Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

As I announced at Mass a few weeks ago, after the shooting at a Church in Texas this last November I received quite a few emails from parishioners wondering if we were prepared for a violent incident in our local Churches. In response to this, I asked a parishioner to help us receive some training in this area. Last Friday, a couple of Longview police officers provided us with some of this training and I'd like to share some reactions that I had.

First, there are not any systems you can put in place to absolutely prevent this type of thing. That being said, there are lots of things we can do to reduce the damage done by a violent intruder. The best thing, however, is that the people know how to respond to a violent situation. This training was helpful in that it taught many of our parishioners how to respond to these horrific acts of violence.

If you are ever in a situation where a violent intruder has entered, the first option you have is to run. Get out of the area as quickly as you can and call 911. Call 911 before you call anyone else. The quicker we can alert the police to a situation like the better, but more on that later. A parishioner also shared a tip, which is that if your phone is turned off it can take a very long time to turn on. The best thing to do is keep your phone on at all times, on silent or vibrate mode. If you are able to leave the premises, be sure to alert other people that there is a danger and prevent them from entering the area.

(Slightly off topic but applicable message about phones: Do you ever notice how few phones that go off in awkward moments belong to people under the age of 45? The reason is that people under the age of 45 tend to keep their phone on vibrate all the time. This is a lesson for everyone. As a matter of etiquette, your phone should be on you and on vibrate mode. It is more polite and will save you the embarrassment of having it go off at a bad time.)

If you can't exit the premises when a violent attack occurs, try your best to take cover and hide. This includes barricading entrances to doorways and windows, which might be difficult in a wide open space like a Church. Even if the barricade will not absolutely keep a violent intruder out, it can at least slow them down, which is important and can save lives. Even if your cover is minimal and incapable of protecting you completely from a weapon, it might cause the violent person to think twice before attacking.

One scary detail that the officer mentioned is that it will take police 5 to 6 minutes' minimum to respond to a 911 call. That is a long time if somebody is doing violence. Sadly, this means that sometimes we will have to try to fight back against an intruder. Before I go into that, I want to address an objection one might bring up against fighting off an attacker at Church, which is that Jesus teaches us to respond to violence by turning the other cheek.

Without going into too much detail, I'll say that the pacifist option is heroic and acceptable if violence is being done against you and you are the only victim. If I were ever being attacked, I hope I would be courageous enough to take this option. However, when these events happen it is rarely just you and an attacker. There are innocent third parties, and when we fight, we do so to protect these other people rather than to harm the attacker. Thus, fighting is an important step.

If you can't run and you can't hide, fight back. Cause chaos. Throw things at the attacker, and if somebody gets close enough to engage him get there as quick as you can to help. Pile on the attacker. Hold down their head and their arms and their legs. Pile on the intruder and make sure he or she cannot move until police arrive. If he has a weapon, secure it, but do not hold it. You do not want the police to mistake you for the attacker. I think it is helpful to visualize yourself taking these options. I pray that none of this will ever matter in our parishes, but if it does, I hope that these few words will help you to respond properly.

III Domingo de Cuaresma—Ciclo B

4 de Marzo del 2018

Juan 2,13-25

Cuando se acercaba la Pascua de los judíos, Jesús llegó a Jerusalén y encontró en el templo a los vendedores de bueyes, ovejas y palomas, y a los cambistas con sus mesas.

Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palomas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un Mercado la casa de mi Padre".

En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: "*El celo de tu casa me devora*".

Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así? Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días?".

Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso, cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho.

Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de la Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía a todos y no necesitaba que nadie le descubriera lo que es el hombre, porque él sabía lo que hay en el hombre.

Meditación

Cuando Jesús purificó el templo de Jerusalén, él se estaba presentando como el Nuevo "templo" que reemplazaba al antiguo y al mismo tiempo demostraba el celo consumidor que él sentía por la casa de su Padre, porque sabía que el templo debía de ser el lugar más sagrado, no un lugar de comercio y codicia ni de bullicio irreverente.

Más tarde, los romanos destruyeron el templo de Jerusalén en el año 70 d.c. y eso fue una tragedia espantosa para Israel. Los cristianos, en cambio, se consolaban sabiendo que el verdadero templo, el centro de la presencia de Dios, era en realidad el cuerpo de Jesucristo resucitado y glorificado, porque en Jesús, Dios estaba presente en su pueblo y ya no había necesidad de constantes sacrificios de animales, pues el sacrificio de Jesús había sido la oblación final y definitiva en reparación por los pecados de la humanidad.

En efecto, Cristo Jesús es la Nueva Alianza que Dios establece con su pueblo.

Ahora nosotros ¿podemos apreciar que todo el plan de Dios gira en torno a la persona de Cristo?

Ojalá aceptemos esta nueva obra de Dios, que es el único camino, la única verdad, la única vida: nuestro Señor Jesucristo, el Nuevo templo de Dios.
