Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Several weeks ago I went to St. James in Vancouver to attend a Tridentine Rite "Latin Mass" for the first time. This was the Mass that many of our older parishioners will remember from before the second Vatican council. I went primarily because it was a requiem Mass, and the particular Mass being sung was from one of my favorite composers, Maurice Durufle. It did not disappoint. The music was fantastic.

There are many strong opinions about the Tridentine Mass. I've always been a little taken aback when people speak strongly against it. Their reaction seems disproportionate and exaggerated to me. This was the central prayer of the Church for several centuries and it sustained the faith of so many believers quite well and nobody should speak poorly of it even if they prefer the Mass we celebrate now. I don't understand the degree of negativity some people display against it. It's weird.

At the same time, there are people on the other end of the spectrum who blame all the world's problems on the fact that we changed the Order of Mass. They believe that if we went back to the Old Mass, everything would suddenly be awesome again just like it was in the 1950's. This is also misguided because, contrary to the opinions of some, the world was still pretty messed up in the 1950's. Problems that we have today are from seeds sewn in the 50's.

So I went to the Mass really kind of neutral. I don't have a nostalgia for the Tridentine Mass, nor do I have any reason to write it off and dismiss it. I didn't attend the Mass believing that the problems in Cowlitz County would disappear if only I learned to offer Mass differently, but I also attended open to some things this liturgy has that aren't as apparent in our current Mass.

I sat in the congregation, rather than at the altar. There are some things I really liked. I liked that the priest faced the same direction as the people during the Eucharistic prayer (His back was to the people). It felt like we were part of the same prayer that was being offered and that he was actually leading us. I felt like I was offering the Mass with him and we were part of the same prayer. I also did appreciate the silence and reverence that was part of the Mass. It felt mystical and transcendent (the stunning music helped with this as well).

On the other hand, I was expecting somewhat of a hospitable greeting from the priest. Don't misunderstand me. I don't want a gameshow host style priest who has taken it upon himself to entertain the people for an hour. All I wanted was something like, "Welcome to Mass, especially those of you who have never been to a Tridentine Mass before. We hope you'll be moved by this prayer as we offer the sacrifice." But no. There isn't space for that in this Mass. This was a conversion for me, and I'm going to try and greet people more warmly when I offer Mass at our parishes. That hasn't been a part of the Mass I valued much until it wasn't there.

I also did get a bit lost during this Mass in a bad way. I thought we were doing one part and it turned out they were in a very different place. I also expected the Eucharistic prayer to be offered audibly. It was completely silent and I'm not sure that was helping me participate in the Mass.

When it comes to liturgy, Pastors are in a precarious situation. Anything we do that is "traditional," people accuse us of wanting to turn the clock back all the way to the 1950's, for better or worse. I have no intention of going back to the old way, however I also think there are some aspects of it that can be restored and make our current liturgy a bit richer. Hopefully we will figure out the proper balance soon.

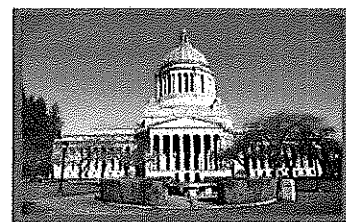

III Domingo de ADVIENTO—Ciclo B

17 de Diciembre del 2017

Juan 1,1-8. 19-28

Surgió un hombre enviado por Dios, que se llamaba Juan: éste venía como testigo, para dar testimonio de la luz, para que por él todos vinieran a la fe. No era él la luz, sino testigo de la luz.

Los judíos enviaron desde Jerusalén sacerdotes y levitas a Juan, a que le preguntaran: ¿Tú quién eres? El confesó sin reservas: Yo no soy el Mesías. Le preguntaron: Entonces ¿qué? ¿Eres tú Elías?

Él dijo: No lo soy. ¿Eres tú el Profeta? Respondió: No. Y le dijeron: ¿Quién eres? Para que podamos dar una respuesta a los que nos han enviado, ¿qué dices de ti mismo? Él contestó: Yo soy «la voz que grita en el desierto: Allana el camino del Señor» (como dijo el Profeta Isafas).

Entre los enviados había fariseos y le preguntaron: Entonces, ¿por qué bautizas, si tú no eres el Mesías, ni Elías, ni el Profeta? Juan les respondió: Yo bautizo con agua; en medio de vosotros hay uno que no conocéis, el que viene detrás de mí, que existía antes que yo y al que no soy digno de desatar la correa de la sandalia.

Esto pasaba en Betania, en la otra orilla del Jordán, donde estaba Juan bautizando.

COMENTARIO. Juan el Bautista estaba sacudiendo a la nación. Grandes multitudes salían de las ciudades e iban a escucharle al desierto. Allí confesaban sus pecados y se bautizaban en las aguas del río Jordán.

Tal fue el impacto de su ministerio, que no es de extrañar que los líderes judíos estuvieran sorprendidos, y hasta asustados, por las repercusiones que su ministerio pudiera tener. Así que enviaron una delegación para averiguar quién era Juan y cuáles eran sus pretensiones. Había algo que les preocupaba especialmente, y eran los comentarios que empezaban a circular por todas partes sobre la posibilidad de que Juan el Bautista fuera el Mesías esperado.

Juan logró convertir una investigación acerca de su propia persona en una oportunidad para dar testimonio acerca del Señor Jesucristo. Juan era una voz que clamaba. Con esto queda también clara la diferencia que había entre él y el Mesías. Mientras que él sólo era una "voz", el Mesías es descrito como el "Verbo" o la "Palabra".

Esta humildad que manifestaba Juan es tan rara como encantadora. ¿Por qué razón Juan llegó a esta bendita condición? Primeramente, porque como él mismo dijo, el hombre no puede recibir nada si no le fuere dado del cielo (Jn 3:27). Por esta razón, todo lo que tenía debía ser usado fielmente para dar gloria a aquel de quien lo había recibido. Y en segundo lugar, porque había visto la gloria del Señor (Jn 1:33-34).
