Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Here are some random things you might be interested in:

Seton Catholic Update: For the last three years, I have had the honor of serving as the official chaplain of Seton Catholic Prep in Vancouver. Recently, the Archbishop appointed Fr. Tom Belleque to take my place. I'm so honored that I was able to serve the students and faculty as the Chaplain for the last three years, but I also welcome this change. I know Fr. Belleque will do a great job. I look forward to continuing to be involved in the school, I just will not be doing so in an official manner.

Financial Reporting: Everyone's favorite page of the bulletin is this page where my column is written. Just kidding. The real favorite page is where financial data is reported. Every once in a while I think it's important to be clear about these numbers and what they mean. The dollar amounts listed are only money we receive from sacrificial giving at mass and electronic sacrificial giving. Other sources of revenue are not included in these numbers. We have budgeted a certain amount to receive from Sunday collections, and the data listed in the bulletin shows if we are above or below that number.

The reason I mention this now is that two of our parishes (Immaculate Heart in Kelso and St. Rose in Longview) recently received a generous donation from a parishioner of \$25,000 each. I am very grateful to this donor who wants to remain anonymous, and I would encourage you to pray for this donor and their family. Stay tuned for more info on how we intend to use some of this money.

Tax Fraud Update: Several years ago, many of our parish employees and volunteers had their identities stolen. I was among them. As you might recall, somebody filed fake tax returns in our name in an attempt to collect our tax refunds. Many people across the Archdiocese of Seattle were affected by this, and we were afraid that our databases were attacked. It turned out that it was not the Church itself that was compromised, but the company we hired to do our background checks.

I'm happy to report that arrests have been made in this crime. According to a report from Oregon Live, "The U.S. Attorney's Office in Oregon said investigators now suspect that a six-person crew based on the East Coast stole the personal information of more than 250,000 people, then used the data to seek \$25 million in tax refunds. Investigators believe the scheme generated \$4.7 million in profits from at least April 2013 to May 2015 -- \$2.7 million more than revealed last May."

From a different article, we read, "Prosecutors say [the defendant] bought over 91,000 of the identities from a Vietnamese hacker who got into a database belonging to an Oregon company called CICS Employment Services. Most of the personal information belonged to people living in Oregon and Washington and were used to file fraudulent tax returns between 2012 and 2015."

If you google these articles, you will note that they are from a few months ago. It was only recently confirmed to us that this was in fact the source of our breach. If you were among those of us that were violated in this crime, I hope this will serve as welcome news. This also serves as a reminder that these crimes are more and more common, and we all need to protect ourselves from identity theft.
