Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Advent is right around the corner, and Christmas is right after that. This year, there are some anomalies making things a little more difficult, so I wanted to give everyone a big heads up as to what they can expect for this year's festivities.

The biggest challenge to celebrating Christmas this year is that Christmas is on a Monday, meaning Christmas Eve is on Sunday which is also the fourth Sunday of Advent. Yes, it is important that you attend Mass for both occasions. It is important that you go to Mass to celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas. This means some people will be going to Mass twice on Sunday. Our regular Sunday schedule for the fourth Sunday of Advent will be in operation at all our parishes, with the exception of Spanish Mass. Our Spanish speaking parishioners will need to go to one of the English Masses that weekend in order to fulfill their obligation. Every other Mass will happen like normal, however things might be a bit simplified because we are also preparing for Christmas later that day.

Our regular Christmas Masses will go on as usual. There will be a Christmas Eve Mass in Cathlamet at 4pm, a Christmas Eve Mass in Kelso at 5:30pm, a Christmas Eve Mass at St. Rose at 6pm, a Christmas Eve Spanish Mass at St. Rose at 8pm, a Christmas Eve Mass in Castle Rock at 10pm, and a Christmas Eve Mass at St. Rose at 11pm. Christmas day services are yet to be finalized, but I expect that they will happen as they have in years past.

Please do attend both occasions. This schedule means Fr. Titus and I will each be celebrating five Masses on Sunday, and yes it would be wonderful to see our churches full for each Mass. If you do not want to attend two Masses on Sunday, please celebrate the fourth Sunday of Advent with us by coming to our regularly scheduled Saturday evening vigil Mass in Cathlamet or at St. Rose. This is not the only challenge we have had in our parishes with regards to scheduling. We initially scheduled our advent penance service, but we picked a day when not enough priests would be able to help. We tried to reschedule for an evening but were unable to do so. We decided to try something we have never done before, and we have scheduled a penance service during the day on Wednesday, December 13th at 11am until 12:30pm (or whenever the last confession heard).

We aren't sure what to expect with a daytime service, but we are hoping it will allow people to come by during lunch, as well as people who aren't able to attend in the evenings for whatever reason. If this works, we might also offer this in the future so if this is something you want please show up for the sacrament. I would also like for you to prepare for the sacrament by watching a series on formed.org called, "Forgiven." Visit Formed.org and use our parish code, FTFWZ to access the media.

Finally, New Year's day also happens to be the Feast of Mary, Mother of God on our Church calendar. This is usually a Holy Day of Obligation, however this year it is not because the feast falls on a Monday. Fr. Titus and I will each be offering a Mass that day (times and location are yet to be determined), however we will not be following our regular Holy Day schedule. Stay tuned for more information on how to celebrate with us!

If you have any questions about any of this, please ask me after Mass!

32 th Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario
12 de Noviembre del 2017
Mateo 25,1- 13

En aquel tiempo, dijo Jesús a sus discípulos esta parábola: «Se parecerá el reino de los cielos a diez doncellas que tomaron sus lámparas y salieron a esperar al esposo. Cinco de ellas eran necias y cinco eran sensatas. Las necias, al tomar las lámparas, se dejaron el aceite; en cambio, las sensatas se llevaron alcuza de aceite con las lámparas. El esposo tardaba, les entró sueño a todas y se durmieron. A medianoche se oyó una voz: "¡Que llega el esposo, salid a recibirlo!" Entonces se despertaron todas aquellas doncellas y se pusieron a preparar sus lámparas. Y las necias dijeron a las sensatas: "Dadnos un poco de vuestro aceite, que se nos apagan las lámparas." Pero las sensatas contestaron: "Por si acaso no hay bastante para vosotras y nosotras, mejor es que vayáis a la tienda y os lo compréis." Mientras iban a comprarlo, llegó el esposo, y las que estaban preparadas entraron con él al banquete de bodas, y se cerró la puerta. Más tarde llegaron también las otras doncellas, diciendo: "Señor, señor, ábrenos." Pero él respondió: "Os lo aseguro: no os conozco." Por tanto, velad, porque no sabéis el día ni la hora.»

Reflexión: En la parábola de las diez vírgenes, Jesús separó a sus seguidores en dos categorías: los sabios y los necios. En las Escrituras, Los sabios representan a los que orientan sus pasos por los caminos de Dios y están preparados para salir a su encuentro.

En toda parroquia católica siempre hay una luz encendida junto al sagrario, donde se mantiene la presencia sacramental de Cristo todos los días del año. De manera similar, si mantenemos llena de aceite y encendida la lámpara de nuestro corazón, mediante la oración y la meditación de la Palabra de Dios, estaremos preparados para escuchar la voz de Dios y responder adecuadamente.

Finalmente, estemos atentos a lo que pasa por nuestra mente durante el día y arrepintámonos cuando sea necesario; eso nos ayudará a mantenernos en una nueva vida con Jesús: "Viviendo siempre atentos y vigilantes, pongan toda su esperanza en la gracia que les va a traer la manifestación gloriosa de Jesucristo" (1 Pedro 1,13).

"Señor tú eres mi luz y mi salvación. Ilumina mi alma,
mi mente y mi corazón,
para que yo también
sea luz para los que no te conocen".

El Papa Francisco nos dice que:

"Permiso", "gracias", "perdón". Son palabras que abren camino para vivir bien en la familia, para vivir en paz. Son palabras sencillas, pero no tan sencillas de llevar a la práctica. 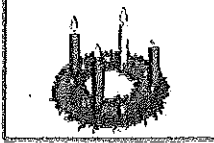

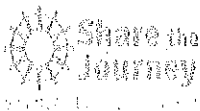
