Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend we heard another important Old Testament story and considered how it shapes our understanding of the New Testament as well as how we live out our faith in current times. Specifically, we heard from the end of the Second book of Chronicles. In that section, we heard that God's chosen people had turned away from God. Their lives were no different than the pagans. They ignored and mocked the prophets. If you read the book of Jeremiah, you will see the messages they ignored and scoffed at.

In that reading from Chronicles, we also heard about an important event called the Babylonian Captivity. After the Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem, including the temple, many of the most skilled members of Judean society were taken into exile to serve a foreign nation. Their artists, their carpenters, their religious leaders were all forced to leave the city and live under foreign laws which were sometimes in conflict with their religious faith.

This is the key point that sheds light on our current situation as Catholics living in the United States of America. At our baptism, we were brought into the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God is our home. In this kingdom, Jesus himself is our king and his laws are supposed to shape our lives. The experience of a disciple of Jesus in our age – and really in many ages throughout history – is like an exile. Just like the Judeans we heard about in the Second Book of Chronicles, many people in the Kingdom of God have chosen to behave like the non-believers among us. When a Church leader or holy lay person speaks about some issue of faith or morality rooted in our faith tradition, they are often scorned and ridiculed. And so, we have unsurprisingly seen the Kingdom of God decline over time.

Now, many Catholics are quite literally living in Exile. We are forced to live in a different kingdom with different laws that sometimes conflict with the laws of our spiritual homeland. I'm not just speaking of laws that our governments make. I'm also speaking of expectations and ways of thinking that have arisen through our culture. There is pressure to think things and do things that are far beneath the ways we should think and live in our native kingdom.

There are some lessons here for how we should live our faith today. First, we need to accept that we are in exile. Some Catholics are still clinging to a belief that the Church is what it was in the 1950s. They get angry at Church leaders for not speaking up about "X" while ignoring the fact that nobody really cares what our Church leaders have to say. We can't rely on our Church leaders to shape our culture through the political sphere. We need to shape it ourselves at local levels by joyfully living Jesus' teachings.

Accepting we are in exile should change the way that we interact with other Catholics. The pressure put on the Judeans was significant and many of the exiles abandoned their faith because of this pressure. That was not because they were horrible people. It was because it was really, really difficult to remain faithful as an exile. Yes, a lot of Catholics are abandoning basic teachings, and we sometimes view them as bad people. They aren't bad. They are just struggling against very strong social currents.

This is not to excuse infidelity. We absolutely need to remain faithful to the entire deposit of faith, and God will ultimately judge whether or not we were faithful in this life. I write to say that part of our attempts to regain our fellow Catholics who are losing their faith must be accompanied with an acknowledgement that remaining faithful is not easy. Catholics you might consider "unfaithful" can't be approached as enemies, but as victims of a very difficult period of exile. The reading from Second Chronicles ended with good news. The exile ended and many of the people returned to Jerusalem to rebuild their kingdom, including some of the people who seemed unfaithful during the exile. This period of exile will end as well and people will return to the Kingdom of God. If we are faithful to Jesus' teachings, we will be able to bring more people back when this period of exile ends.

Juan 12,20-33

Entre los que habían llegado a Jerusalén para adorar a Dios en la fiesta de Pascua, había algunos griegos, los cuales se acercaron a Felipe, el de Betsaida de Galilea, y le pidieron: "Señor, quisiéramos ver a Jesús".
