## Sacrament Information

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be 16 years of age to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in November and the celebration is prior to Lent.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Holy week is upon us, and I would like to take a moment to encourage you to participate fully in the holiest days of the Church year. I know that these liturgies are a little long, but they are quite profound and they certainly help shape and strengthen our faith. In case you haven't been in a while or have never been, I'd like to briefly share the highlights of these important liturgies.

**Holy Thursday:** On Holy Thursday we commemorate the Last Supper and the institution of the priesthood as well as the sacrament of the Eucharist. The Gospel proclaimed at this Mass is from John's Gospel and tells the story of how Jesus washes the feet of the disciples. This reminds all the baptized that we are to serve the least among us, and this message is especially important for priests.

The highlight of this Mass is when the priest washes the feet of twelve parishioners. I must say that as a priest I have found that washing the feet of our parishioners is one of the most meaningful moments of the year. It is humbling to do this gesture while everyone watches. I think to myself, "Have I been doing this well enough throughout the year? Have I been living up to this call?"

Perhaps my favorite part of the Holy Thursday Mass, however, is the procession with the Eucharist to the altar of repose. Deliberately set up like a garden, reminiscent of the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus was in agony, we pray in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament like the apostles who went to pray with Jesus before he was arrested.

**Good Friday:** On Good Friday, the Church is stripped to its bare bones. It is empty and desolate, like a tomb. On Good Friday we call to mind Jesus' death on the cross. This is actually a very simple liturgy. The highlight of this service is when we venerate the cross. This is also a humbling experience for me. It is very moving for me personally to see people embrace their cross, especially those who have shared with me their own crosses.

**Holy Saturday, the Easter Vigil:** The Easter vigil is the longest Mass of the year, but it is certainly the richest and most important. As has been the case at our parishes for the last couple of years, we will have one Easter Vigil at St. Rose and it will start at 8:30pm. I do want to encourage you to attend.

The Easter Vigil begins outside the Church and in darkness by a fire. We then bless and light the Easter Candle from the fire and light charcoal which we use to burn the incense. This is directly reminiscent of the Israelites lost in the desert after they were freed from slavery. The Israelites were led by a cloud (symbolized by the incense) and a pillar of fire (symbolized by the candle) and they walked through the desert to their promised land (symbolized by the Church building).

We walk into the dark Church with the candle, and slowly the lights come on. The Candle also symbolizes Jesus, the light of the world, so when the candle is placed, all the lights in the Church go on. Jesus overcomes the darkness. We then hear several readings and psalms, which cover some of the most important stories of the Old Testament.

The reason this is the most important Mass is because we initiate new Catholics. The baptized are literally given new life through the sacrament. What was dead to sin is reanimated and brought to life. This year we are initiating nine children. Let's pack the Church so they know how important this is and can feel our love and support. So much more could be said of these liturgies, but the best way to learn about them is to be present. I hope to see you at our parishes to celebrate these Holy events.

**Domingo de Ramos**  
**25 de Marzo del 2018**

**Segunda Lectura: San Pablo a los Filipenses 2,6-11**

Cristo Jesús, siendo Dios, no consideró que debía aferrarse a las prerrogativas de su condición divina, sino que, por el contrario, se anonadó a sí mismo tomando la condición de siervo, y se hizo semejante a los hombres.

Así, hecho uno de ellos, se humilló a sí mismo y por obediencia aceptó incluso la muerte, y una muerte de cruz.

Por eso Dios lo exaltó sobre todas las cosas y le otorgó el nombre que está sobre todo nombre, para que, al nombre de Jesús, todos doblen la rodilla en el cielo, en la tierra y en los abismos, y todos reconozcan públicamente que Jesucristo es el Señor, para Gloria de Dios Padre.

**Meditación**

La liturgia de la palabra del Domingo de Ramos toma un pasaje de la carta a los Filipenses en el que san Pablo recoge un himno que se cantaba en las asambleas litúrgicas de la comunidad. Poco antes, a los miembros de esa comunidad, entre los que habían surgido algunos conflictos de entendimiento y de concordia, les ha hablado de lo necesaria que es la humildad: que se asistan mutuamente y encuentren en el amor.

Continúa su exhortación invitándoles a que todos tengan los mismos sentimientos que tuvo Cristo Jesús. Y pasa a explicitar en qué consiste esta última invitación suya. No se trata sólo de adquirir los "sentimientos" de Cristo desde el exterior. Se trata de compartir con Él su mismo estilo de vida.

En efecto, desde el momento en que abrazaron la fe y fueron bautizados, entraron en un nuevo círculo de relaciones con Cristo y, por tanto, con Dios.

Por libre decisión, el Hijo de Dios se despojó a sí mismo. En lugar de la condición divina aparece en la condición de esclavo. El himno busca reconocer, con solemne alabanza, aquel acontecer único de que Dios se hizo hombre. Afirma que se hizo verdadero hombre, y no mera apariencia humana. Se insertó dentro del grupo de los hombres, tomó su forma, su forma esencial, ofreciendo pruebas irrefutables de su condición humana.

Del despojarse a sí mismo sigue para Cristo Jesús la humillación de sí mismo, una humillación que la lleva hasta el extremo en la sumisión obediente hasta la muerte. Para Él, y sólo para Él, es también la muerte un acto libre. Pero, por otra parte, es esta muerte la que demuestra que Él se ha hecho realmente uno de los nuestros, pues ella es el destino común de todo ser humano. menciona que se trata de una muerte de cruz, la cual se transformará en fuente de salvación para todos.
