaba las diferencias de clase y de posición social.

¿Cómo debe ser una comunidad cristiana? Todas las funciones comunitarias deben ser asumidas como un servicio: "El mayor entre vosotros será vuestro servidor!". Pues la comunidad de Jesús debe mantener, legitimar, alimentar no las diferencias, sino la fraternidad: "Ustedes son hermanos y hermanas!". La fraternidad nace de la experiencia de que Dios es Padre, y que hace de todos nosotros hermanos y hermanas. "Pues, el que se ensalce será humillado, y el que se humille será ensalzado!".

¿Cuáles son las motivaciones que tengo para vivir y trabajar en la comunidad?

El mal ha logrado cautivar a la industria del entretenimiento para llevar a cabo su plan, manipular y controlar las mentes de sus hijos, así como de ustedes mismos, dominando su tiempo y su vida.

Hoy lo más importante, es buscar la presencia de nuestro Señor y Salvador Jesucristo a través de la Adoración de la Santa Eucaristía.

La Adoración al Santísimo, es reconocer que Dios Trinidad, Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, es el único Dios, es reconocerle como Ser Supremo, Creador, Salvador y Señor de todo. Este acto es similar a la adoración que hicieron los pastores o los reyes magos al niño Jesús. Es ofrecernos en cuerpo, mente y alma a su voluntad, a su proyecto y Plan de amor para la humanidad. Es un momento de encuentro personal y comunitario, donde nos encontramos frente a Él y en profunda oración agradecemos su bondad, su amor, su infinita misericordia; y le pedimos nos mantenga firmes en este caminar junto a El como familia.
